## 'Year of the Chief' kicks off

The United States Navy Memorial hosted the official kick-off of the Year of the Chief and the 119th birthday celebration of the chief petty officer during a ceremony last month.

For the first time in history, the Navy Memorial is casting a spotlight on the history, heritage and contributions of chief petty officers.

The guest speaker for the event was Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. Jonathan W. Greenert. Remarks were also given by both Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy (MCPON) (SS/SW) Rick D. West and former MCPON James L. Herdt. Former MCPON Duane R. Bushey was also in attendance.

"The chief is the center of gravity," said Greenert. "There is not a seaman, petty officer or officer out there who cannot turn and say, 'I had a chief petty officer take care of me and get me where I am today.'"

The ceremony was attended by chiefs from across the nation who came not only to be a part of the official kick-off, but also to see the Memorial transformed into a Chiefs' Mess, resplendent with history and memorabilia spanning 119 years.

"We are becoming a part of history today," said West. "I see retired veterans in our midst and I am proud to carry on down a path they've laid for us so long ago. I couldn't be more pleased to be spending this day with representatives from so many commands. To stand in front of a sea of fouled anchors as your MCPON, and know that we are as much making history as we are a part of it ... I am truly humbled."

After the ceremony, guests were invited into the Memorial for the cake cutting. Visitors were then encouraged to walk through the Memorial, which has been decorated to reflect historical uniforms, anchors and oth-

## 'Sex Signals' interactive play presented with goal to empower personnel, prevent sexual assault

Fleet and Family Support Center presented "Sex Signals," as part of National Sexual Assault Awareness Month. It is an interactive play that uses humor and audience participation to empower personnel with knowledge that they can use to help prevent sexual assault.

"The truth of sexual assault is that you could be sitting next to someone who was assaulted and not even know it because they didn't report it," said Cmdr. Scott Wilmot, NAS Kingsville executive officer, to the military and civilian personnel gathered at the Captain's Club April 27, to watch the interactive play.

The duo in the show acted out various scenarios for the audience including situations that Sailors may be familiar with, for

example, partying at a bar or a get-together in on-base living quarters. The actors portrayed gender stereotypes, acted out social pressures, discussed unrealistic fantasies and participated with the audience in discussion about each scenario.

"The end of April does not mark the end of our effort to raise sexual assault awareness," said Vice Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Mark Ferguson. "We must build upon the momentum we have generated this month and move forward together, as one team, to develop a resilient and ready force that is intolerant of sexual assault."

The Navy is executing a multi-faceted approach to awareness, prevention, victim response, and offender accountability and the April awareness month was only the

first phase of a larger, focused initiative to help foster command climates where reporting sexual assault is embraced, according to Ferguson.

There were 610 reports of sexual assault last year in the Navy according to the fiscal year 2011 report on sexual assault that was released recently. The report also states that one in six women have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime. Typically, two sexual assaults are reported each day fleetwide and many more go unreported. In addition, 65 percent of the FY10 sexual assaults were service member on service member.

## Navy increases opportunities for non-rated Sailors to strike

Navy has expanded rating designation opportunities for Professional Apprentice Career Track (PACT) Sailors, the non-designated workforce in the fleet, officials said April 20.

“Currently the Navy has a healthy complement of PACT Sailors supporting the Fleet - more than 7,800 - and we plan to bring in about 4,700 more PACT Sailors this fiscal year alone,” said Cmdr. Renee Squier, deputy director of Navy Enlisted Force Plans & Policy. “This will mean increased opportunities and a shorter timeline for PACT Sailors to strike into ratings - currently, we’re aiming to designate nearly 4,000 PACT Sailors in the next 9 months.”

According to Capt. Hank Roux, head enlisted community manager, Bureau of Naval Personnel, PACT Sailors and their commands should be taking a proactive approach in researching Sailors’ options for designation.

“Career counselors and career development teams should use the Rating Entry for General Apprentices (REGA) module in the Fleet Ride career tool to determine which ratings their PACT Sailors qualify,” said Roux.

There are several methods commands may use to get PACT Sailors designated in REGA: direct rating entry designation, Navy Wide Advancement Exams requests and A-school requests.

“Direct rating entry designation is the method with the most immediate impact on rated apprentice manning,” said Roux. “When direct designation is approved in REGA, the Sailor’s permanent record and command manning documents are automatically updated to reflect the rated status.”

Many rating entry designation quotas are available and do not require an A-school.

Minimum requirements for commands to direct designate a PACT Sailor are:

- Meets qualification standards for desired rate.
- Minimum 12 months on board perma-

# NAS Kingsville's command master chief retires, leaves legacy of Sailors

CMDCM(AW/SW/FMF) Charlie Ratliff retired with 30 years service during a traditional ceremony held at the Captain's Club. The Fort Worth, Texas, native joined the Navy in July 1982. He completed Recruit Training and graduated from Hospital Corps "A" School at Naval Station Great Lakes, Ill, and then served six tours as a corpsman and independent duty corpsman prior to serving as a command master chief for the past 12 years.

"I have worked with many Sailors in whom I recognized tremendous potential," Ratliff said. "Sailors who I just knew were going to do great things in their careers. And, I did my best to challenge each of these Sailors to succeed."

HMCS(FMF/SW) Lee Thomason, the keynote speaker, is one Sailor who has been shaped so much so by Ratliff that he also wants to become a command master chief and be able to have the same impact on Sailors that Ratliff had on him.

