## Local meetings of AA can help alcoholics recover

For people battling alcoholism, being stationed overseas doesn't mean being cut off from resources.

Those in the Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples community who are struggling with alcohol abuse or excessive drinking can turn to Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), just as they can when living in the United States. An English-speaking AA group meets three times a week in different locations throughout the Naples area. There's a weekly meeting at 9 a.m. Sundays at the Support Site, a Saturday afternoon meeting in the Chiaia district of downtown Naples and a Wednesday evening meeting at a church in the Lago Patria area.

Ship Serviceman 1st Class Tony Lewis, who is a senior counselor with the Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program (SARP) at NSA Naples, said that SARP counselors encourage people to attend AA meetings if they have recurring problems with alcohol abuse.

"It provides them with a support network," Lewis said. "Instead of them struggling on their own, they can relate to other individuals who are part of the group and who have similar stories."

The only requirement for membership in AA is a desire to stop drinking, according to the organization's website, www.aa.org. At AA meetings, people can anonymously share their stories about their struggle with alcohol. AA doesn't require people to provide their personal information to participate in meetings, and restricts members' identities out of respect for their privacy. This policy is in place to encourage more alcoholics to come to AA for help, the AA website says.

Besides the discussion part of the group, the meetings also incorporate AA's 12 Steps and include lessons from the Big Book, the basic text for AA.

## Napoli Nation Fan Club brings Naples soccer to Americans

Have you ever wondered how to get tickets to watch Napoli's professional soccer team, SSC Napoli? A new group called the Napoli Nation Fan Club may be your answer.

The Napoli Nation Fan Club was started by Chief Petty Officer Dan Bowen a few months ago to generate interest in the Naples soccer team and provide information to the American community.

Chief Bowen has been in Naples almost 15 years and was not a soccer fan when he first arrived. But that all changed after he saw firsthand how Naples citizens feel about their soccer team.

"I used to hate soccer and then I went to an exhibition game with (former Napoli player Diego) Maradona, and had a great time," Bowen said, "But it was not until I attended a regular season game that I became hooked."

Bowen has purchased season tickets to SSC Napoli games for the past four years, he said.

"Any American who says they hate it will more than likely change their mind after attending," Bowen said. "The atmosphere is incredible and you cannot help but enjoy yourself."

It was the atmosphere and the passion that attracted Chief Bowen and for those reasons he created the Napoli Nation Fan Club. The fan club creates a chance for Americans who are Napoli fans — or soon-to-be Napoli fans — to chat about games, to ask for help in buying tickets and to share information regarding the team, as well as what is going on in the Serie A league.

Recently the fan club members went on their first major outing together. About 50 people got together for the Napoli versus Chelsea Champions League game Feb. 21 at San Paolo Stadium.

## Anti-terrorism exercise March 19-21

The annual Reliant Defense anti-terrorism exercise is scheduled for March 19 to 21. Reliant Defense will have major impacts on the Naples community, including increased force protection conditions at all Naples installations. Expect changes in traffic patterns and delays at the base entrances. One-hundred percent ID checks will be in effect and random vehicle and pedestrian inspections will be conducted at designated locations. The majority of the disruptions will occur during the middle of the workday March 20. Note that the Support Site main gate is also scheduled to close from 9 p.m. March 20 to 3 a.m. March 21. Expect traffic to be routed to the back gate. **Florence's Palazzo Vecchio yields clue to lost Leonardo mural**

Art researchers at the Palazzo Vecchio in Florence found traces of paint that match the ones used in Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa. They claimed that the paint samples, which were taken from a wall behind Giorgio Vasari's fresco "The Battle of Marciano," may have the same chemical makeup as pigment used by Leonardo in his lost fresco of "The Battle of Anghiari." The lost Leonardo fresco was commissioned in 1503 to represent a battle between Milan and a coalition of Italian city states led by Florence. The Leonardo work probably fell out of favor, since it disappeared 60 years later when Vasari was commissioned to enlarge and paint six new murals at the Palazzo Vecchio. There has been speculation for centuries that Vasari may have preserved the Leonardo work by building a false wall on which he painted "The Battle of Marciano." Indeed, researchers found the existence of a gap between the walls on which Vasari painted his fresco. Prof. Maurizio Seracini, an engineer from the University of California in San Diego, has spent the last 35 years trying to prove that the Palazzo Vecchio conceals one of the great undiscovered treasures of the Renaissance. He said a possible clue to the existence of the lost Leonardo painting is a cryptic message that Vasari painted on his mural, which bears the words "Cerca Trova," or "Seek and you shall find." National Geographic is sponsoring the project and is documenting the findings.

