





War College to observe anniversary of Sept. 11

The Naval War College (NWC) will hold a remembrance of the 11th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on Tuesday, Sept. 11, at noon at the Patriots Memorial on campus between Conolly and McCarty-Little Halls.

NWC President Rear Adm. John N. Christenson and Dean of Students Capt. Ray Keledei are this year's guest speakers for Patriot Day.

On Sept. 11, 2001, Keledei was returning to his office in the Navy Command Center when a hijacked airliner hit the Pentagon, making him one of a handful of survivors from the Navy Command Center.

The ceremony will honor 11 fallen NWC students and alumni, who died at the Pentagon.

For the first time, the college is including recognition for retired Capt. John Yarnicky, who was a passenger on the airplane that hit the

Pentagon.

The remembrance will include a wreath-laying at the memorial, and a bell-ringing ceremony will be conducted by the Newport-area chief petty officer selectees.

The Naval War College's Patriots Memorial consists

of a section of limestone removed from the damaged portion of the Pentagon.

As parking is limited at NWC, anyone with base access wishing to attend the ceremony should park at the Officers' Club or Gym 109.

Navy ramps up efforts for suicide prevention



MILLINGTON, Tenn. (NNS) — September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month and the Navy is using the month as a launch pad to focus on its ongoing suicide prevention efforts, officials announced in NAVADMIN 259/12 released Aug. 27.

During each week of the month resources will be available to guide discussion on stress navigation and suicide prevention concepts. The weekly concepts to be explored are: building resilience, navigating stress, encouraging bystander intervention to A-C-T (Ask Care Treat), and reducing barriers for seeking support through counseling.

The tools and resources are available on www.suicide.navy.mil and www.navy.navstress.com. These tools emphasize the themes of dedication, optimism, determination and humor.

Additionally, the winner of the Suicide Prevention



Public Service Announcement Contest will be announced Sept. 28. The winning video will be available year-round online and will be broadcast regularly on Direct-to-Sailor television, the American Forces Network and Pentagon channel.

“Our people are our greatest asset,” said Capt. Kurt Scott, Behavioral Health Programs director, Bureau of Naval Personnel. “We’re promoting a lifestyle of total fitness - physically, mentally, socially and spiritually

- to ensure our Sailors are best able to meet the challenges they will face in today’s Navy. Free Online tutor help offered military families

Free access to online homework help and tutoring, 24 hours a day, is available through www.tutor.com/military for U.S. military families.

Live expert tutors provide one-to-one sessions, with no appointment needed.

The DoD-funded service is a benefit for U.S. military families, including active duty and Navy Reserve service-members, spouses and children.

The help is available for children in kindergarten through Grade 12 in 16-plus subjects, including math, science, English, writing, social studies, and

test/exam preparation. All skill levels, including Advanced Placement (AP), are covered.

The program also covers college, proofreading, and career transition support for adult service-members and adult dependents.

It is funded by the Department of Defense MWR Library Program, Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program, and Navy General Library Program.

To set up your free Tutor.com Military Account, you must meet the eligibility requirements for this program provided by the DoD.

Authorized patrons include: active duty Navy personnel and their dependents; Navy Reserve personnel (regardless of duty or deployment status) and their dependents; and dependent children of Navy Wounded Warrior/Survivor.

Navy families with multiple users, such as a spouse and children, can create multiple accounts based on the service-member's eligibility. Each account is free, but allows each individual user to save his or her own favorite tutors, store documents, and review past sessions.

West Nile Virus often undetected

West Nile Virus (WNV) is a potentially serious illness. Experts believe that WNV is established as a seasonal epidemic in North America that flares up in the summer and continues into the fall. The virus can infect humans, birds, mosquitoes, horses and some other mammals.

Mosquitoes become infected when they feed on infected birds. Infected mosquitoes can then spread WNV to humans and other animals when they bite.

In a very small number of cases, WNV also has been spread through blood transfusions, organ transplants, breastfeeding and even during pregnancy from mother to baby.

WNV is not spread through casual contact such as touching or kissing a person with the virus. People typically develop symptoms between 3 and 14 days after they have been bitten by an infected mosquito.

Approximately 80 percent

of people (about 4 out of 5) who are infected with WNV will not show any symptoms at all. Up to 20 percent of the people who become infected with WNV have symptoms such as fever, headache, body aches, nausea, vomiting and sometimes swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back. Symptoms can last as short as a few days, though even healthy people have become sick for several weeks.