"He challenged me every time our paths crossed," Thomason said of Ratliff. "He is in a league of his own when it comes to inspiring Sailors to reach their maximum potential."

The guidance he has given Sailors throughout his career will be remembered by the Sailors he showed concern for and inspired to reach their maximum potential.

## Baker retires from civil service after 30 years at NAS Kingsville Security Department

Her cheerful greeting and inviting smile have greeted thousands of customers at the air station Pass and Tag office, from guests of the command to contractor employees, to military spouses and retirees, to newly arriving personnel. From her small work center in the back corner of the Security building, Baker has served as a quiet ambassador for every command and activity aboard the air station.

"I've always enjoyed meeting people and helping them as best I can," Baker said on her final work day, Monday, April 30. "I couldn't even begin to guess the number of people who have come through Pass and Tag over the years – but I know it's a lot."

Baker and her husband Lloyd, who worked at the Naval Facilities Engineering Command aboard the air station, came to Kingsville in the early 1980s when Lloyd, a Navy Seabee, transferred to Kingsville. Baker got a job with the security department's pass and tag office, and has been there ever since. When Lloyd's tour of duty at NAS Kingsville was completed, he retired from active duty.

Together, they raised four children (including three from Lloyd's first marriage) and have watched them each grow-up, mature, and move on to start their own lives. They have maintained a close relationship with each, and plan to visit them often. But

Francis isn't ready to retire completely.

"No," she replied quickly to that question. "I can't see myself not doing anything. I'm thinking about learning something new – and maybe working as a court recorder. I've always been interested in that, and I might look into it. But right now, I'm just thinking about taking some time off and saying goodbye to all my friends on the base."

The Bakers recently became grandparents for the fourth time and one of the first things on their "to do" list post-retirement, is to travel to San Antonio in mid-May to visit their daughter and their 8-month old grandson. It will be a dual celebration for the family.

"I can't wait to see the baby again," Francis said with a sparkle in her eyes, "but I'm also excited about seeing my daughter Darcy receive her doctorate degree in education, something she's worked very hard to achieve. We are very proud of what she has accomplished, and, of course, we just love our grandson."

Looking back at her career on board the air station, Baker said she still can't believe that her retirement day has arrived.

"You know," she said, "30 years is a long time. I've seen a lot of changes on the base during my time here, and a lot of people come and go. I've also made a lot of

dear friends that I will never forget. I know I will miss dealing with customers because it was what I liked best about my job, but I also know that there is something more out there for me ... and I'm ready for that."

## NAS Kingsville Air Boss closes active duty career in grand style

When Lt. Cmdr. David Anderson left his home in Granite Falls, Minn., for the Naval Academy in 1988, he had visions of playing football at the highest levels and a dream of flying jet aircraft. By the time he graduated from the academy in 1992 with a degree in political science, he was on his way to fulfilling both.

Anderson played two years on the Naval Academy football team as a tight end – and was part of two Navy teams that beat Army in the annual Army-Navy classic.

"Participating in the Army-Navy game and winning both years was the highlight of my football career in college," Anderson said recently. "Playing on a national stage in such a historic game, was something I'll never forget."

Three years after graduation, Anderson began a career in Naval Aviation, a career that included four assignments at NAS Kingsville – one as a student, two as an instructor pilot, and another as Air Boss and Air Show coordinator for the host command.

Anderson's retirement ceremony was

held on Monday, April 16, at the NAS Kingsville Captain's Club -- a day after the 2012 Wings Over South Texas air show concluded -- and a show that he directed. An estimated 120,000 people visited the base for the 2012 air show, making it the most-attended air show ever held in Kingsville.

"Looking back," Anderson told more than 200 people attending the retirement ceremony, "I wouldn't recommend planning an air show leading up to your retirement. I've learned that the hard way. There just weren't enough hours in the day, but somehow, as a team, we got through it."

Capt.-select Matthew McLaurin, commanding officer, Defense Contract Management Agency Japan at Naval Air Facility Atsugi, served as guest speaker for the retirement ceremony. McLaurin was Anderson's roommate at the Naval Academy, and the two men have remained close friends over the years.

Pastor Bil Cornelius, founder of the South Texas Bay Area Fellowship, provided the invocation and benediction.

NAS Kingsville Commanding Officer Capt. Mark McLaughlin presented Anderson with a Meritorious Service Medal during the ceremony, along with congratulatory letters from the surviving U.S. presidents Anderson served during his career, the Governors of Texas and Minnesota, and a host of others. nent duty station

Working with their chain of command, PACT Sailors can learn more about rating opportunities in REGA. The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) score is a key indicator in determining which rate a Sailor qualifies. Academic skills development and Armed Forces Classification Testing (AFCT) should be encouraged and scheduled well in advance to enable PACT Sailors to maximize their career options.

"Leaders need to ensure these Sailors are on track to get designated in a rating four to six months prior to their two-year anniversary on board," said Roux. "The program is focused on the two-way commitment be-

tween the Sailor and Navy."

The PACT program consists of three apprentice tracks; aviation, engineering and surface. PACT Sailors enlist for an initial four year active service obligation, receive initial apprenticeship training for their track and fill apprentice level billets in the fleet.

Upon arrival at their first permanent duty station, commands conduct rating eligibility screening and develop a career progression plan during the PACT Sailor's career development board to identify on the job training that leads to a viable career field within two years on board.