**Lights go out in Monreale when local officials don't pay electric bill**

In the Sicilian tourist town of Monreale, which is famous for its Norman cathedral, street lights were turned off Tuesday after local authorities failed to pay a €1 million bill for power. Residents were forced to use flashlights in the evenings, while a local transport company requested the seizure of property worth € 600,000 (\$786,000) belonging to the Monreale town hall to honor another debt. Residents and shopkeepers in cities throughout Italy are paying the consequences of reduced public services resulting from widespread budg-

et cuts. Local governments may be forced to implement more cuts as Italian Prime Minister Mario Monti tries to rein in the public finances.

**Fuel prices reach all-time high in Italy**

Italian consumers are now paying more for a liter of fuel than they are for a kilogram of oranges or pasta as fuel prices hit an all-time high.

In one year, there has been a 19 percent hike in fuel prices, with households now spending more on fuel for transport, home utilities and electricity than they are for food. In Italy 88 percent of commercial transport is by road, so the economy is particularly sensitive to fuel costs. Italy is moving toward having a tax burden of 45 percent, one of the highest levels in the world. The head of the Court of Auditors said Tuesday that the high tax rate will penalize economic growth and weigh excessively on citizens and enterprises that regularly pay their taxes. The high tax rate is in part responsible for widespread tax evasion in Italy, which the Italian government is now trying to combat by introducing new systems to improve tax compliance.

**Officials in San Cipriano di Aversa charged with racketeering**

The mayor of San Cipriano di Aversa in the Caserta province was arrested and charged with racketeering during a criminal probe into the Casalesi clan. A town councilor was also arrested and charged. They are accused of helping the clan while they were in office. Another mayor from Villa Literno has been put in jail with the same charges.

**Town passes decree prohibiting death**

In the small town of Falciano del Massico, located about 35 kilometers northwest of Caserta, it has become illegal to die. The mayor issued a decree because the town has no cemetery and has been using the cemetery of a nearby town, creating a logistical problem. The ordinance was accepted by the 3,700 inhabitants, bringing happiness, the mayor stated in a local newspaper. But unfortunately, two elderly people disobeyed.

# NSA Naples trains volunteer firefighters

The Auxiliary Firefighting Force (AFFF) program is now in its second iteration at Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples.

The program provides AFFF volunteers with classes and exercises every Saturday at the NSA Naples Support Site fire station.

NSA Fire Chief Roland Hesmondhalgh started the AFFF team to augment the base firefighting force in case of a large-scale emergency, or for situations where the Vigili del Fuoco, the Italian firefighting agency, would not be able to respond quickly.

"If we had a large-scale event that affected the whole Campania region, the Vigili del Fuoco would be busy," said Hesmondhalgh. "There are 11 fire stations and four million people they have to look out for. The AFFF team gives me the flexibility of having additionally trained personnel on station at the Support Site and Capodichino."

Any U.S. service member can try out for the AFFF team, regardless of rank or rate.

"We have everyone from E-2s to O-6s on the AFFF team. It's not just for enlisted personnel," said Hesmondhalgh. "We have damage controlmen, (hospital) corpsmen, hull technicians, Masters-at-Arms and even a guy from the Navy Band."

One such volunteer is Capt. Rod DeWalt, a member of the new AFFF class.

"The Navy takes firefighting very seriously. They do it on ships and on the shore, and a lot of the time

it becomes an all-hands effort," said DeWalt. "In this case, they need a little more training before they go into a firefight, and that's what the AFFF program provides."

Hesmondhalgh said that the only requirements for a person to become a firefighter is that he or she is a strong leader, is able to take charge if the situation calls for it, and not cave in under pressure.

"If you've got someone that always follows, that person won't be effective," said Hesmondhalgh. "A fire is a living, breathing entity. You have to be aggressive. You don't just fight fires, you kill them."

# Navy to begin testing for synthetic chemical compounds like Spice

The Navy announced March 12 that it will begin random testing of urine samples this month for synthetic chemical compounds like Spice.

Commanders may take appropriate actions related to health, safety and security based on a positive result. Every positive sample will be sent to the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) for further investigation, with a view toward potential disciplinary or adverse administrative action by the service member's command.

