# Mass casualty exercise puts training to the test

Each year as part of the Navy's annual nationwide installation exercise known as Solid Curtain/Citadel Shield, Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport plans and executes a local scenario that tests its ability to react to various unforeseen events.

This year's training took place mainly at Naval Health Clinic New England (NHCNE) Newport. The scenario "play" began on Monday with the discovery of a flyer on the NHCNE executive officer's windshield stating that an extremist group would be using Tuesday, March 20, as a day for worldwide protest. This, along with a report of a petty officer taking photographs of the NHCNE gate, all triggered a heightened level of vigilance at the compound.

On Tuesday morning, shortly after 8:45, a Navy petty officer entered the clinic brandishing a handgun and opened fire in the hallways outside the command suite area. This act called for emergency procedures to be implemented within the clinic; security to respond to the calls for assistance and neutralize the "shooter"; and ultimately for the injured to be removed from the clinic, provided emergency first aid and transported to Newport Hospital where they were "admitted" for care.

Emergency procedures were implemented throughout the installation which resulted in the closing of all gates leading on and off NAVSTA for a brief period of time. The NHCNE gates remained closed until after the "shooter" was neutralized.

Aiding in the response were Fire Departments from Newport, Middletown and Portsmouth. "These training exercises are excellent opportunities for us to test our emergency procedures with our partners outside the gates," said Tim Kerrigan, NAVSTA Newport fire chief. These training scenarios are well planned and communicated up through the leadership channels. The emphasis is always on the safety of the personnel involved.

Communication regarding the exercise taking place was published well in advance, displayed on posters throughout the clinic area and a gen-

eral announcement was made shortly before 8:45 a.m. so that any guests in the clinic would understand what was about to take place.

Assisting in the exercise were eight Marines awaiting their course at Marine Corps Detachment Newport who played the wounded and were fully made up to appear realistic. A Navy petty officer had the unfortunate task of being the "shooter," and five CPR training "dummies" were positioned within the clinic and evacuated as if they were actual casualties.

Once the "shooter" was neutralized, the casualties were removed from the clinic and began being triaged and evacuated to Newport Hospital.

At around 10 a.m., another threat was discovered in an abandoned vehicle near the NHCNE utility plant. A suspicious-looking device affixed to the rear of the car triggered calls to security that ultimately led to Explosive Ordnance Disposal Mobile Unit 12 (EODMU12) being called onto the scene to investigate. EODMU12, a tenant command of Naval Station

Newport, has the real world mission of identifying, rendering safe and disposing of all hazardous explosive ordnance items for all DoD installations in the New England area.

The unit took part in the training in order to test out a newly-acquired piece of equipment and further added to the quality of the training held.

"This was by far the most complicated scenario we have worked through," said John Bozeman, installation training officer for NAVSTA.

Bozeman was on scene evaluating the training and monitoring the communication that was taking place between the incident command team at NHCNE and the Emergency Operations Center for NAVSTA.

"Testing our communication procedures during the midst of an emergency is one of the greatest benefits of holding these exercises," said Cmdr. H. P. Pierce, NAVSTA Newport's executive officer.

## Canadian air cadets explore R.I. military

Forty-eight Royal Canadian Air Cadets left Naval Station Newport last week following a three-day visit that included orientations at the Surface Warfare Officers School, a visit to the Naval War College, and a facility tour at the 143d Airlift Wing, Rhode Island Air National Guard, at Quonset Point.

The cadets and their adult chaperones were from the 172nd Clarington Squadron, Bowmanville, Ontario, and were traveling to the southern New Eng-

land region over their spring vacation.

The squadron, an aviation based training organization, for Canadian youth age 12 to 19, is sponsored and operated by the Air Cadet League and Canada's Department of National Defense.

# Author reexamines criticisms of Bush

A book authored by Naval War College Professor Stephen Knott that critically examines the presidency of George W. Bush was published earlier this month.

Knott said his book, *Rush to Judgment: George W. Bush, The War on Terror, and His Critics*, offers readers not only a perspective on the extent and use of executive power, but also a hard look at the misuse of scholarship in examining a presidency for partisan political purposes.

"I've been interested in the American presidency for much of his life," said Knott. "But while I have my

differences of opinion regarding a number of issues from the Bush presidency, it struck me that much of the academic criticism of Bush's actions during the War on Terror was driven by ideology."

Knott chose to write about Bush because he felt that much of the prejudice directed toward the 43rd president came from historians, law professors, and political scientists.

