His widow accepts medal for her late husband in a Washington ceremony.

WASHINGTON D.C. — Adm. Mike Mullen, former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, presented the Silver Star (posthumously) to Brooke Toner, widow of Narragansett, R.I., native Lt. j.g. Francis Toner, on Sept. 23 in front of a standing room only crowd in the auditorium of the Navy Memorial and Heritage Center.

Toner is the namesake of one of the newest structures onboard Naval Station Newport — the \$15.5 million vehicle bridge connecting Coasters' Harbor

Island with Coddington Point. The bridge was dedicated on the second anniversary of Toner's death, last March 27.

Following the awards ceremony on Friday, a crew from Naval Station Newport Public Works replaced the plaque indicating Toner had been awarded a Bronze Star with Valor for his heroism with the plaque specifying his award of the Silver Star.

The Navy had originally awarded Toner a Bronze Star for his actions unaware that the Army had submitted him for a Silver Star, which was approved and actually presented at this event held at the Navy Memorial.

Adm. Mullen spoke of the dedication and sacrifices made by Navy men and women in individual augmentee positions since

the beginning of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

"Throughout these wars the Seabees have changed more and no one has done better," he said. "I have so admired the war-fighting skills and compliments you get."

Toner, a Civil Engineer Corps officer, was serving at Camp Shaheen, Mazar-E-Sharif, Afghanistan. He, along with Lt. Florence B. Choe of California, were shot and killed by an Afghan national while the two naval officers were jogging inside the perimeter of the base.

An excerpt from the citation reads: "that Lt. j.g. Toner, unarmed, verbally challenged the insurgent and continued to advance until he was fatally wounded. His actions distracted the attacker from shooting the second wounded, and

allowed the fourth runner to seek reinforcements."

"I am so proud of you, that is what I would tell him if he were here with us now," Mrs. Toner said after the presentation of the award. She has become an active organizer and participant in the American Widows Project and has used this tragedy to reach out and help others.

Toner's family and friends from around the world are engaged in the Toner Memorial Foundation started in the lieutenant's honor.

"This (the ceremony) is a celebration for a special individual raised in an extraordinary family. We're blessed to live in a country that so values their service," said Adm. Mullen.

Lt. j.g. Toner is interred in Arlington National Cemetery.

Guest speaker uncovers some Hispanic roots

Capt. Anthony Cowden, a student at the Naval War College, was the guest speaker at Officer Training Command Newport's (OTCN) observance of Hispanic Heritage Month last Friday. The observance was sponsored by OTCN and Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport's Diversity Committee.

The theme for the 2011 obser-

ance is Many Backgrounds, Many Stories: One American Spirit. The observance celebrates the histories, cultures and contributions of Americans who trace their roots to Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

Cowden said the name Cowden, a very anglo last name, didn't have an Hispanic connection. He said

his search on *ancestry.com* seemed to prove that the name Cowden was very European.

Cowden said his story began when he was adopted at seven months old.

"Somewhere along the way, my adoptive parents shared with me a little information about the origins of my birth parents," he said.

He learned that his mother was a Cuban studying in Washington, D.C.

His father was Latin American and possibly Honduran. He subsequently learned his father was also a Cuban studying in Washington, D.C.

"It wasn't until the last few years that I asked my adoptive mother for more information about the origins of my birth parents,"

Cowden said. His adoptive mother showed him an index card that had very lit-

Exciting changes are taking place in the Family Medicine Clinic at Naval Health Clinic New England. Staff members are moving into new office and exam spaces, and the formation of the Blue and Gold Teams is coming together for the implementation of Medical Home.

Lt. (Dr.) Joni Stuart and Lt. (Dr.) Victoria Derevianko have joined the Blue Team; Lt. Cmdr. Ryan Griswold is a member of the Gold Team; and Dr. Sandra Wechsler is the new pediatrician.

Medical Home is patient-centered care, meeting the needs of patients based on access and timeliness. Beneficiaries will still be assigned a primary care manager, but will belong to a larger health care team that includes nurses, corpsmen

and support staff. This concept centers on care coordinated by an entire team to provide timely appointments and allow staff to be familiar and informed on the status of their patients.

Patients will have the ability to schedule appointments, request medicine renewals, and get laboratory results online with our new Relay Health system, making communication easier between you and your team.

Dr. Wechsler joins Drs. Anthony Amaio and James McDonald in the Pediatrics Clinic. She comes to NHCNE from Hawaii where she worked at military medical facilities, and prior to that she had her own practice in Virginia Beach, Va.



people that it really cements in my mind the unique opportunity that this particular fellowship presents."



NWC War Gaming facilitates maritime protection seminar

MANAMA, Bahrain — The Naval War College's (NWC) War Gaming Department played a vital role in supporting the 2011 Maritime Infrastructure Protection Symposium here Sept. 20-22.

Emergency evacuation drill involves all NAVSTA players

A training exercise that tested Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport's response to handling a large number of evacuees arriving from another military installation was held Sept. 29 at the Harbor Island Conference Center.

