

## Active Shooter Awareness

In the aftermath of many active shooter tragedies, Security and Law Enforcement personnel have been tailoring their training on how to respond to Active Shooter situations. But what should you do if you hear gun shots in your area? Here are three links that can help answer that question!

NAVY KNOWLEDGE ON LINE. Click on [Navy E-Learning](#) Online courses, then open Most Recent Additions to Navy eLearning: scroll down to find "Training and Readiness – The Active Shooter (CNIC-TRTAS-1.0)", enroll and take the course.

DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (DHS). [Online training](#). This course provides guidance to managers and employees in order to respond to an active shooter situation. An active shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area. Upon course completion, individuals will be able to:

- Describe the actions to take when confronted with an active shooter;
- Recognize potential workplace violence indicators;
- Describe actions to prevent and prepare for potential active shooter incidents, and;
- Describe how to manage the active shooter consequences.

DHS produced an [Active Shooter Booklet](#). Print it and keep it close by, read it often and open discussions with co-workers on how to respond.

## Town Hall Meeting for Unaccompanied Housing

The next Town Hall Meeting is 19 January at 1430 in the C-9 auditorium for all residents of government operated facilities. The meeting will be to discuss upcoming events that might affect the lives of the residents and to allow residents to ask questions and provide information on how Unaccompanied Housing can improve.

Please encourage your Sailors, Marines, and Soldiers who live in government operated Unaccompanied Housing to attend. Command representation is encouraged.

## Solid Curtain/Citadel Shield

Exercise Solid Curtain/Citadel Shield 2012 (SC/CS12) will be conducted 19-24 March. This annual Force Protection Exercise will require Naval Station Norfolk to set and maintain FPCON C for a sustained period (48-72 HRS), during which only mission-essential personnel (MEP) will have access to the installation. A tenant CO/XO-level meeting will be held 5 JAN from 0900-1100 in the C-9 Auditorium (NAVSTA Norfolk MSG DTG 211512Z DEC 11 provides more detail on this meeting and the MEP planning process). The 5 JAN MTG will be followed by a series of training exercises and planning conferences, culminating in the exercise in March. All commands are expected to conduct MEP planning, participate in MEP planning events leading up to SC/CS12, and restrict activities to only mission-critical functions while FPCON C is set.