Knott said there was a rush to consign Bush to the ash heap of history. He acknowledges the former president made mistakes but hopes his book will help acknowledge the faithful manner Bush handled national security issues following Sept. 11, 2001, in contrast to those confronted by his presidential predecessors.


body paint. Police kept a close eye on the crowds, estimated as one of the largest in recent history.

## Public Works employees have input for job safety

While safety is everyone's responsibility in the workplace, NAVFAC/Public Works employees at Naval Station Newport are taking a more active role to identify potential hazards through the Employee Driven Safety Committee (EDSC).

The EDSC, a component of the NAVFAC-Mid Atlantic (MIDLANT) safety committee structure, increases employee involvement to promote a safe working environment that ultimately improves the command's safety culture.

NAVFAC-MIDLANT Instruction 5103.1, 26 Jul 11, requires each public works department to have an EDSC program where employees take an active approach to work with management to promote and improve safety on and off duty.

"Because of the types of trades that we have, we are more susceptible to safety injuries," said Steve White, Base Services, Vehicles and Equipment (BSV&E) Maintenance Section.

In addition to electricians, plumbers, and carpenters, NAVFAC/Public Works has other trades occupations in transportation, maintenance, crane and rigging, pest control, chemical and HVAC.

"Our objective is to prevent injuries and lost work days, reduce safety violations, and enhance personal safety," said White, EDSC chairperson.

Other EDSC members include David Gregoire, vice chairperson, facilities-emergency services; Rui Rego, secretary, transportation-rigging; Brian Simmons, treasurer, plans and estimates; David Sawicki, educator, boiler plant engineer; Carl Benson, timekeeper, facilities-project shop; John St. Laurent, union representative, boiler plant; Deborah Moore, member, environmental; Chester Turner, member, cranes; and Richard Williams, member, utilities-water treatment.

The committee represents all sections in the public works department. Safety issues that arise are presented to the committee that meets bi-weekly.

"We're concerned about the overall well-being of the employees who work here as well as those who visit our facilities," said White.

A recent safety issue presented to the committee involved an increase in reports

## Failed 'French connection' to aid colonists examined

Christian McBurney, author of *The Rhode Island Campaign: The First French and American Operation in the Revolutionary War*, was the guest speaker at the Eight Bells lecture held at the Naval War College Museum last week.

McBurney discussed one of the most complex and multi-faceted events of the war — one which combined land and sea strategies and featured controversial decisions on both sides.

The cast of characters is made up of many prominent patriots, including George Washington, Nathanael Greene, Marquis de Lafayette, and Gen. John Sullivan, among others.

While the campaign's failure led to harsh criticism of the French in some quarters, primarily from Sulli-

van and others in the Boston area, leaders such as Greene, Lafayette and Washington steadfastly worked to ensure that the alliance would remain intact, knowing that the next joint operation could well succeed.

During the course of the Revolutionary War, Newport was an occupied city, first by the British until 1779 and then the French who remained in town until the end of the war in 1783.

After being forced out of Boston, the British moved down the coast to Rhode Island, establishing Newport as the main operating base. From there raids were conducted in the Narragansett Bay area against the towns of Bristol, Warren and Fall River, to name a few.

It was the intent of the colonists under Gen. Sullivan to drive the British from Aquidneck Island and

force them farther south. To do this, he needed the aid of the French fleet under Vice Adm. Charles Henri Théodat, Comte d'Estaing, Commander of French forces in North America.

For a variety of reasons, the campaign failed and McBurney gives a good accounting to the reasons and personalities that contributed to that failure.


The Naval War College Museum has an exhibit on the French in Newport that offers an overview of this campaign and the French involvement in Rhode Island.

of on-base joggers not being seen because they were not wearing appropriate safety reflective gear at sunrise and sunset. Reflective vests and belts are available at the Navy Exchange and Clothing Sales store.

Some NAVFAC/Public Works employees work in areas having high noise levels and confined spaces.

A recent NAVFAC/Public Works, Newport, safety initiative is the use of the Deckmate ladder system. The lightweight portable Deckmate ladder attaches to flatbed trucks and provides practical access to heavy loads. A unique hinge design prevents pinching fingers and clothes.

"The stow-away handle allows our employees to climb aboard a flatbed trailer using a three-point contact climbing technique that is essential for safety," White said. When climbing or descending a ladder both feet and one hand or two hands and a foot are in contact with the ladder.

"Climbing a ladder is a safety hazard, but not maintaining three points of contact is a safety violation," White said.
