

PPE & Requirements

NOTE: 1

- Operators shall be prepared to operate/ride their motorcycle/scooter on all training days and must have the following in their possession at all times while operating either on or off base:

- Valid motorcycle/operators license/permit.


- Motorcycle completion card (Good for three years, after three years a refresher course must be taken).

NOTE: 2

The following protective equipment must be worn at all times by all operators and passengers of motorcycle/scooter: NAVBASEGUAMINST 5560.2C.

1. Long sturdy pants and brightly colored shirt/outer upper garment during daytime. (**sleeves rolled down to wrist**) Military uniforms do not meet this requirement.
2. Over the ankle (**sturdy boots**) footwear (**no athletic shoes**).
3. Full-fingered motorcycle gloves.
4. Department of transportation (DOT)/SNELL Memorial Foundation approved Helmet.
5. Reflective outer upper garment/vest shall be clearly visible and **not** covered (**night time**).
6. Shatter proof goggles or helmet visor in down position while in motion.
7. Passengers are only permitted with licensed operators.

All students must provide their own PPE

MOTORCYCLE CLASS INFORMATION

BRC: Basic Riders Course – 2 day course, 1 Day classroom, 1 day range (13 or more students additional range day)

Initial training - Beginner Class

ERC: Experienced Rider Course (1 day)

Advanced/refresher course offered for standard bikes and scooters.

MSRC: Military Sport bike Rider Course (1 day)

A mandatory advanced course for sport bike riders to include: Enduros and Motards which are dirt bikes that can be ridden on the road with lights (signals), and street tires.

ATV: all terrain vehicle safety training (1 Day)

Offered to military commands in performance of their military duties.

Motorcycle simulator training: Honda SMARTrainer

This course is designed for anyone who wants to learn to ride a motorcycle/scooter and provides perspective new riders with roadway experiences and control familiarization.

Locations:

1 simulator at AAFB

3 simulators at Bldg. 4175 (Santa Rita Office Complex)

Installation safety offers:

*4 loaner bikes (First Come, First Serve)

1 standard (250 cc) 1 sport bike (250 cc)

1 motard (250 cc) 1 scooter (250 cc)

NOTE:

*If the BRC is completed on a loaner 500cc or less and the course graduate plans on operating a motorcycle greater than 500cc, the ERC or MSRC, as appropriate, shall be taken on the privately owned motorcycle as soon as possible after completion of the BRC no later than 60 days after completion of the BRC.

INSTALLATION SAFETY MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

Buying the right motorcycle:

A motorcycle should be selected for a comfortable fit and for functional requirements.

- Select a motorcycle that fits. A motorcyclist should be able to touch the ground with both feet when astride the vehicle.
- If you will be carrying a passenger, make sure the motorcycle you select has a passenger seat as well as footrests (foot pegs) for the passenger.
- Check the location of the controls. Make sure you can reach and operate them easily and comfortably.
- Buy the power you need, but only as much as you can handle safely. Consider the primary use of your bike.

After you buy, but before you ride:

The safe operation of a motorcycle requires different skill and knowledge that is needed for a passenger car.

- Never ride without a certified motorcycle helmet and eye protection. Insist on a helmet that has a U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT)/SNELL Memorial Foundation label.
- Read your owner's manual thoroughly, and familiarize yourself with your motorcycle.
- Attend a motorcycle rider-training course. This is the best way to learn how to operate a motorcycle safely and skillfully. Rider training classes provide unique knowledge and skills that you may not learn if a friend teaches you how to ride.

•Wear the required PPE. Thick, protective clothing not only provides comfort against the elements, but it may be all there is between you and the pavement in a crash.

Follow these rules:

- Treat other motorists with courtesy and respect.
- Avoid tailgating.
- Avoid riding between lanes of slow moving or stopped traffic.
- Know and obey traffic laws.
- Use signals when changing direction.
- Never drink and ride. Alcohol slows reflexes and greatly limits your ability to operate a motorcycle. Even a very small amount of alcohol can reduce your ability to operate a motorcycle safely.

1. ANY TWO WHEEL MOTORIZED VEHICLE, DESIGNED FOR ON-ROAD USE, THAT THE STATE, TERRITORY OR HOST NATION REQUIRES TO BE REGISTERED AND/OR REQUIRES THE OPERATOR TO OBTAIN A SPECIFIC LICENSE ENDORSEMENT TO OPERATE, ARE CONSIDERED MOTORCYCLES. ALL MOTORCYCLE TRAINING AND PPE REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED IN REF A APPLY.
2. ANY TWO WHEEL MOTORIZED VEHICLE WITH A SEAT HEIGHT LESS THAN 22 INCHES, OR WITHOUT A SEAT (I.E. SEGWAYS), MOTORIZED SKATEBOARDS, MINI SCOOTERS WITH OR WITHOUT A SEAT AND DIRT BIKES, DESIGNED SOLELY FOR OFF-ROAD USE, MAY NOT BE OPERATED ON NAVY INSTALLATION ROADWAYS. INSTALLATION COMMANDING OFFICERS MAY AUTHORIZE OPERATION OF THESE VEHICLES IN DESIGNATED AREAS. PROPER PPE AS DETERMINED BY THE INSTALLATION COMMANDING OFFICER MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.
