



## 144 teenagers 'Go Navy' here for two weeks

Navy Junior ROTC (NJROTC) students representing 60 public high schools and charter schools in Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, New York and five New England states will graduate today in a ceremony that concludes the two-week 2011 NJROTC Area Four Leadership Academy and Sail Training (LA/ST) program at Naval Station Newport.

Arriving here July 3, 144 NJROTC cadets learned military leadership principles and received consolidated introduction to sailing that culminated with a competitive regatta on Nar-

ragansett Bay.

Approximately 60 percent of the cadets will be entering their junior year in high school. Forty percent of the cadets will be entering their senior year. Many of the cadets will return to their high schools and assume top leadership positions.

Cadets were divided into four platoons, and were led and trained by a cadre consisting of a platoon commander who is a naval science instructor (NSI) at one of the participating schools, and cadet alumni aides. Adult women were "platoon moms."

# Men at Work

**Major construction taking place this season on Aquidneck Island**

As Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport continues with major construction projects, soon we will notice much of the same at various locations around Aquidneck Island.

In a community leadership meeting held at Newport City Hall last week and attended by Capt. Joe Voboril,

NAVSTA commanding officer, Newport City Manager Ed Lavallee briefed the forum on some major projects coming down the pike both in the city, Middletown and Portsmouth.

Some of these projects will directly benefit the Navy as an organization; but all of the projects will benefit individuals living and working here. Following is an overview of some of the major projects:

Proposals are being reviewed to construct a new water plant in Portsmouth at Lawton Valley and rehabilitate Station

One in Newport. The estimated cost of this project is \$70 million and should be completed by December 2014.



Efforts to control water pollution are well underway throughout Newport, which is why many streets are torn up as communities address storm water runoff into the sewer system.

By reducing the water quantity that passes through the sewer treatment plant, and diverting storm water run-off into catch basins where it can be treated using ultra violet means, the closure of local beaches after heavy downpours is significantly reduced. Tests on the

# NEX A-OK selects MHS graduate

Katie M. Rutledge, who was graduated from Middletown High School last June and maintained a 3.9 GPA in her senior year, was selected as the Navy Exchange A-OK Student for the quarter, and received a \$2,000 savings bond.

She is the daughter of retired Marine Col. Joseph and Mrs. Tracy Rutledge.

The A-OK Student Reward program supports students in the military community by rewarding hard work and good grades. Dependent children of active duty members, reservists, and military retirees who obtain a "B" grade average or equivalent, are eligible to bring their report cards into the NEX to complete an entry form and obtain an A-OK ID card.

The completed entry form enters the eligible student in a system-wide

Since its inception, A-OK has awarded more than \$350,000 in savings bonds. Four times during the school year, winners of four savings bonds (\$5,000, \$3,000, \$2,000 and \$1,000) are selected in a drawing at

### Black Ships Festival opens





## Classic 'wheels' spark memories

Dewey Field at Naval Station Newport looked like a huge used car lot last Saturday, but these automobiles and trucks were lovingly restored and maintained classics and antiques representing some of the favorite "rides" of the 20th Century.

Almost 150 cars and trucks were entered in the Naval Station Newport third annual Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department Car Show. Perfect weather helped make the show the best ever.

## WWII Marine hero is home at last

SPOKANE, Wash. – The remains of a Marine Corps private, originally listed as Killed in Action and later Missing in Action in World War II in the Pacific Theater, were returned to U.S. soil after 68 years for proper burial over the July 4th weekend.

Nine Marines from Battery P, 5th Battalion, 14th Marines Regiment received the casket of Pfc. Herman Fred Sturmer Jr. at Spokane International Airport on

June 29.

Chaplain (Cmdr.) Manuel A. Biadog, former command staff chaplain at Naval Station Newport, R.I., officiated at burial services at Spokane Memorial Gardens on July 1.

Sturmer's only surviving family member and younger sister, Mrs. Lexey Lyons, 74, along with his two nephews, Butch and Dennis Walter, attended the funeral.

The last time Mrs. Lyons

saw her eldest brother Herman, nicknamed "Junior," was when he enlisted in the Marine Corps in the fall of 1942 at age 17.

Sturmer was killed in the invasion of the small Tarawa island of Betio, in the Battle for Tarawa, in November 1942. It was the first American offensive against Japan in the Pacific.



In 2002, a construction crew working in what is now the Republic of Kiribati, found human remains

on Betio. Military equipment found with the remains suggested that it was an American serviceman from World War II.

A U.S. Peace Corps volunteer assigned in Kiribati contacted U.S. government representatives.

The information was relayed to the U.S. Army Central Identification Laboratory in Hawaii that has responsibility for the recovery and identification of **MARINE, Page 14**





Naval Training Station Sailors in August 1918 play a game of Push Ball, which the *Encyclopaedia Britannica* of 1911 described as a game played by two teams of 11 on a field usually 140 by 50 yards, with a ball 6 feet in diameter and weighing 50 pounds. The goal posts were 18 feet high and 20 feet apart with a crossbar 7 feet from the ground. Pushing the ball under the bar was worth 5 points; and lifting or throwing it over the bar counted 8. The game enjoyed brief popularity but soon faded into history.

untreated water often show a high bacteria count.

Turning away from utilities, millions of dollars in roadway improvement projects, including sidewalks, throughout the city are underway. Washington Square is scheduled for its Phase 3 construction completion in August. The Broadway project, which will include repaving, historic lighting, landscaping and sidewalk improvements, should be through its engineering phase by later this summer as well.

There are 22 local streets being repaved this summer and a major project on Brenton Road, Harrison Road and Ridge Road that is being funded by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds.

Lastly, the city is aggressively seeking ways to maximize the value of Newport Harbor as a hub for tourists arriving via the water. Construction is underway for a visitor center for boaters at water-side ground level of the Armory on Lower Thames Street. Long-term restoration plans for that building are in the assessment phase now but could include more waterfront dining venues and shower/laundry facilities for boaters using the transient slips are currently being considered.

"We know it's an inconvenience for the residents and tourists to have to put up with all of this disruption in the middle of the summer, but much of the funding is coming via government grants and other sources – when the money arrives – the companies get to work," said LaVallee.

Be on the lookout for "Men at Work" signs as progress towards improving the quality of life for everyone on Aquidneck Island continues.