About 1 in 150 people infected with WNV will develop severe illness. The severe symptoms can include high fever, headache, neck stiffness, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, numbness and paralysis. These symptoms may last several weeks, and neurological effects may be permanent.

There is no specific treatment for WNV infection. In cases with milder symptoms, including fever and aches, they improve on their own with no need to seek medical attention. However,

in the instance where severe symptoms develop, such as unusually severe headaches or confusion, immediate medical attention is required. Severe WNV illness usually requires hospitalization with supportive treatment including intravenous fluids, help with breathing and nursing care.

Mosquitoes in Rhode Island are trapped every week statewide and tested at the R.I. Department of Health

laboratory. This year, to date, three pools of mosquitoes have tested positive for West Nile Virus in Rhode Island (R.I. DOH).

Effort toward healthy diet rooted in vegetable garden

Planting a vegetable garden involves hours of hard work even before you see the first fruits (or vegetables) of your labor. However, months later when you are rewarded with fresh produce, it is all worth the effort.

This is true right now for the gardeners at Naval Health Clinic New England (NHCNE). The gardening project, in its second year, has mushroomed to include an array of heirloom and common variety vegetables and herbs.

The gardens were planted by Jack Mahar from NHCNE's Transportation Department, and Health Promotion and

Wellness Clinic active duty and civilian staff members. The crop along the outside walls of the medical facility include tomatoes, peppers, lettuce, kale, zucchini, squash, eggplant, cabbages, beans and herbs.

Capt. Tina Davidson, NHCNE's Commanding Officer, learned of the gardening project when she assumed command last April.

"I never dreamed how much the gardens would produce or how the plants would grow in the walled-in spaces. I don't know what they are feeding those plants, but it is amazing," she said.

"I am so proud of the dedicated staff that is involved in planting and tending to

the gardens. This is utilization of a previously vacant area to take care of our shipmates. What a great idea!" she added.

Several times a week, junior enlisted members who have expressed an interest in receiving the produce, receive baskets of freshly picked vegetables.

One of the objectives of the gardens is to introduce new and different varieties of vegetables to those who may not buy or try them on their own. The herbs grown in the garden enhance and sometimes present a challenge in the preparation of the vegetables, but if inspiration is needed, NHCNE's registered dietitian Ms. Cindy Millard

NAPS nips Dean in OT dogfight

The Naval Academy Preparatory School football team got its 2012 season off to a successful start with a 33-32 overtime win against Dean College last Saturday at Nimitz Field.

The team adopted the very essence of Team Wins, considering that all three phases — offense, defense and special teams — played a vital role in the victory against the fifth-ranked junior college team from Franklin, Mass.

The NAPS offense moved the ball fairly well in the first half, but struggled to get in the red zone. A 27-yard field goal by Daniel Grant-Johnson was the only NAPS score, so Navy trailed Dean, 19-3, at halftime. Despite the deficit, NAPS came out firing in the second half.

The third quarter started out with a 54-yard kickoff return by Brendon Clements to give NAPS excellent field position, but a stingy Dean defense prevented NAPS from capitalizing. Later in the quarter the NAPS special teams again came through when Tago Smith electrified the sideline with a 48-yard punt return which set up a touchdown run by Shawn White.

The touchdown was capped off with a pass from Kenneth Mouton to Julian Turner for the 2 point conversion to make it a one possession game. Immediately following the touchdown, Clements picked off the Dean quarterback and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown. Smith then tied the game with a 2 point conversion after an outstanding run.

With the score tied at 19, the NAPS defense came up big

when Charles Whitlock made a huge interception and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown. A successful extra point gave NAPS a 26-19 lead.

The NAPS defense protected the lead for one set of downs, but with the game clock winding down Dean scored a touchdown and extra point to tie the score at 26-26 with only 40 seconds left on the clock and set up an overtime

situation.

NAPS won the overtime coin toss and chose to defer giving Dean the first possession. The Dean offense scored on the third play of overtime, but missed the extra point. NAPS overtime possession began with two carries for losses



Destroyer skipper relieved of command

Porter is now commanded by Cmdr. Dave Richardson, the former executive officer of USS McFaul (DDG 74), who will serve as a permanent relief.

The ship is currently undergoing repair in Jebel Ali, United Arab Emirates.
