COMNAVFORJAPAN INSTRUCTION 5820.17

Subj: PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Ref: (a) SECNAVINST 5300.28D
(b) UCMJ

Encl: (1) List of Prohibited Substances

1. Purpose. Reference (a) establishes policies and procedures for the prevention and control of alcohol and drug abuse within the Department of the Navy. Paragraph 5(c) of reference (a) prohibits the unlawful use of controlled substance analogues (aka designer drugs), natural substances, chemicals, propellants and prescribed or over the counter drugs or pharmaceutical compounds with the intent to induce intoxication, excitement or stupefaction of the central nervous system. The purpose of this instruction is to identify, publish and prohibit the possession, sale, use or distribution of certain substances that fall within the purview of paragraph 5(c) of reference (a).

2. Applicability. This directive is applicable to personnel under the area coordination control of Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Japan, and includes members of the U.S. Navy, civilian component, and family members.

3. Background

a. A trend of abusing legal substances which can produce a psychotropic high has emerged in Japan among the U.S. Naval Forces and accompanying Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) status personnel. This abuse involves substances not currently controlled by the United States but falling within the purview of reference (a).

b. The uncontrolled nature of the substances listed in enclosure (1) makes them accessible and their unregulated and unpredictable nature make it likely that SOFA status personnel who use them will suffer an adverse physical reaction or engage

in some unlawful incident due to impaired judgment. These conditions make it necessary to take steps to ensure the ability to conduct our mission, to avoid incidents which may negatively impact the relationship between Japan and the United States, and to protect the fitness and welfare of all service members and other SOFA status personnel living within the CNFJ AOR.

4. Action

a. Due to the health and safety concerns surrounding the abuse of the substances listed in enclosure (1), the purchase, use, or possession of the listed substances is hereby prohibited by all SOFA status personnel, including members of the U.S. Navy, civilian components, and family members in the CNFJ AOR, whether residing or transiting through the AOR.

b. This instruction is punitive and violations may be punished under reference (b) for military members and/or appropriate administrative action for civilian employees and dependents.

c. This instruction will be updated periodically upon notification of other substances which may be abused to produce a psychotropic "high" when ingested or smoked.
