

Naval Station Pearl Harbor revises fuel spill figures

PEARL HARBOR – Navy tests conducted late yesterday now confirm that less than 4,000 gallons of diesel fuel was released into Pearl Harbor as a result of a spill on January 2.

An earlier figure reported yesterday included both water and fuel that was greatly emulsified. Subsequently, the Navy had the oil and water safely transferred to standing barges, where it had the opportunity to settle, and with more sophisticated tests confirmed a more accurate reading of fuel recovered.

The spill is contained and does not present an environmental threat. Residual cleanup is expected to be completed by this weekend.

Commander, Navy Region Hawaii, U.S. Coast Guard and the State of Hawaii continue to work together to monitor, and effectively complete the cleanup.
