Pre-separation Counseling

During pre-separation counseling, you will learn about your benefits, rights, and services that are available. You will be introduced to the DD Form 2648, "Pre-separation Counseling Checklist" and assisted in its completion. The checklist helps you identify your needs and develop an individual transition plan for securing the assistance to meet those needs. The DDFM 2648 must be completed and signed prior to attending TAP/ETAP class.

TAP/ETAP Seminar

A week-long seminar for pre-retirement or pre-separation military members. Seminar includes learning about job search, career decision making, current occupational and labor market conditions, resume and cover letter preparation, dressing for success, interviewing techniques, and veterans benefits. Spouses are welcomed to attend.

DTAP Workshop

DTAP is a 2-hour briefing sponsored by the Department of Veteran Affairs, in conjunction with the Department of Defense. It may be offered following a VA Benefits Briefing or separately. You should receive information on DTAP if you have, or think you have a service-connected disability or an injury or illness that was aggravated by service. DTAP provides you with specialized information about the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E) Program, eligibility, and how to apply for benefits. Sailors must have 18-24 months remaining on the enlistment. Workshop graduates may apply for college credits at the University of Colorado. Interested personnel should contact their career counselor.

Additional Transition Services

The Transition Assistance office provides additional employment assistance and resources to include one-on-one counseling and group classes to include job search process, resume and cover letter writing, federal job applications, and preparing for interviews. Additionally, every Center has a career resource center available with a resource library and self-help computers.
