

**1. INCREASED RECYCLING**

- Utilize Drop-off Recycling Trailers and Facility/Office Bins for Recycling Aluminum, Plastic, Glass, Paper and Cardboard.

**2. INCREASED ENERGY CONSERVATION**

- Thermostat Setting: Highest 70F Winter / Lowest 76F Summer.
