## DIILS' legal teachings span 20 years

The Defense Institute of International Legal Studies (DIILS) marked its 20th anniversary Oct. 1, and celebrated with a Dining Out celebration on Oct. 12 at Ochre Court, Salve Regina University.

DIILS, one of the lesser known schools on board Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport, has trained nearly 41,500 international military and civilian officials from 118 countries in the rule of law since it began two decades ago.

With a staff of only 30, DIILS plays an integral part in

supporting U.S. foreign and security policy in the areas of human rights, military justice, and the law of armed conflict.

In 1992, DIILS was established as part of a Congressional mandate to expand international military education and training programs. It became a functional element of the Defense Security Cooperation Agency on June 16, 2000. "I've been associated with DIILS in one capacity or another for over 10 years, initially as an adjunct and now as the director," said Capt. Robert A. Sanders, JAGC. "This 20th anniversary celebration was a great way to recognize the past and present contributions of so

many people as we collectively look forward to a very bright future."

Today, DIILS leads the U.S. Defense Security Cooperation community in resourcing professional legal education and training for U.S. partners around the world. Its \$9 million budget funds annual operations that include over 130 mobile courses, seminars and workshops with over 73 countries. Since its inception, DIILS has taught over 1,300 mobile programs globally and approximately 100 multinational resident courses.

DIILS training events take place in the United States and around the world. In Afghanistan, principles taught by DIILS instructors formed

the basis for establishing the Afghan National Army's Legal Corps.

In the Democratic Republic of the Congo, DIILS-trained legal professionals are now prosecuting and convicting militia members for sexual and gender-based crimes against civilians through their own military justice system.

At its home base in Newport, DIILS conducts nine annual resident courses covering topics such as the legal aspects of combating terrorism, corruption, and border security; international humanitarian law or the law of armed conflict; land and

## Ceremony to honor Beirut Marines

PORTSMOUTH — The 29th anniversary of the bombing of the U.S. Marine Corps Barracks in Beirut, Lebanon, will be marked at a ceremony on Tuesday, Oct. 23, at 10 a.m. at the Portsmouth Historical Society on East Main Road. The annual Portsmouth Beirut Marines Memorial Ceremony remembers the 241 Marines,

Sailors and others who died in the terrorist truck bomb attack on Oct. 23, 1983.

Out of the 241 American servicemen killed, nine of them were from Rhode Island and two were related by marriage.

A stone marker bearing the names of Sgt. Timothy Giblin; Cpls. Rick R. Crudale, Edward S. Iacovino

Jr., James E. Silvia, David S. Massa, Thomas A. Shipp, Edward Soares Jr., Stephen Spencer and Lance Cpl. Thomas Julian is erected on the grounds.

There will be a guest speaker from the Naval War College, plus active duty Marines from Marine Corps Detachment Newport, headquartered at Naval Station

Newport in Beirut Memorial Hall; retired military and representatives of several veterans' organizations; and town officials, will attend.

Special guests at this annual ceremony are surviving family members of those killed that fateful day. Anyone interested in sharing in this solemn remembrance is invited.

## What's a Navy IX? Author researches some obscure ships

Most people know what a carrier, submarine or destroyer is. But the Navy has little known ships that have their own unique stories to tell.

Spanning over 200 years of U.S. maritime history, *Uncommon*

*Warriors* by Ken Sayers is an excellent introduction and a very comprehensive listing of the auxiliary (AG) and miscellaneous (IX) vessels that have served in specialized roles and unusual missions for the Navy.

Sayers told their story at the Eight Bells Lecture Series on Oct. 4 at the Naval War College Museum.

Did you know that there were two sidewheeler, fresh water aircraft carriers in the Navy? They were the USS

Wolverine (IX 64) and USS Sable (IX 81). They operated only in the Great Lakes and were responsible for training 17,000 Navy pilots during World War II.

The Reina Mercedes (IX 25) is a vessel that is closely tied to Newport. After her sinking during the Battle of Santiago during the Spanish American War, she was raised and converted into a non-self-propelled receiving ship. She remained in Newport for eight years before being towed to Annapolis where she served for 45 years as a receiving ship, a floating barracks, and as a quasi-brig for midshipmen and marines.

For those readers who served during the Cold War, the chapter on the Hughes Glomar Explorer and the attempt to raise K-129, a Golf II, Soviet ballistic missile submarine, will be most familiar. Code-named Project Azorian, this CIA-led operation was able to raise part of the hull. The Navy eventually acquired the vessel and designated her AG 193, a miscellaneous auxiliary vessel.

# Ethiopian delegation visits NHCNE, briefed on blood safety procedures

BOSTON — Senior military medical personnel from the Ethiopian National Defense Forces (ENDF) attended the American Association of Blood Banks (AABB) annual meeting Oct. 5 to 9, continuing a seven year partnership with the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) to improve blood safety programs in Ethiopia to reduce the incidence of HIV.

The director general of the ENDF Health Main Directorate (DFHMD), Brig. Gen. Tesfay Gidey, and his senior medical personnel were able to interface and train with approximately 6,000 leading transfusion medicine and cellular therapy professionals from the U.S. and more than 80 countries around the world. In addition, the delegation attended the Armed Services Blood Program military blood program updates and participated in the Navy breakout session.

DoD plays a critical role in supporting foreign militaries to take preventive action against the spread of HIV and build the health capacity of its military. Gen. Tesfay and his personnel visited the Naval Health Clinic New England in Newport, R.I., on Oct. 10 where he was greeted

by the commanding officer, Capt. Tina Davidson, and the executive officer, Capt. Lena Hartzell.

