

New Army Reserve Center dedicated to Sgt. Paranzino

A standing room only crowd gathered last Saturday to take part in the opening and official dedication of the new U.S. Army Reserve Center on Simonpieri Drive to Middletown native Sgt. Michael F. Paranzino.

The center, just inside Gate 10, is the newest building on board Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport.

Paranzino, a U.S. Army cavalry scout, was killed in action Nov 5, 2010, in Kandahar Province, Afghanistan. "The sacrifices he made cannot be matched, the suffering of his family cannot be imagined and the debt we owe him cannot be paid," said Maj. Gen. William D.R. Waff, Commanding General, 99th Regional Support Command during his opening remarks. He challenged the men and women who will enter the facility to make the most of this wonderful gift from the American taxpayers to polish their skills

and continue to be ready to answer the call to duty.

"To the officers and soldiers, whenever you enter this center, take time to reflect on Sgt. Mike Paranzino and the example he set for all of us," he said.

Maj. Gen. Waff was followed in his remarks by U.S. Sen. Jack Reed, D-R.I., who made special note of three U.S. Army Cavalry scouts who traveled from Ft. Drum, N.Y., to attend the ceremony. The three served with Sgt. Paranzino in Afghanistan and stood front and center when Butch and Melane Paranzino, Michael's parents, unveiled the plaque at the entrance of the facility bearing their son's image and the words, "An American Hero who made the ultimate sacrifice in service for his country."

The ceremony was a solemn tribute to Sgt. Paranzino. The family was surrounded by relatives, friends and co-workers. Butch Paranzino also provided remarks to those

Russians join NWC exercise

Russian naval officers from the Kuznetsov Naval Academy (KNA) joined with the Naval War College for a combined operations game at the college Oct. 24-28.

The five-day KNA Game 2011 brought together participants from NWC, KNA, the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA) as well as other U.S. government and civilian agencies. Developed with KNA by NWC's War Gaming Department, the game focused on examining the planning

process for humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HA/DR) operations.

The college-to-college relationship between the two graduate-level naval war colleges was formalized six years ago. A large part of the exchange program is bringing together expert working groups to explore issues of mutual interest relevant to professional military education and research, and analysis and war gaming on matters pertaining to peacekeeping

SEA deputy director to retire

Command Master Chief (SW) Mark Fiorey, deputy director of the U.S. Navy Senior Enlisted Academy, will retire Nov. 18 at 10:30 a.m., capping 30 years of distinguished service.

He will retire to Narragansett, R.I. with his wife, Charla, his daughters, Carly and Leah, and son, Spence.

Master Chief Fiorey was raised in South Florida, and Rhode Island. He joined the Navy in November 1981 and completed recruit training in Great Lakes, Illinois, followed by Hull Maintenance Technician "A" School at Treasure Island, San Francisco.

Fiorey's first sea duty assignment was aboard the USS Holland (AS 32) homeported in Charleston, S.C., in July 1982. His subsequent sea assignments include USS Jesse L. Brown (FF 1089), Charleston, S.C.; 1984-1986; USS Capodanno (FF-1093), Newport, 1986-1989; USS Frank Cable (AS 40), Charleston, 1993-1995/Apra Harbor Guam,

1995-1997; and USS Frank Cable (AS 40) Apra Harbor Guam, 2006-2209.

He completed the U.S. Joint Forces Command, Senior Enlisted Leader Keystone Course, Class 2005-2, as well as the Command Master Chief/Chief of the Boat Course, Class 28.

He is a graduate of the Senior Enlisted Academy, class 94 Khaki.

Hawaii's strategic importance to U.S. reexamined in depth

The whys and wherefores of the annexation of the Hawaiian Islands was the



Morgan *U.S.-Japanese Rivalry over*

the Annexation of Hawaii, 1885-1898, looks at the issues surrounding the overthrow of the monarchy of Queen Lili'uokalani in Hawaii.

The causes that led to the revolution are often lumped together and placed at the feet of the white missionary families. Segments of this group would go on to found families whose great wealth would be derived from the sugar and pineapple plantations.

This is, however, simplistic and overlooks the other factors – strategic, geopolitical, ideological, social and economic – that, when analyzed, paint a more com-

plete understanding of the times. Dr. Morgan does a complete reevaluation of existing material on this topic and, by combining new material, he gives a new appreciation to the strategic importance of the Hawaiian Islands.

Presently, Dr. Morgan is a professor at the Marine Corps War College in Quantico, Va., where he is professor of Strategic Studies and director of the Regional Studies Program.

For 30 years he was a foreign service officer in the Department of State. He has also taught at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service. His book is a valuable resource to understanding history in the region and should be recommended reading for those going to Hawaii.

The next Eight Bells Lecture is scheduled for today at noon and will feature Ian Toll presenting his book, *Pacific Crucible*, about the first six months of World War II.

In December, there are two lectures scheduled. The first will be on Dec. 8 and will have Kevin

McCranie presenting his book, *Utmost Gallantry*. As we approach the bicentenary of the War of 1812, this study focuses on the oceanic war with Great Britain.

