Programs and Resources for all Phases of IA/GSA Deployment

IA Deployment Readiness Brief

Provides practical strategies to help IA/GSA Sailors and their families navigate these unique deployments.

Individual Sessions

FFSC provides a one-on-one deployment readiness brief for individual IA/GSA and/or their family members who are unable to attend a scheduled brief.

Family Discussion Groups

Meet family members, significant partners of Sailors and recently returned Sailors. Tap into resources and support to manage the challenges that can occur with IA/GSA deployments. Call ahead for free available child care.

Returning from Non-Traditional Deployment (A Return and Reunion Program)

Targets IA/GSA families reuniting with their service members after an extended deployment. Families will receive resources to manage unique challenges of the returning Sailor, such as operational stress.

Individual, Couples, and Child Counseling

FFSC's licensed counselors are available when challenges of change and separation start to become overwhelming.

Spiritual Fitness Division Retreats

FFSC assists Chaplains by providing Spiritual Growth, Personal Growth, Marriage Enrichment and IA Family Enrichment retreats as well as IA Warrior Transition workshop.

IA/GSA Deployment Support Specialists

On site FFSC staff at the Navy Mobilization and Processing Site (NMPS) provides post-deployment processing for all IA/GSA or reserve component sailors. On site FFSC staff is available daily to provide information and referral, deployment/homecoming briefs, and clinical counseling as needed.
