

# 2012 Navy Teen Summer Camp Scholarship Program

## APPLICATION

### Section 1:

### Eligibility Requirements, Financial Responsibilities, Reimbursements, PCS

#### I. Eligibility Clause

- a. Participant must be a dependent of Navy active-duty or active-duty Reserve personnel.
- b. Participant must be between 13-17 years old by July 1, 2012.
- c. Participant must have a minimum 2.75 GPA (on a 4.0 scale)
- d. International Travelers Applicants: Must possess a passport that is valid for six months after the return trip home.
- e. Applications must be received in full by NO LATER THAN June 15, 2012.
- f. All youth assigned to joint bases operated by the U.S. Navy are eligible.
- g. If a family is PCS'ing, sponsors can select a different return airport.

#### II. Eligibility Verification

- a. All applicants are required to verify their sponsor's military status by one of two means:
    1. Provide a photo copy/scan of the applicant's military I.D. card\*
    2. Provide a photo copy/scan of the sponsor's military I.D. card\*
- \*Note: Please cover all Personal Identifiable Information.

#### III. Family Financial Responsibilities

- a. Unaccompanied Minor - Sponsors can elect for their teen to travel as an Unaccompanied Minor (UM) or Independent. If traveling as a UM, families are responsible for the UM's fees. All UM fees will be reimbursed 21 days after receipt is provided to the Navy. The Navy will make accommodations for families enduring financial hardship(s).
- b. Each family is responsible for funding all baggage fees to/from the camp location, any and all equipment rentals/deposits, airport meals, airport parking, and souvenir/spending money. Please contact the camp for details. The Navy will reimburse families for baggage fees to/from camp 21 days after receipt is provided to the Navy.

#### IV. Navy Financial Responsibilities

- a. The Navy is responsible for funding commercial airfare, camp registration, camp lodging, miscellaneous insurances and on-site camp meals.

## Section 9: Application Screening Process

All applications are thoroughly screened by a panel of judges. The majority of points are awarded to applicants who possess narratives with personal content, correct grammar, and punctuation.

Disqualifiers include: misinformation, late delivery, and narratives that appear to be completed by an adult.

All applicants will be notified via email if they have been selected or not selected for a scholarship.

## Section 10: Youth Expectations

1. Youth must show respect to all staff members, volunteers, peers, and camp property and equipment at all times. Any willful destruction of property will result in disciplinary action. Youth must listen and follow staff instructions promptly.
2. Foul, abusive, or unkind language will not be tolerated.
3. Stealing, fighting, arguing, and name-calling will result in disciplinary action.
4. Youth will be immediately sent home at the expense of their sponsor if found in possession of weapons, drugs, or alcohol.
5. After eating or drinking, youth are responsible for cleaning up after themselves.
6. Athletic shoes that cover your entire foot are required at all times (except during water play).
7. Dress should be appropriate and non-offensive. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.
8. Youth are responsible for carrying their possessions (including money). No borrowing money or playing for an exchange of money is allowed. All youth must provide proof-of-purchase when returning with souvenirs.
9. Youth with cell phones will use them appropriately and at the discretion of staff.
10. Youth must contact a staff member during conflict, injury, or if in need of assistance.
11. Youth must stay in continual communication with staff.
12. If given a group meeting time/place, youth must report on time. Youth will be asked to "check-in" frequently with staff if separated.
13. In the event of an emergency, youth must report to the designated meeting location.
14. If youth have any questions or would like to communicate any disagreement, they will do so appropriately and maturely with camp staff or the CNIC POC .