He was given a brief of the mission, capabilities, and tour of the facility. He also visited with the president of the Naval War College, toured the campus and received a list of the Ethiopians who have attended the college. Direct military-to-military engagements such as these allow opportunities for information sharing that lead to better strategic planning for military health systems around the globe.

In 2005, collaboration

between the ENDF and DoD began to establish a safe, standardized, self-sufficient, and sustainable military blood program capable of collecting, processing, testing and distributing blood to military hospitals and supporting civilian hospitals' blood requirements during an emergency. The U.S. provided training has focused on: blood safety, blood administration, and adverse transfusion reactions; donor registration, donor screening, donor interview, donor phlebotomy, donor testing and confirmation testing; lot release; component labeling

and component destruction; supply requisitioning; good manufacturing practices; blood storage and distribution; quality assurance and quality control; equipment testing and equipment validation; and competency assessments of medical personnel.

In 2007, the ENDF blood program was officially established. There have been several technical assistance visits by DoD, in addition to weekly teleconferences to report, determine needs, mitigate issues and consult


# Bravo to Sailors, civilians on recycling commitment

Naval Station Newport (including all tenant commands and departments) achieved an impressive Fiscal 2012 (FY12) Solid Waste Diversion Rate of over 55 percent. Installation personnel reduced the amount of non-recyclables (trash) by 285 tons compared to Fiscal 2011 (FY11).

FY12 solid waste totals were the lowest amount generated since tracking began in FY07. In FY07, there were 1,814 tons of solid waste. In FY12 we generated 1,466 tons of solid waste.

Scott Mello, the Integrated Solid Waste Operations Manager for NAVSTA, attributes this success to a belief that everyone is finally changing the culture. People are hearing the recycling message and adjusting their habits accordingly.

This payoff is two-fold: Not only is



NAVSTA dumping 285 fewer tons of trash into our local landfills, it is also increasing the quantity of recyclables produced that will be re-used.

with the National Defense Blood Bank Center officials. A collaborative Strategic Plan (2008-2012) for the operation of the National Defense Blood Bank Center was developed and presented to the DFHMD leadership.

In August 2012 the sustainment MOU was signed between the U.S. Embassy, Addis Ababa, in Ethiopia and the Director General of the DFHMD.

To combat the spread of the HIV/AIDS epidemic, the U.S.

Government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), invests in strategies to save the lives of those suffering from HIV/AIDS around the world. The Department of Defense (DoD), an implementing agency and integral part of PEPFAR, provides direct military-to-military HIV/AIDS program assistance in the areas of HIV prevention, and care and treatment for HIV-infected military members and their families.

the use of force; computer crimes and the Internet; military law development; and developing a professional military.

One notable course is the Stability Operations: Legal Aspects of Rules of Engagement/Rules for the Use of Force Afghanistan. DIILS recently completed a regional seminar on Maritime Law designed to promote a peaceful resolution of territorial disputes in the Pacific, and a workshop on

maritime operational law that promoted multilateral solutions to disaster preparedness and the protection of maritime resources among Pacific Island nations.

With its emphasis on international military education and training, DIILS continues to grow as demand increases for legal security cooperation programs to address the challenges of defense in the 21st century.

in order to make the training as realistic as possible. Several of the volunteers are retired military veterans.

"The Willow is very grateful for the time that the Coast Guard Auxiliary took out of their schedule in order to sail into Naval Station Newport," said Ensign Aaron Garnier, a collateral duty law enforcement officer aboard Willow. "Thanks to their support, Willow is now better prepared to conduct boardings and carry out our law enforcement mission."

Willow and Tigershark crew personnel were divided into two-person boarding teams. Each team was given a scenario and observed by the CLEAR evaluators on how the teams would react given a specific set of circumstances.

As a federal law enforcement presence on both inland and international waters, the Coast Guard often interacts with the general public and the fishing community. Coast Guard

members must be up-to-date and conscientious of vessel safety regulations, criminal law, and what authority the Coast Guard has to conduct law enforcement proceedings.

Willow, a 225-foot vessel, conducts recreational boardings and fisheries boardings throughout the northeastern seaboard to protect valuable maritime resources and ensure boater awareness and safety. Her duties include maintaining aids to navigation in waters from Rhode Island to Maine and conducting search and rescue operations at sea.

Tigershark, an 87-foot vessel, conducts search and rescue, port and waterways coastal security, and law enforcement.

As a whole, the experience allowed Coast Guard members to learn more about the Coast Guard Auxiliary and aided in expanding the knowledge of the Coast Guard members who participated.

## Navy-Wide News

### Cruiser that visited NAVSTA, sub collide

NORFOLK, Va. (NNS) —The Navy submarine and the Aegis cruiser that collided off the East Coast are both back in port and officials are investigating what went wrong, the Pentagon said late last Sunday.

Lt. Commander Brian Badura of the U.S. Fleet Forces Command said in a news release that the submarine USS Montpelier (SSN 765) arrived at Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay in southern Georgia. The USS San Jacinto (CG 56) arrived at Naval Station Mayport in Jacksonville, Fla.

The vessels collided at about 3:30 p.m. Saturday during routine training operations and no one was injured. The news release said now that they are back in port, crews can further determine the extent of the damage.

The USS San Jacinto made a port-of-call visit to Naval Station Newport last August and served as schoolship for the Surface Warfare Officers School. About 10 crewmembers volunteered for a Community Relations (COMREL)

project at an assisted living group home in Middletown.

“We have had circumstances where Navy vessels have collided at sea in the past, but they’re fairly rare as to how often they do take place,” Badura told journalists.

Navy officials said the collision was under investigation, but declined to offer more specifics including where it happened.

The Navy said that the sub’s propulsion plant was not damaged.
