It is everyone's responsibility at Naval Station Newport to recycle and help lower our solid waste costs. It is not only the right thing to do but it is the law in the State of Rhode Island. The Installation Integrated Solid Waste/ Recycling Manager, Scott Mello, will help you with any of your recycling questions or needs. Naval Station Newport will be improving recycling efforts by providing single stream recycling. Single stream recycling is the most convenient recycling method available today. Everything that is recyclable goes into the same container. As part of the program, desk side containers are provided to your command. It is the recycling programs goal to make sure every person here at Naval Station Newport has a single stream desk side container. The contents from the single stream container will be emptied into the single stream dumpsters outside your command. In this brochure, will explain what can be recycled and how. If your command needs any small desk side totes or bins please call the Integrated Solid Waste/Recycling Operations Manager. This is a great opportunity for everyone to make a concerted effort to recycle and help lower our solid waste costs.

OFFICE PAPER:

Copier paper, writing paper, memos, index cards, glossy computer printouts, bond copier paper, manuals without glue or plastic binder, notebook paper, manuals (remove plastic binder), correspondence, fax paper, brochures, post-it notes, manila file folders, envelopes (remove cellophane), newspapers, phonebooks. No carbon paper, please.

CARDBOARD:

All cardboard must be placed in the single stream dumpsters outside your command or brought to the compactor across from building 47 Coddington Cove. If you are moving offices or cleaning out files, please call to arrange a special pick-up.

SCRAP METAL:

Scrap metals may be disposed for recycling through the Qualified Recycling Program which is located across from building 1166 Coddington Cove. All metals are accepted.

WOOD WASTE:

There are two forty-yard containers for your wood waste located in the scrap yard across from building 1166 Coddington Cove. All wood products are accepted.

- Pots & Pans

GLASS

- All glass Bottles & Jars (all colors)

DON'T RECYCLE

Batteries, alkaline (*bring to environmental department*)
Bubble-wrap
Clothing & shoes
Diapers
Plastic or Tyvek® envelopes
Food (but you can compost it)

Kitty litter

Knives

Light bulbs, incandescent (trash), compact fluorescent light bulbs (*bring to environmental department*)

Needles

Paper napkins

Paper towels

Plastic bags:

bread bags
frozen vegetable, snack/sandwich, trash bags

Plastic wrap or film

Potato chip bags

Ribbon & bows

Styrofoam® or polystyrene foam (*even if marked #6*)

Trash/waste

Vinyl (siding, bumper stickers, etc.)

Waxed boxes & paper
Wood

BATTERIES:

Spent batteries base wide are returned to the Recycling Center which is located in building A-9 Coddington Cove. We accept all types of batteries. Here they are specially packaged and then recycled.

TONER/PRINT CARTRIDGES:

All personnel may dispose of depleted printer or toner cartridges at the Recycling Center in building A-9 Coddington Cove. No paperwork is necessary to turn them in.

BOTTLES/CANS/PLASTICS:

All cans, bottles, and plastics that contain #1 through #7 symbol are recycled here at Naval Station Newport and should be placed in the your single stream desk side containers or the single stream dumpsters located outside your command.

THRIFT-SHOP:

Have clothing, household goods, toys, jewelry, books, furniture and electronics that are in good condition but are no longer needed? Take them to the Navy-Marines Corps Relief Thrift Shop located at Building 305.

Hours are Tuesday and Thursday 1100-1300.

BINS & CONTAINERS

As part of the program, desk side and break room containers will be provided to all commands as requested. If a Command will be moving, graduating, cleaning out files, shredding documents, or generates a large volume of paper or any listed recyclables in this brochure, please contact the Integrated Solid Waste/Recycling Operations Manager for assistance.
