## Mids look for fifth-straight win over Black Knights

On Dec. 2, the United States Naval Academy Midshipmen (8-3) will play host to the United States Military Academy, Black Knights (3-8), for the 107th Army-Navy game at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia.

The Midshipmen will be looking for their fifth consecutive win as they take the field leading the series against Army, 50-49-7. Kickoff is scheduled for the sold-out event at 2:30 p.m. (EST) and the game will be broadcast nationally on CBS.


Coming into the game, the Mids are bringing an average of nine points per game advantage over the Black Knights. Ranked as the number one rushing offense in the NCAA, Navy's rushing leader, Adam Ballard, will look to bring a few special ground-deliveries just in time for the holidays to the Black Knight's end

zone.

Ballard gained 192 of the Midshipmen's total 490 yards rushing during the 106th Army-Navy game, which led the Navy to a 42-23 victory over the Black Knights.

Navy has taken home victories in six of the last seven games against Army. The Mids will be pushing for their fourth-straight Commander in Chief's Trophy and with a win, the Navy senior class will become the first in the United States Naval Academy history to go 8-0 against both Army and Air-Force football teams and bring home a two game lead against the Black Knights to Annapolis.

In addition to the Army-Navy game, the Naval Academy Midshipmen will participate in the Meineke Car Care Bowl on Dec. 30 at the Bank of America in Charlotte. Although the opponent team for the bowl game has yet to be announced, it will be against a team from the ACC and be televised nationally on ESPN.




