ONR conducts unmanned vehicle operations

PANAMA CITY, Fla. - The Office of Naval Research (ONR) utilized Naval Surface Warfare Center Panama City's new Littoral Warfare Research Facility (LWRF) as the operations hub Sept. 11-15 for simultaneous testing of several unmanned systems.

"The Port Breakout Scenario is the first large experiment conducted at the LWRF since the building's opening in April of 2006 and it's basically an incremental step in the development of a new capability to counter undersea mines for the U.S. Navy," said Cmdr. Raymond

Robichaud, program officer and experimentation leader for organic mine countermeasures - a representative from Washington DC's Office of Naval Research.



Combined Federal Campaign a true Joint Operation

The 2006 Combined Federal Campaign is underway nationwide. For NSA Panama City and tenant commands here, the official kickoff date was Sept. 20 and the campaign runs through Nov. 1.

Started in 1961, the Combined Federal Campaign has been the nation's largest workplace charity drive and the only philanthropic effort permitted by law in the federal workplace. Since its inception, the CFC has raised more than \$5.5 billion.

In a recent message from President Bush, he stated that the Combined Federal Campaign is an important way for federal employees to join together in support of thousands of worthy charities.



During 2005, the men and women of the U.S. civil service and America's military once again showed their generosity to those less fortunate, largely in response to tragic, natural disasters at home, and challenges to establishing peace and democracy abroad.

Despite the added needs of the past year, the federal

community rallied to provide significant and important aid through the CFC. Federal civilian employees, postal workers and military personnel pledged a record-setting \$268.5 million in 2005 to the CFC.

This represents an \$11 million increase over the \$257 million pledged in 2004. The 4.5 percent

increase in pledges in 2005 is the highest percentage increase since 2001, when pledges jumped 7.3 percent following the terrorist attacks in the United States.

The funds donated through this program will be used to continue reuniting families and friends, providing food and health care, and rebuilding communities, neighborhoods and lives.

Giving through the payroll deduction plan is a simple way to make a difference in the lives of others, and you can designate your gift to any number of local, national and international health and human services organizations.

During this campaign, as in years past, it is our goal that 100% of the military and civilian employees aboard



New Chiefs wear their covers, khakis for 1st time





tems," Bernstein said. "The unmanned systems were used to simultaneously survey the channel entrance to Naval Support Activity-Panama City, a portion of St. Andrews Bay, and an operations area in the Gulf of Mexico." "What we're going to do is called change detection," said Bernstein.

"We will deploy the UUVs, they'll survey the areas of the sea floor we program them to map

and mark all the targets that we find." Bernstein said this process would be repeated a couple times and either additional targets would be added, targets would be positioned differently, or perhaps a combination of both processes would be conducted to test the minehunting capabilities of the UUVs.

Members of the Mine Warfare Command UUV Platoon served as operators,

data analysts and performed all launch and recoveries.

Naming the unmanned systems used, Robichaud said there were three Remote Environmental Monitoring Units (REMUS), two Battlespace Preparation Autonomous Underwater Vehicles (BPAUVs), and one Unmanned Riverine Observation Craft (UROC).

A command and control operations center is located in the

LWRF from which operators monitored progress of the UUVs and also surface activity via the UROC.

"This UROC is not looking for mines, it's providing surveillance of the area, basically live video imagery," said Robichaud.

Bernstein and Robichaud added that the combination of unmanned systems being used was a conceptual exercise, but with further development such a combination

of unmanned systems could be deployed to help secure the country's major harbors where terrorists were likely to target for purposes of disrupting local economies.

"One way to interrupt commerce in a country would be to mine ports, because no one is willing to take the risk of blowing up a ship if there are potential mine threats present," Robichaud said, adding that any combination of air, surface and subsurface

unmanned systems could be used to conduct such security operations.

"Collectively, five unmanned vehicles were operating simultaneously in three different operations areas with real-time vehicle status being received and displayed at the LWRF," Bernstein concluded.