The scenario of the three-hour exercise was a catastrophic event at the Millstone Nuclear Power Plant in New London, Conn., which required the relocation of military members and their families from U.S. Submarine Base Groton, New London, to Newport.

The exercise involved establishing an emergency family assistance center

(EFAC) that would serve as a consolidated staging area where temporarily displaced DoD families and individuals could obtain disaster relief assistance, current information from leadership, and benefit from the integration of services that address their needs.

"This exercise was very useful in highlighting the complexities of setting up this emergency organization," said Capt. Joe Voboril, NAVSTA commanding officer.

A training "time out" was announced periodically during the exercise to give EFAC service providers an opportunity to explain how the various hypothetical cases would be managed in

the real world. The exercise play consisted of so-called "paper clients" who arrived at the EFAC for help and assistance in resolving issues.

A reception desk screened the clients, identified their needs and requests, and routed the family members to the







Geologists find Navy rock solid

An elite group of graduate and undergraduate students, a visiting professor from Turkey and two professors, all from Yale University's Geology and Geophysics Department, visited Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport last Saturday to study the coastal area during low tide and search for conglomerates.

A conglomerate is rock consisting of pebbles and gravel embedded in a loosely cementing material. There are quite a few of these around the Naval Station Newport shoreline, and many laymen may think that they are manmade.

However, they are approximately 200 million year-old terrestrial


deposits, the team said.

"We are interested in visiting sites like this to study how these rock deposits deform over time," said Professor Mark Brandon, the lead on the expedition that included various sites around the area.

Students Tommy Winger and Ben Mullet photographed good samples of conglomerates exposed at low tide in front of Fitzgerald Hall.

While preparing to leave the base, Brandon noticed the quality of the Westerly granite used to build Luce and Pringle Halls at the Naval War College.

The stone could be 550 million years old, he said.

ments. She recognized the impact that has on spouse careers and children who attend numerous schools, while a parent may also be deployed and in harm's way.

"And not coming from a military family, one of the voices or some of the voices that I always heard but were unfamiliar to me were your voices," said Mrs. Obama as she talked about what led to the "Joining Forces" initiative.

"Because in almost every group that I met with, not intentionally, but it was just how it happened, there were always military spouses, mostly women, and I was surprised by how surprised I was that I wasn't familiar with your story."

During the conversation with the First Lady, Rhode Island's military spouses raised issues such as licensure in teaching, nursing, and other professional careers; special education needs for children;

the effects of post-traumatic stress disorder on families; and the importance of military benefits.

Mrs. Obama will take their concerns and recommendations back with her as she continues to bring attention to the unique needs and strength of America's military families through "Joining Forces," while creating greater connections between the American public and the military.

Mrs. Obama and Dr. Biden are asking Americans to get involved in any way they can. Military service members represent only one percent of the U.S. population, and Mrs. Obama and Dr. Biden are advocating that 100 percent of Americans need to support troops and their families.

"Knowing what my parents' background was has made a difference," he said.

Cowden said his efforts to get information through the adoption agency have been unsuccessful. "They won't tell me very much without a court order," he said.

"I've always had respect for America first and the primacy of American citizenship, but have acknowledged a respect for America as a melting pot and individual backgrounds."

Army Gen. Dempsey relieves Mullen as new Chairman JCS

WASHINGTON—The Obama administration welcomed Army Gen. Martin Dempsey as the new Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff last weekend and said farewell to Navy Adm. Mike Mullen, whose final day as the top American military officer was punctuated by the killing of a key Al Qaeda figure.

In a ceremony at Fort Myer, Va., President Obama lauded Mullen for his steadiness, resilience and humility.

“Be assured, our military is stronger, and our nation is more secure because of the service that you have rendered,” the president told Mullen, who is ending a 43-year military career. Obama called Dempsey one of the military’s most battle-tested officers.

In his final speech as

chairman, Mullen urged Americans to do more to help returning war veterans. “War has changed them and their loved ones forever, but it has not changed their dreams,” Mullen said. “You can help make those dreams come true. Hire them. Help them buy a home. Get them started on the path to an education. Give them a chance.”

After his swearing-in, Dempsey delivered brief remarks pledging that on his watch the military will remain strong, despite the pressure of budget cuts.

“We’ll change, and we’ll be challenged,” he said. “But when I complete my tenure as Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, I intend

to be able to say exactly the same thing: We will be the joint force the nation needs us to be, so help me God.”

Before taking over as chairman, Dempsey made clear that he differs with Mullen on the threat posed to national security by a growing national debt.

At his Senate confirmation hearing in July, Dempsey was asked whether he agreed with Mullen’s oft-repeated assertion that the debt crisis is the single biggest threat to U.S. national security. “I don’t agree exactly with that,” Dempsey said.

He said global power and influence are derived from three strengths: military, diplomatic, and economic. “You can’t pick or choose.”