The second lecture, Dec. 15, will be John Gordon discussing, *Fighting for MacArthur, the Navy and Marine Corps' Desperate Defense of the Philippines*.

NAVSTA access regulations changing

The Navy is implementing two changes that impact access to shore installations nationwide.

The first became effective Oct. 1. Naval Station Newport implemented the Navy Commercial Access Control System (NCAS)/RAPIDGate system that primarily affects non-Department of Defense contractors who routinely request access onboard the installation.

Contractors have been registering at the Pass and ID Office since mid-August in order to receive their new credentials which will ultimately result in a greater ease of access for registered participants (www.rapidgate.com).

Beginning Dec. 1, non-affiliated individuals requesting unescorted access to the installation must submit their full name and social security

number to Naval Station Newport Pass & ID Office at least five working days in advance of their desired visit date.

This change, implemented as part of the directive-type *Memorandum 09-012*, is also being implemented nationwide.

More information on this upcoming change will be published in next Friday's *Newport Navalog*.

SEA instructors certified in 'situational leadership'

About two dozen instructors of the Senior Enlisted Academy (SEA) gained critical leadership skills during a "Situational Leadership" course in Simms Hall, Nov. 1-2.

Dr. Ron Campbell, president of Center for Leadership Studies (CLS), provided the certification training. The class uses a practical leadership model to show how to match skill sets with professional outcomes. The model was developed in the 1950s by Dr. Paul Hersey, an industrial psyche researcher.

He observed leader-follower relationships in the manufacturing sector, and also in a rocket science

environment.

When he put the scientists in charge of the manufacturers, Hersey noticed the rocket scientists, while incredibly intelligent, did not have the appropriate skill sets to manage personnel.

Since then, Campbell developed a class to train students to observe hierarchies of skill sets, and a process by which a leader must identify a task, assess the readiness level of their team, and then match the necessary skill styles to their subordinates' readiness levels.

The class gives senior enlisted personnel critical insight into management philosophy to make them more effective leaders.

Campbell comes to SEA

with a wealth of education and experience: he holds two bachelor's degrees, two master's degrees and a doctorate in fields related to organizations and management, in addition to over 20 years of consulting and training experience.

The Senior Enlisted Academy (SEA) provides senior enlisted leaders education in communication skills, leadership and management, national security affairs, Navy programs, and physical fitness.


The SEA is the Navy's only professional military education institute for senior enlisted service members. Of the 1,200 students in attendance annually, the majority are active duty Navy personnel. Navy





and maritime security cooperation.

"The planning of joint processes, making comparisons, and learning in a symbiotic relationship is best for everyone," said Russian Capt. 1st Rank Evgeniy Pakhomov.

During KNA 2011, U.S. and Russian military officers worked together as simulated navy task forces from both countries joined together to respond to a humanitarian crisis caused by a natural disaster. Working groups made strategic assessments of the situation on the ground and then devised courses of action to respond to the crisis.

"This exercise is a good channel of communication and open exchanges," said U.S. Marine Col. Mike Saleh, deputy dean for NWC's Center for Naval Warfare Studies.

In addition to the game, NWC arranged tours to Naval Submarine School and U.S. Coast Guard Academy in nearby Groton and New London, Conn. According to the KNA Game 2011 organizers, enriching respective student, faculty and staff experiences is the goal of these types of engagements.

"My main purpose here today is I want to say to you that we are all here to support you," he specifically said to those active duty and veterans in the audience, "I'm tremendously appreciative for all of your being here."

The Paranzino Army Reserve Center is approximately 59,000 square feet and incorporates all the Reserve's latest training and administration requirements while using an array of sustainability concepts. It includes a maintenance shop and unheated storage building with ample parking for the estimated 700 Army Reserve Soldiers who will use the new complex on rotating schedules.

The facility is the last 2005 Base Realignment and

Closure Recommendation (BRAC) construction project completed on NAVSTA. The units that will occupy this building are arriving from three separate USAR centers that were located in Warwick, Bristol and East Providence. The 443rd Civil Affairs Battalion; 2nd Battle Command Training Group, 1st Brigade (Military Intelligence); and Detachment 1, 2nd Battalion, 417th Regiment will all be housed in this new center which will result in significant operational cost savings achieved through the consolidation of training assets and the closures of their old facilities.

Of the 426 buildings on board NAVSTA, this is the only one dedicated to a Soldier. Welcome aboard U.S. Army Reserves.

Demands of U.S. security, economic woes analyzed

The Naval War College hosted a workshop entitled "Economics and Security: Challenges and Opportunities in a Resource Constrained World," with two days of panels concluding on Nov. 4.

Retired Ambassador John A. Cloud, presented the workshop to provide a collegial forum for a small and select group of national security professionals to evaluate and recommend economic and security choices for the future.

Panels addressed defense, diplomacy, information and economics in the context of the current U.S. national debt and annual deficits.

Participants considered how financial constraints are impacting national

security strategy and policy for the first time in many years.

As the sole global superpower, the United States will face both challenges and opportunities as it ded-

icates substantial resources to national security over the next decade. How the nation responds and how resources are used will determine the U.S. strategic position in the future.
