Newest DDG off to commissioning

BATH, Maine (NNS) — The newest Arleigh Burke class guided-missile destroyer, the future USS Spruance (DDG 111), sailed away from the Bath Iron Works shipyard in Maine Sept. 1 on its maiden voyage to her commissioning site in Key West, Fla., before heading to her eventual

homeport of San Diego, Calif.

She stopped at Pier 2, Naval Station Newport, R.I., on Sept. 2 for the Labor Day weekend and left Wednesday after refueling.

This milestone marks the government and industry teams' completion of DDG 111, the 61st Arleigh Burke-class destroyer.

Prior to reaching this

milestone, Spruance finished combined "super trials" March 18 in the Gulf of Maine. Throughout four days underway, Bath Iron Works and the U.S. Navy's Board of Inspection and Survey tested the ship and its systems as required to prove its operational readiness. The Navy accepted delivery of Spruance April 15.

The commissioning of USS Spruance is scheduled for sundown on Oct. 1.

The ship is named for Adm. Raymond Spruance, who led U.S. Navy forces in the Battle of Midway and the Battle of the Philippine Sea in World War II. Previously, Spruance's name was on the lead ship of the former Spruance class of destroyers.

Observances to mark 9/11

The "Race to Remember," sponsored by the Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department this morning at 6 a.m., was the first of three observance of Patriot Day at Naval Station Newport today through Sunday to commemorate the Sept. 11 attacks on the United States.

The Naval War College (NWC) will hold its annual 9/11 ceremony at noon today, at the Patriot Day Memorial next to McCarty-Little Hall. Anyone with routine base access is invited.

Parking is extremely limited at the college so guests are encouraged to park in the Officers' Club or Gym 109 lot and walk to the campus.

The ceremony will include a guest speaker, and a wreath-laying and bell ringing ceremony by the Newport area chief petty officer-selectees.

Those who perished included three Washington D.C.-based students who were actively enrolled at the time of the attack: Ms. Angela Houtz, 27, of LaPlata, Md.; Lt. Jonas Panik, 26, of Mingoville, Pa.; and

Cmdr. Dan Shanower, 40, of Naperville, Ill. All three were serving in the Chief of Naval Operations Intelligence Department at the Pentagon.

Cmdr. Shanower commanded the 28-person unit, and Houtz was a senior day analyst. Panik, a highly-respected briefer, had been with the unit over a year.

The seven Naval War College alumni were: Capt. Gerald F. DeConto, 44; Lt. Cmdr. Robert R. Elseth, 37; Capt. Lawrence D. Getzfred, 57; Cmdr. Patrick J. Murphy, 38; retired Capt. Jack Punches, 51, Cmdr. Robert A. Schlegel, 38, and Army Maj. Kip Taylor, 38.

The NAVSTA Police and Fire Departments will hold a Sept. 11 remembrance ceremony to dedicate a new monument in front of the Public Safety Building on Sunday, Sept. 11, at 10:30 a.m. The ceremony will be followed by refreshments, a barbecue, tours of the facility and activities for the children. This event is also open to anyone with routine base access.

Installation access changes affect vendors, contractors

Effective Nov. 1, Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport (including Naval Health Clinic New England Newport, the Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) and NUWC Division Newport) will implement significant changes to their access procedures to increase the security posture of the installation.

The priority is to maintain a safe and secure installation while offering a solution that will also provide streamlined access.

In accordance with CNIC

Notice 5530 the NCACS (Navy Commercial Access Control System) Program which uses the contracted security database system called RAPIDGate will be instituted for all vendors, contractors, sub-contractors and service providers who are not authorized a Common Access Card (CAC) and regularly come aboard NAVSTA.

Affected personnel will be migrated out of the installation contractor badge program for access to the installation into

EITHER the RAPIDGate Pass program or One Day Personnel/Vehicle Pass Program.

Personnel who choose to participate in the RAPIDGate Program will have streamlined access onto the installation during the hours needed to perform business. NCACS participants will not be required to obtain a vehicle pass/decal and will only be subject to random vehicle inspections. NCACS par-

NUWC team of 14 answers Fleet call

MIDDLETOWN — Fourteen members of a special study team at the Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) Division, Newport, have won the International Test and Evaluation Association (ITEA) Technical Achievement Award.

This annual award program recognizes individuals and teams for outstanding achievement in applying instrumentation, information technology, modeling and simulation, time-space-positioning information, electro-optics technology, or other test and evaluation (T&E) technology to cause a T&E program to be better, faster, and less expensive.

