## NAVSTA stages War of 1812 tributes

Hundreds of spectators crowded onto Dewey Field onboard Naval Station Newport last Monday to view the Ocean State Tall Ships Festival Parade of Sail and enjoy music performed by Navy Band Northeast's ceremonial band, and its component groups.

The afternoon concert and high noon parade wrapped up a four-day Tall Ships festival visit to Newport by 14 Class A and B full-rigged ships, barques, schooners and brigantines that attracted thousands of visitors to the City by the Sea.

Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport personnel were fully engaged in the celebration seizing the opportunity to join with event organizers and commemorate the bicentennial of the War of 1812.

"We are thankful to the Ocean State Tall Ships organizers for bringing these vessels here to Newport and for inviting us to join the celebration commemorating the War of 1812," said Capt. Douglas Mikatari, Commanding

Officer, Naval Station Newport, to an audience of over 200 gathered in front of the Rhode Island Superior Court in Newport's Eisenhower Park last Sunday to enjoy a free concert by Navy Band Northeast.

War of 1812 banners and information on the Navy in the Ocean State lined the park and afforded the concert goers and passers by an excellent opportunity to brush up on their naval history.

In addition to the banners on the War of 1812 that lined the routes between Tall Ships throughout the weekend, military personnel from the Navy Supply Corps School, Surface War-

## All hands slated for SAPR training, CNO announces

WASHINGTON (NNS) — As part of the Navy's continuing efforts to eliminate sexual assaults and promote positive culture changes within the fleet, the Chief of Naval Personnel announced June 28 the creation of new Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) training.

For the first time, targeted and comprehensive sexual assault prevention training will be delivered to every active and reserve uniformed member in the Navy. The training follows the Navy's all-hands efforts for Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April, during which all Sailors from commands around the world took part in focused stand-down sessions highlighting varying aspects of sexual assault and each Sailors' role in eliminating this crime.

The training will also complement the Navy's multi-faceted approach to education and awareness; prevention and intervention; victim advocacy and

tion and accountability.

Training programs have been developed for command leadership (SAPR-Leadership) and for the Fleet as a whole (SAPR-Fleet). The wide-sweeping reach of this initiative ensures that all Sailors are motivated and able to intervene to stop sexual assault, according to Rear Adm. Martha Herb, Director of Personnel Readiness and Community Support.

"In the last fiscal year alone, the Navy received 582 reports of sexual assault, affecting Sailors across all ranks. This crime is corrosive to both our morale and to our operational readiness," said Herb. "Just as all Sailors are affected, all hands must work together to reduce and ultimately eliminate these crimes."

"Both SAPR-L and SAPR-F training will provide our team the critical tools to eliminate sexual assault and promote the Navy's core values of honor, courage and commitment."

# NJROTC cadets aim for leadership

One hundred and forty-two cadets from nearly 60 high schools in the New England area, New York, New Jersey, Delaware and eastern Pennsylvania graduate today at 10 a.m. in a ceremony on Nimitz Field from the 2012 Naval Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (NJROTC) Area 4 Leadership Academy and Sail Training (LA/ST) program at Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport.

Capt. Richard Brown, Commanding Officer, Surface Warfare Officers School, is the scheduled guest speaker.

The cadets, NJROTC adult staff, and chaperones arrived June 30 to begin the two week program. The selection process is considered highly competitive based on high school GPA, physical fitness, aptitude and a demonstration of the many leadership traits stressed at each school's NJROTC unit.

"The Leadership Academy and Sail Training mission is to prepare selected NJROTC cadets for leadership roles in their respective units by teaching cer-

tain leadership characteristics which aren't available at the cadet's home unit," said retired Marine Corps Maj. Bill Grigonis, LA/ST executive officer.

The LA/ST faculty members and chaperones included 20 senior and staff Naval Science Instructors from the various NJROTC units.

The contingent of 18 senior cadet aides assisted in the numerous individual and team building exercis-

es, physical training, drill, sailing, academics and different briefings that included STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics), the military service academies, and the Navy ROTC scholarship program.

"I've taken the leadership skills learned here and will apply them when I return to school," said Cadet Katie Henry, 17, of the Marine Academy of Science and Technology (MAST), Sandy

Hook, N.J. Henry, a cadet ensign, starts her senior year in the fall.

"This was a very positive experience. It helped me to rise to the occasion," she said.

The Leadership Academy curriculum consisted of 22, 40-minute interactive classes on leadership skills and the practical application of those skills.

# Navy Newport welcomes 29 teens for STARSHIP POSEIDON

Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport welcomed 29 high school juniors and seniors from Rhode Island and Massachusetts public and private schools onboard the installation last weekend for a week-long Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) summer program called STARSHIP POSEIDON.

