CNE-CNA hosts 'Thanks for Giving' concert

Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Europe-Africa (CNE-CNA) Adm. Samuel J. Locklear III hosted a "Thanks for Giving" concert at Naples' Mostra d'Oltremare Teatro Nov. 19. "Tonight we're going to show our gratitude for those who give throughout the year, we must thank the volunteers from the USO, Navy Marine Corps Relief Society, American Red Cross, participants in our International Charity Bazaar and all those who give their services throughout the year," Locklear said during the opening remarks.

"This is the first ["Thanks for Giving Concert"] I have attended, and all I can think to say is 'thank you,'" said Jessie Moberly, a volunteer from the Navy Marine Corps Relief Society and America Red Cross. "We volunteer because we want to give something back to those who serve and because it feels good to give. It is nice to be recognized and rest assured I will be there again tomorrow ready to help out where ever I am needed."

This year's concert was the fifth annual concert hosted by CNE-CNA and was attended by more than 420 military and civilian guests making it one of the largest concerts performed by CNE Band at this venue to date. The concert lasted two and a half hours and showcased a number of popular American and European songs such as "An American In Paris," "Die Fledermaus" and "Nessun Dorma."

"It is really rewarding to perform for this concert," said musician 3rd Class Jason McDonough, drummer with CNE Band. "We travel a lot, performing throughout Europe and Africa, but this concert is different because we are playing at our home duty station for all the people who have given service to the military—to us. It really is a change to say, 'thanks for giving.'"

In addition a full belly, service members left with a free calling card to help them keep in touch with family and friends this holiday season. "I'm calling my mom on Thanksgiving," said ITSA Donald Johnson, a single sailor from Texas. "I'll be able to talk to everyone."

DoDEA Accelerated Withdrawal Policy

Within the military community, PCS orders may come in the middle of a school year rather than during the summer months. To make this transition smoother for students, the school system provides a process for students to withdraw with credit for the semester after a set number of instructional days have been completed.

To receive semester credit, the student must complete classes and an arranged class work acceleration program and depart no earlier than 20 school days prior to the end of the semester. For the 2010-11 school year, those dates are Dec. 16, 2010 for the first semester and May 19, 2011 for the second semester/end of school year.

For families to take advantage of the Accelerated Withdrawal Program, sponsors must provide the school administration verification of their official orders and request acceleration. This program is not intended to accommodate family trips or visits or other discretionary travel. Bus schedule revised to ease parking at Capo

Construction of a 300 KW solar photovoltaic system on the roof of the west (front gate) parking garage at Capo will begin Dec. 6 and will run for approximately nine months. During this time, there will be no parking available on the roof and long term parking will be available in the basement level (BL2) of the garage.

In order to alleviate the impacts to the parking on base, two additional bus runs will be added from Support Site to Capo in the morning and two additional bus runs will be added from Capo to Support Site in the evening. These additional runs are temporary, but will remain in effect until the work is complete. The new bus schedule, which goes into effect Dec. 6, is posted at all bus stops and will be available in hard copy Nov. 29.

This project will install a new solar panel system that will use the sun's energy to generate approximately 390 MWh per year of energy at no cost to the Navy. This exciting project will help the Navy to meet the goals of the Energy Policy Act of 2005 and has the dual benefits of decreasing our impact to the environment while saving electricity costs paid to the ENEL power company by the Navy.

Thank you for your patience as we experience growing pains on base.

Italian News Briefs

EU inspectors criticize Campania's garbage situation

European Union inspectors arrived in Naples Monday to check the garbage situation. The head of the European Commission's Civil Protection Pia Bucella said the situation is as bad as the one in 2008 when thousands of tons of uncollected garbage piled up for months. She condemned the city government for having no action plan for recycling and disposal. The EU funds of €150 million (\$199 million) would be frozen until a proper plan is implemented. In March, the European Court of Justice ruled Italy was to blame for the 2008 crisis and ordered the Campania government to adopt effective garbage management measures, such as opening new dumps and starting a recycling system in the city of Naples. Italy will risk paying millions of Euros in fines if Campania's regional government doesn't do enough to implement the March ruling. Last week, the government pledged €150 million and said it would speed up the construction of incinerators in Campania.

Police arrest academic and businessmen in alleged chemical research scam

A university lecturer in chemical engineering and several businessmen were arrested in Cosenza, in the Calabria region, and accused of fraud and other offenses. They allegedly received €31 million for chemical research projects to boost employment and training in that region, but the projects were never carried out. Several other academics and consultants are under investigation by the Italian tax police.