The Urgent Operational Needs (UON) Weapons Analysis Facility (WAF) Study Team responded to an anti-submarine warfare UON statement from the Navy's Fifth Fleet which is responsible for naval forces in the Persian Gulf, Red Sea, Arabian Sea and the coast off East Africa as far south as Kenya.

Team members conducted a modeling and simulation study to assess heavyweight and lightweight torpedo performance.

"For the study, the NUWC Newport team evaluated both current Fleet and newer, developmental torpedo variants side-by-side under exactly the same conditions," said Dr. Paul Lefebvre, technical director for NUWC Newport.

The team gathered meaningful weapon effectiveness comparison data and identified areas where future torpedo changes could improve performance.

"This highly dedicated, innovative and extremely responsive team pursued answers to an urgent fleet need in a high tempo, short deadline situation," added Capt. Todd Cramer, NUWC Newport's commander.

The team will be honored at a special ceremony during the ITEA annual symposium in Orlando, Fla., on Sept. 14.





NWC to conduct Fleet Arctic Operations Game 2011

The U.S. Naval War College will explore the changing environment of the Arctic region in an operations table-top game, Sept. 13-16.

Fleet Arctic Operations Game 2011, sponsored by the Norfolk, Va.-based U.S. Fleet Forces Command (USFF), will explore many factors that impact the U.S. Navy's ability to operate in the Arctic. Participants will

identify gaps that limit sustained maritime operations in the region and explore possible mitigation strategies and long-term solutions needed to address these gaps.

"The gradual change in global climate conditions, competition for natural resources and unresolved territorial claims continue to demand greater attention to the Arctic region," said Walter Berbrick, a professor in NWC's War Gam-

ing Department. "At any time, the U.S. Navy could be called upon to respond to any immediate threats in the region."

Approximately 80 participants from a variety of military and civilian organizations, industry, and academia will engage in the four-day game. Participants will also receive several presentations and engage in facilitated discussions. The blend of U.S. and international mar-

itime operators, civilian system engineers, and Arctic regional experts will provide a greater understanding and shared experience into the major issues, challenges, and opportunities associated with the changing Arctic environment.

Following the operations game, a comprehensive report will be shared with senior military and civilian leaders in the international maritime community.

FRANKLIN, Mass. – The Naval Academy Prep School football team opened its 2011 campaign with a hard-fought victory against the Bulldogs of Dean College, 20-18, last Saturday in Franklin.

The Rams offense began with an 11-play, 66-yard drive that was capped off by a 25-yard touchdown scamper by DeMond Brown. The offensive line provided some key blocks in the opening drive that put the midshipman candidates up, 7-0.

The defense was outstanding in the first quarter and kept the Bulldogs off the board. The front eight did its part, limiting Dean to minimal yards on the ground. Jude Akpunku and William Anthony provided the defensive line with hard-nosed hits, and great play all afternoon.

The Dean offense threatened in the red zone four times, but the Rams held strong, allowing only one touchdown on the goal line, and posting three defensive stops in the red zone.

One of those defensive stops included a fourth-and-goal interception by Kwazel Bertrand. Bertrand had a nice return on the interception shaking Dean defenders left and right and bringing the ball back into Dean territory. The first half ended with the Newport team on top, 7-6.

The second half began with another defensive stop

by NAPS. The offense couldn't finish the ensuing drive, and once again the defense was called upon. Quincy Adams broke a critical pass by Dean, forcing the Bulldogs to punt on fourth down. Rams' offense took over on the Dean 42 yard line.

On the third play of the drive, Quentin Ezell took the ball 31 yards up the middle to Navy pay-dirt, taking three Dean defenders with him into the end zone. That put the Rams up 14-6.

But the Bulldogs got a great kick-off return that put them in the red zone to start their offensive drive. They scored, but missed

Participants will be able to access the installation through any operational gate that can accommodate their vehicle's size.

After Oct. 31, NAVSTA will not accept any locally produced contractor badges (NAVSEA Newport and Region badges) issued by Pass & ID offices for routine base access.

That credential can be used, however, to gain a one day pass from Pass & ID for entrance onto the installation. Also there are currently no provisions within the program for after-hours access for non-RAPIDGate participants.

One day passes must be obtained during NAVSTA Pass & ID Office hours of operation. The office is in Cloyne Court, Training Station Road, and is open Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. The telephone number is (401) 841-3126.

NOTE: Locally produced credentials/badges (NAVSEA NUWC and Region badges) being used to access restricted areas or buildings will still be utilized for that purpose. They will NOT be approved for access onto the installation through external entry control points/gates.