"There is zero tolerance for the use of drugs — synthetic or otherwise — in our Navy," said Vice Adm. Scott R. Van Buskirk, chief of naval personnel. "Synthetic chemical compound drug use impacts a sailor's career, their family life and overall well-being while also impacting fleet readiness. If a sailor makes a poor choice and uses these types of drugs, they need to know that there will be consequences."

The initial testing will be conducted by a contracted laboratory, and the Navy Drug Screening Laboratory will become capable of conducting in-house testing later this year.

The Navy has been testing urine samples seized from suspects during criminal investigations for nearly a year. Navy and Marine Corps command-

ers can have urine samples tested for several of the compounds found in Spice-like products at the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System (AFMES) when the sample has been collected in conjunction with an ongoing investigation.

The capacity for testing for designer drugs will continue to expand. During fiscal year 2012 the Navy will invest \$1.73 million to test for synthetic chemical compounds and expects to increase that amount to \$2.9 million in fiscal year 2013.

The Navy continues to educate sailors on the dangers of drug use to include new and designer drugs through targeted awareness campaigns, while working closely with local governments to identify users and distributors.

This program is a key element of the 21st Century Sailor and Marine initiative which consolidates a set of objectives and policies, new and existing, to maximize sailor and Marine personal readiness, build resiliency and hone the most combat-effective force in the history of the Department of the Navy.

# Naples students embrace technology in classrooms

Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS) around the globe have begun integrating the world of technology into classroom instruction, and students attending Naples High School (NHS) are experiencing the results of this effort firsthand.

Where students of previous generations once used blackboards and whiteboards to solve math problems and science calculations, today's DoDDS schools are equipped with "Smartboard" technology in every classroom — which, along with computerized labs, enable a virtual interactive experience that was previously regarded as just a product of one's imagination.

"The great thing about the age we live in today is that the students can contribute to the educational curriculums more than ever, and from a technological standpoint, even help the teachers learn about new technologies in the classroom," said Kristi Dix, an NHS science teacher.

Dix has been working within DoDDS for 11 years, and said the advances in educational and classroom technology during the past 15 years have been nothing short of staggering.

"Technology in the 2000s has made it so that schools around the world have had to reshape their curriculums to embrace the advances that the digital age has provided," said Dix. "It's a completely different classroom experience today than it was back when we were just learning how to use floppy discs and programs like Adobe Photoshop. Technology has centralized how an individual student can learn, and with teachers making a concerted effort to learn these new technologies, the educational opportunities today are virtually endless."

With the explosion in recent years of internet social media sites like Facebook and the social learning network Edmodo, students can now interact with other students across the world and even take their classroom lessons and homework on the road. Next school year, DoDDS plans to introduce Apple iPad and eBook technologies in classrooms as well.

"In today's classroom, technology runs the gamut," said Ron Mills, an NHS computer science teacher. "NHS is the most technologically-based school I've yet to see, and with everything that is available in the digital realm, it challenges me to push the envelope in my curriculums. The students I teach are continuously surprising me with what they know, and it

makes for a wonderful educational experience for everyone involved."

Even with the endless opportunities that new technology affords DoDDS curriculums, both Dix and Mills agree that the success of an educational plan is still firmly rooted in the most traditional asset available to the student: the teacher providing the lesson.

"Now, more than ever, it comes down to how the teacher uses the technology available to them," said Mills. "When the teacher presents the student with a lesson plan that is dynamic and uses technology to its educational potential, it will hold the interest of the student and engage them in the classroom experience."

As always, the most important thing is having teachers who know the content and curriculum they're teaching, Dix said.

"Nothing has changed there," Dix said. "Technology has just afforded the teachers new and interesting ways to share their experiences with the students."

Newcomers can ask someone who is further along in the recovery process to be their sponsor, a primary contact person they can go to with questions, doubts and concerns.

Michael N, a group service representative for the Naples AA group, said there are distinct benefits to a program in which alcoholics help other alcoholics. (Panorama is not printing Michael's last name out of respect for AA's anonymity policy.)

"The two things that bind us together are one, we know what the problem is, and two, we know what the solution is," Michael said. "We only get that in a meeting and in the Big Book."

Michael said that part of the value of AA is that it guides people to find their own answers, rather than simply telling them they have a problem.

"I will never tell someone they're an alcoholic," Michael said. "I can only say that I am."