Rome's Trevi Fountain Square to get facelift

The square where the Trevi Fountain is located in Rome is going to get a €1 million facelift. The project will reset the cobblestones around the fountain and eliminate sidewalks to make access roads wider. The timetable for the work still needs to be worked out with residents and retailers. At the same time, the roads around Piazza San Silvestro, close to the fountain, will be repaved,

new lamp posts installed and the lighting of the square's main building will be redone. The square will become a traffic-free area. In the piazza, there is a church which is said to display the head of St. John the Baptist.

Italy's theaters and cinemas close in budget cuts protest

On Monday, cinemas and theaters were closed as the Italian entertainment industry protested against proposed cuts to the government's culture budget. Actors, directors and producers staged a protest in fear that tax credits aimed at boosting cinema production will not be renewed. U.S. productions were able to film in Italy thanks to the tax credit. In 2008, the Italian government financed the cultural fund with €450 million, and in 2011, it plans to reduce the budget to €262 million.

Amazon Italy launched

The online retail giant Amazon arrived in Italy Tuesday. Previously, clients in Italy wanting to buy products via Amazon had to use one of its sites for another country, which usually meant extra delivery costs. The company is confident its arrival in Italy will be a success. According to Diego Piacentini, Amazon's senior vice president of international retail, in a few months all the categories available in the United States will be available in Italy. At the moment, Amazon's Italian site does not allow people to buy and sell used goods.

'Gomorra' to become TV drama

The film "Gomorra" based on Roberto Saviano's bestselling book about the Naples Camorra mafia will become a TV mini-series. The shooting will start in about a year, the producers said. The TV adaptation of the 2006 book will run for 12 episodes and Saviano, who lives under 24-hour police protection after Camorra death threats, will be a supervisor on the project. Screenwriters will include material that was not included in the movie.



Fit Zone pool offers solution to stay fit this winter

For service members and their families stationed in the Naples area, staying in shape during this time of the year has taken on the extra challenge of dealing with cold, windy and rainy weather. The indoor swimming pool, located on Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples Capodichino at the Fit Zone, provides fitness seekers an alternative to exercising outdoors as winter begins to settle into southern Italy.

"We offer lap swim everyday and water aerobics twice a week," said Eliana Caffarelli, lifeguard and recreational assistant at the Fit Zone's indoor pool. "The benefits are improved flexibility, better cardio performance, and it helps burn calories."

Water aerobics, also known as aquatics, is one of the best low impact fitness activities, according to the Navy and Marine Corps Public Health Center. Because the buoyancy of water reduces a person's

weight by nearly 90 percent, the stress on weight-bearing joints, bones and muscles is similarly reduced. This makes aquatics a safe choice for elderly or overweight people and individuals either suffering from arthritis or recovering from injuries. It's also safe for pregnant women.

"I've been swimming since I was very little. It is a lifelong sport that is great for conditioning, great for triathletes, great for cross training and conditioning, as well as preventing injuries," said Elizabeth Lyn Barr, a frequent lap swimmer at the pool. "I was able to swim throughout both of my pregnancies, and then afterwards right away."

Swimming is a great way to develop both strength and cardiovascular fitness, according to the American Council on Exercise. In water aerobics, the water itself provides the resistance instead of weights. Handheld paddles can increase resistance to provide a more intense workout.

Not only does swimming provide a total body workout, it also benefits the total person. "The pool is great; it's got a lot of glass windows so you kind of feel like your swimming outside," said Barr. "It also has pool buoys, fins, paddles, kick boards all here for you to use them. There's a hot tub for once you're done swimming, and since the gym provides towels, all you need is your swim suit, your cap and goggles, and you're ready to go."

The Fit Zone pool is open from 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays and 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Sundays. For more information, call 081-568-4254 or visit <https://www.cnic.navy.mil/Naples/Recreation/Aquatics/index.htm>.





Obtaining your Sojourner Permit

Italian law requires all foreign personnel working or living within Italy, other than an active duty member under military orders, to obtain a Sojourner Permit within eight days of arrival in Italy. This is different from a visa, which is merely an approval for entry into the country.

All applicants over 14 years of age must apply in person, as each person's signature is required at the time of application.

NATIONALS OF ANY STATE OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY COMING TO ITALY DO NOT REQUIRE ANY VISA OR SOJOURNER PERMIT.

As part of the Area Orientation process, the U.S. Region Legal Service Office (RLSO EURAFSWA) assists in the preparation and oversees the acquisition of the Sojourner Permit for all personnel attached to U.S. Navy commands in the Naples area. Army and Air Force personnel stationed at JFC must apply through the Carabinieri at the JFC Provost Marshall's Office, Building L.