The five-day program will include classroom and laboratory instruction in physics, chemistry, mathematics, astronomy and English. Outside of the classroom environment, the students visited the frigate USS Constitution "Old Ironsides" in Boston; the Surface Warfare Officers School to tour its training simulators; the Naval War College and the U.S. Naval Submarine Base Groton, New London.

In addition to program

elements already described, the students were offered counseling on college admission preparation, a college fair and exposure to Navy program.

The students were selected to attend via an application process administered by the Rhode Island STEM Center at Rhode Island College. STARSHIP POSEIDON is a pilot program funded by the Office of Naval Research and hosted by the Naval War College, Naval Academy Preparatory School and Naval Station Newport with technical demonstrations given by the Naval Undersea Warfare Center.

Recognizing that a healthy STEM workforce is critical to meeting the Navy and Marine Corps' greatest challenges, the Department of the Navy is committed to doubling its investment in STEM over the next five years.

## SWOS graduates 42 Department Heads

The Surface Warfare Officers School (SWOS) graduated Department Head Class 217 in the Admiral Michael G. Mullen Auditorium on July 6.

The class, consisting of 42 Surface Warfare Officers (SWOs), completed the 27-week course designed to prepare officers for duty as engineering, combat systems, operations, or First Lieutenant department heads on all classes of ships.

The course is divided into two major subdivisions - Tactical Action Officer (TAO), which focuses on areas such as undersea warfare, air defense and surface warfare; and Operations, Readiness, Training and Engineering (ORTE), which explores the specifics of each student's prospective assignments.

The guest speaker, Rear Adm. Anthony M. Kurta, director, Military Plans and Policy (N13), thanked the family and friends of the graduates for witnessing this major achievement in their careers. After congratulating the graduates on a job well done, Kurta reminded them of the importance of the demanding roles they were about to undertake and how they will be relied upon as leaders on their ships and must be ready to step-up.

"You are now fully trained surface warriors," said Kurta. "Your commanding officers will be counting on you to lead your respective departments and to provide advice on key command decisions; make sure you are up to the task. # Avoid bug bites, avoid infection

Fighting mosquito and tick bites will reduce your risk of getting diseases that they can carry. As per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) here are steps to reduce your risk:

For many species of mosquitoes their peak biting times are the hours from dusk to dawn. You can mosquito proof your home by draining any standing water, as they lay their eggs there. Keep them out by installing or repairing well fitting window and door screens.

Ticks do not have a peak time of day to bite. The key is to reduce exposure to ticks by avoiding wooded and bushy areas with high grass and leaf litter and

walking in the center of trails.

To prevent mosquitoes and ticks from biting you, the CDC recommends the use of products containing active ingredients which have been registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for use as repellents applied to skin and clothing. Products containing these active ingredients typically provide reasonably long-lasting protection: DEET; Picaridin. Certain products containing permethrin are recommended for use on clothing, shoes, bed nets, and camping gear, and are registered with EPA for this use. Permethrin is highly effective as an insecticide and as a repellent. Permethrin-treated clothing repels and kills ticks and mosquitoes.

The EPA recommends the following precautions when using insect repellents: Apply repellents only to exposed skin and/or clothing (as directed on the product label).

Do not use repellents under clothing. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds or irritated skin. Do not apply to eyes or mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. When using sprays, do not spray directly on face — spray on your hands first and then apply to face.

When using on children, apply to your own hands first and then put it on the child. You may not want to apply to children's hands. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Heavy application and saturation are generally unnecessary

for effectiveness. If biting insects do not respond to a thin film of repellent, then apply a bit more.

After returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water or bathe. This is particularly important when repellents are used repeatedly in a day or on consecutive days. Also, wash treated clothing before wearing it again. If you or your child gets a rash or other bad reaction from an insect repellent, stop using the repellent, wash the repellent off with mild soap and water, and call a local poison control center for further guidance. If you seek medical advice because of the repellent, take the repellent to the medical provider.







The USS Patoka, originally commissioned as an oiler in 1919, was converted five years later into a tender to support rigid airship operations. The Navy installed a 125 foot mooring mast on the ship's fantail. Additionally, she had the facilities to provide helium, gasoline and equipment repairs, and offer primary support for the Navy's first rigid airship, the USS Shenandoah (ZR-1), shown in this exercise with the ship in Narragansett Bay. In a thunderstorm over Ohio on Sept. 3, 1925, USS Shenandoah broke into three parts and was lost only 29 of 43 aboard Shenandoah survived.


