

**Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor**

WAUKEGAN, IL-- A World War II bomber that has been sitting at the bottom of Lake Michigan off the Chicago shoreline for more than 60 years was recovered on June 19 and will be headed to its new home at Pacific Aviation Museum (PAM), Pearl Harbor, Hawai'i where it originally flew its WWII missions.

PAM has sponsored the location, recovery, restoration, and eventual display of the World War II Douglas SBD Dauntless dive bomber from the depths of Lake Michigan. According to Ken DeHoff, executive director of Pacific Aviation Museum, "The recovery and restoration efforts will be funded by a donation by Fred L. Turner, honorary chairman and former chief executive officer of McDonald's Corporation in Oak Brook, Ill. Mr. Turner, a friend of our museum, has gener-

ously committed a \$1 million personal gift toward this project."

A Grumman F4F Wildcat that saw duty on Guadalcanal in WWII and later went into Lake Michigan was restored years ago and is already part of the Pacific Aviation Museum's collection at Pearl Harbor.

The museum's future recovery plans include a Gull Wing F4U Corsair that flew out of Guadalcanal and a Grumman F6F Hellcat. "We know that there are other combat-experienced aircraft that have historic Pacific Theater value that are on the floor of Lake Michigan, and we hope we can continue to go through this process," DeHoff said.

The National Naval Aviation Museum, in coordination with the Naval History and Heritage Command, the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency and the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation, completed the

recovery portion of the effort, using a crew from A&T Recovery.

The restored plane will prominently feature the name of U.S. Navy Rear Adm. James D. "Jig Dog" Ramage, who sank a Japanese aircraft carrier with a 500-pound bomb in 1944, earning him the Navy's highest honor, the

Navy Cross, as well as the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal.

"I have the highest respect and admiration for the brave Americans who fought in World War II, and especially for the pilots of the SBD dive bombers," Turner said. "My friend 'Jig Dog' Ramage showed incredible leader-

ship and courage during the war. I'm a history buff, and I consider him to be a hero. This gift is my way of honoring Jig Dog and his fellow pilots, and saying thank you for their service. My hat is off to Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor for its commitment to displaying this restored plane so future generations can learn and reflect on the crucial role of the SBD in the war."

The airplane was lost in Lake Michigan on Feb. 18, 1944. The pilot was Lt. j.g.

John Lendo of Massachusetts. Lendo later went on to serve in the Pacific theatre of operation where he gave the ultimate sacrifice in protecting America's freedom.

The Douglas SBD Dauntless was credited with winning the Battle of Midway and turning the tide of the Pacific war in America's favor. The airplane crashed in Lake Michigan during aircraft carrier qualification training, which was conducted

on Lake Michigan during the early to mid 1940s.

More than 17,000 pilots completed the training including Lt. j.g. George H. Bush, who later became a U.S. president.

The aircraft carriers used for training docked at Navy Pier in Chicago and the airplanes and pilots flew from Glenview Naval Air Station in Glenview, Ill. Prior to the activities on Lake Michigan, this SBD-2 (2173) Dauntless served with the very distinguished Navy aircraft carriers, USS Enterprise (CV-6) and USS Yorktown (CV-5) at Pearl Harbor.

The Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, the state government agency that administers all state and federal historic preservation programs in the state, approved the salvage operation. The agency has jurisdiction over historic resources in Illinois, including those located beneath Illinois territorial waters such as Lake Michigan.

# Plan your pack out, PCS moves back on

The Navy announced June 19 that it will resume issuing permanent change of station (PCS) orders following a three-month delay due to a budget shortfall.

Last April, approximately 14,000 Sailors who were supposed to transfer during the summer had their transfer dates delayed until fiscal year 2010. With the passing of a supplemental request, the Navy received approximately \$89 million needed to fund PCS moves through the end of this fiscal year.

"Navy leadership made PCS funding a priority in discussions with the Congress and earlier this week, Navy's supplemental funding request passed both houses of Congress. Accordingly, Navy Personnel Command has been authorized to resume normal order writing, enabling Sailors and their families to move this summer," said Chief of Naval Personnel Vice Adm. Mark Ferguson.

Sailors who previously negotiated orders, but then had their transfer date put on hold, need to renegotiate orders via Career Management System Interactive Detailing (CMSID) or their detailers. Detailers recorded what Sailors had previously negotiated and will try to honor those commitments, to the maximum extent possible, but Sailors still need to reapply.

During the PCS delay, the Navy issued a limited number of orders for Sailors completing individual augmentees (IA) and GWOT support assignments (GSA)

as well as new accessions, so billets that were available before the PCS delay may no longer be available.

"We want to do what is best for the Sailor. Now that funds are available, they may want to move sooner in order to get their children enrolled in school or they may want to remain at their current duty station until November," said Master Chief Quarter Master (SW/AW) Andy Millar, senior enlisted advisor for

enlisted distribution. Millar and his detailers are committed to working with affected Sailors to minimize the disruption for Sailors and their families.

The current CMSID cycle ended June 24 and the next cycle begins July 9-22. Sailors may log in and view available assignments at <http://www.npc.navy.mil/Enlisted/CMS/>.
