Commander R. Stacy Henderson is a native of Dayton, Ohio. She is a graduate of Southern University with a B.S. in Business Management and a minor in Computer Science.

Upon receiving her Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) commission, Commander Henderson received orders to the Defense Communications and Engineering Center in Reston, Virginia as an Operations Research Analyst for network design. In June 1988, she reported for duty to the Bureau of Naval Personnel as the Training Officer for Officer and Enlisted Detailers as well as the Program Manager of Submarine Enlisted Incentive Programs.

After serving in leadership positions at Navy Headquarters, Commander Henderson rotated to the West Coast to serve in dual roles as Department Head, Messing and Berthing Officer and Automated Information System Officer at the Naval Submarine Base in PT Loma, California. As a Human Resources officer, she led her staff of more than 100 Sailors to the prestigious Edward F. Ney Award for outstanding customer service in the base Galley. She also created and implemented a base wide computer training program for all Sailors assigned to the base.

In March 1995, she reported for duty at the Personnel Support Detachment in San Jose, California as the Officer In Charge of PSD Santa Clara. Commander Henderson led her team of four unique departments through several outstanding inspections by evidenced of outstanding customer service to military personnel in both Active and Reserve Components, and more than 24,000 retirees.

Commander Henderson recent assignment includes supporting the war fighter at U.S. European Command, as the Chief, NATO Assignment (Navy and Marine Corps) and Deputy, Quality of Life Branch in the Readiness Division for J1. Following this tour, she was selected to be the Executive Assistant at the White House Commission on Remembrance in support of honoring American military members and fallen military personnel at the Washington Capitol, Vietnam Memorial and various Embassies.

In June 2010, she reported to the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Manpower, Personnel, Training and Education (N1). In the Information, Analysis, and Development Division (N15), she served as the Deputy, Project Leader and Information Technology/ Information Management (IT/IM) Requirements Officer for the MPTE Enterprise.

Commander Henderson reported in March 2013 as the Officer in Charge at the US National Support Element in Larissa, Greece.