Mark Johnson, a clinical counselor with the Naples Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC), said AA can help provide recovering alcoholics with a sense of accountability, especially through its sponsorship program.

"You're accountable to another human being," said Johnson, who is a licensed chemical dependency counselor. "If your goal is to not drink, there's someone you can check in with every day."

The program is also attractive to many people because it doesn't adhere to any one religious faith; rather, the meetings have a "generic spirituality," Johnson said.

"That appeals to a lot of people who may not be churchgoers with specific religious beliefs, but who may find solace in coming to meetings and sharing," Johnson said.

Michael said that one of biggest things he learned from AA was that there are other ways to cope with life's problems besides drinking.

"This program shows me to not go to a bottle, but to go somewhere else," Michael said. "I have different resources than I did before."

## Individual Force Protection Plans

All Department of Defense personnel and their adult family members on official or unofficial travel outside of Italy must complete an Individual Force Protection Plan (IFPP). IFPPs are mandatory if one of the following criteria is met:

- If the destination country or region has a State Department Public Announcement or Travel Warning in effect.
- A U.S. Mission (Embassy/Consulate) is not present and the State Department or responsible Chief of Mission cannot extend normal consular protection services to U.S. Citizens.
- Travel includes any of the following countries: Russia, Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia, Belarus, Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Turkey, Israel, Lebanon, Albania, Kosovo, Serbia, and all Africa Nations.
- Travel is out of Area of Responsibility (AOR) as required by AOR Commander. (CONUS, Alaska, Hawaii, and U.S. Territories are exempt).

# Turin, Italy makes for a sweet stop

Visitors to Turin, Italy this past week were able to enjoy the city's sweetest attraction: chocolate. The city's annual chocolate festival — dubbed “CioccolaTo,” a combination of the Italian word for chocolate and the city's Italian name, Torino — is a ten-day extravaganza featuring all of the prominent names in the Italian chocolate industry. All of the booths are happy to share samples of their products, and are proud to explain what makes their chocolate so delicious. The variety extends beyond your typical chocolate bar or cup of hot chocolate to chocolate pizzas, nutella crepes, and chocolate kebabs. For those seeking novelties, there is a special section dedicated to items such as chocolate USB drives, chocolate batteries, and chocolate laptops.

The city of Turin is rightfully proud of its contribution to the history of chocolate. Although the Spanish brought chocolate back to Europe from the Americas in the sixteenth century, the Italians transformed the delicacy into what we think of today. Originally, chocolate was only consumed as a beverage, and was considered a delicacy. Princess Catherine of Spain brought some chocolate with her when she wed the Duke of Savoy. According to legend, a busy pastry chef left a chocolate mixture unattended only to discover that it could harden into solid form. The most famous products from Turin are gianduja and *gianduiotto*, a bite size triangle of blended chocolate and hazelnut. Similarly, the ancestor of today's nutella was created in the area during the 1940's when the supply of chocolate was limited due to World War II.

The rest of Turin's history is as rich as its

chocolate. A military encampment during Roman times, it became the capital city of the Duchy of Savoy in the sixteenth century. This royal legacy is evident throughout the facades of the city, particularly in the sixteen kilometers of arched walkways, constructed so that the nobility would never be exposed to the elements when traversing the city.

The Royal Palace presides over one of the main squares of Turin, and conjoins with the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist, where the Chapel of the Holy Shroud shelters one of Turin's most famous and controversial attractions, the Shroud of Turin.

Acquired by the Savoy family in 1453, the Shroud is a 14.3- by 3.7-foot cloth with brown stains in the shape of a man who suffered injuries consistent with those associated with Jesus Christ's crucifixion. The Shroud itself has only been displayed to the public on eighteen occasions, most recently in 2010, and only a photograph is able to be viewed by the public.

Other interesting sites include the Mole Antonelliana, the symbol of Turin that is featured on the two cent Euro coin. The Mole Antonelliana now houses the National Museum of Cinema, as well as the Egyptian Museum, the second largest collection of ancient Egyptian artifacts in the world. In the Lingotto area, an Old Fiat factory has been converted into public space with hotels and shopping, while the old Carpano Vermouth factory has been transformed into Eataly, the home of the slow food movement in Italy, complete with eight different restaurants.

With all these things to see, any visit to Turin — and especially to its annual chocolate festival — is sure to be a sweet one.
