

ARRIVE ALIVE PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Arrive Alive Program was implemented in an effort to reduce the number of active duty DUI arrests and alcohol-related incidents within NRSW.

The Arrive Alive program has experienced tremendous growth since its FY 2008 inception.

The Arrive Alive card is not intended as a means to allow access to free taxi rides. The program is intended to be used as a **last resort** and provides a safe means of transport for those service members **who have driven their vehicles** and are now faced with the decision to drive while impaired. It is to be utilized after all other means of planned transportation have been exhausted.

Each command must designate an **E-7 or above** as the primary POC/manager in order to participate in the CNRSW Arrive Alive program.

Each participating command must maintain and submit a detailed Arrive Alive Issuance log every month to: trafficsafety@navy.mil

Only active duty U.S. NAVY personnel are authorized to use the Arrive Alive card.

ARRIVE ALIVE PROGRAM Q&A

Q. Where can Arrive Alive cards be obtained?

A. Arrive Alive cards can be obtained at the Broadway Complex CNRSW Safety Office Distribution Center, 937 North Harbor Drive, Bldg 1, 5th floor, room 550.

Q. When can the Arrive Alive cards be utilized?

A. When a service member has driven their vehicle to local establishments and are faced with the decision to drive while impaired, after having exhausted all other means of safe transportation.

Q. Which cab companies are authorized to accept the Arrive Alive card?

A. Yellow Cab Company of San Diego/Coronado is the only company authorized to accept the Arrive Alive card.

Q. What do service members do if they have lost their Arrive Alive card?

A. Contact their command POC and receive a new Arrive Alive card.

Q. Do service members need to turn-in their Arrive Alive card when transferring or separating from the Navy?

A. Yes. Each Arrive Alive card is tracked by the command POC.

Q. Can any other armed forces service member (Air force/Army/Marines) utilize the Arrive Alive cards?

A. No. Students, midshipmen, and reservists that are assigned to commands for less than ninety days are not authorized to use the 511/Arrive Alive card.

ARRIVE ALIVE MESSAGE

❖ This document contains the Commander Navy Region Southwest (CNRSW) Arrive Alive program administrative and operational policies.

ARRIVE ALIVE CARD DISTRIBUTION FORM

❖ This document is to be utilized in obtaining new and replacement 511 Arrive Alive cards. Command Arrive POC's will need to bring a typed and signed distribution form to the CNRSW Safety Office.

ARRIVE ALIVE ISSUANCE LOG FILE

❖ This document is required by commands that participate in the CNRSW 511 Arrive Alive Program; It is also a tool for tracking and establishing accountability of cards issued to each service member.

❖ Participating commands must submit their issuance log file between the 1st and the 8th of each month to trafficsafety@navy.mil.

❖ This document outlines personal responsibilities and understanding of the Arrive Alive program policies that each sailor must adhere to prior to receiving a 511 Arrive Alive card. Command POC's may also utilize this signed document as a page 13 or training jacket record entry.
