

Assistant Secretary of the Navy is special guest as Kingsville Navy Ball salutes Navy's 237th birthday

More than 200 shipmates and guests turned out for the annual Navy Birthday Ball at the NAS Kingsville Captain's Club on Saturday, Oct. 13. The event not only celebrated the Navy's 237th birthday, but also the 70th anniversary of the commissioning of NAS Kingsville. Asst. Secretary of the Navy (Manpower and Reserve Affairs) the Honorable Juan M. Garcia III was the guest speaker.

"We are honored to have Secretary Garcia here with us this evening to help us celebrate the Navy's birthday and the 70th anniversary of our commissioning," said NAS Kingsville Commanding Officer Capt. Mark McLaughlin. "He's a native of South Texas, a former Texas state representative and a fellow Naval Aviator, and I'm extremely pleased that he was able to get NAS Kingsville on his busy

schedule to be with us here tonight."

Garcia, who was nominated for his position as Asst. Secretary of the Navy (M&RA) by President Barack Obama in 2009, has been extremely busy during his three years in office promoting Navy and Marine Corps programs that benefit not only the active duty Sailor and Marine, but also spouses, family members, retirees and their families, and Navy and Marine Corps Reservists. His latest program, the 21st Century Sailor and Marine Initiative, combines a set of new and existing objectives and policies, in an effort to maximize Sailor and Marine readiness. It's divided into five different categories; readiness, safety, physical fitness, inclusion, and continuum of service. The initiative seeks to ensure all Sailors and Marines are mentally and physically sound, while providing the awareness, skills and support needed to excel long after they've hung up their uniform.

During his remarks at the Navy Ball, Garcia spoke briefly about the program and what the Navy hopes to benefit from it.

"It has never been harder to become a U.S. Sailor or Marine, and it has never been tougher to stay a U.S. Sailor or Marine," said Garcia. "We are getting Sailors who are technically savvy, with higher ASVAB scores and traditional education backgrounds. The Navy has the most qualified force it has ever had. Right now we have the best of the best serving in uniform."

Garcia also spoke about how involved the Navy is around the globe – from responding to global conflicts, to providing humanitarian and disaster relief, assisting third world nations with medical care, and standing ready to answer the call whenever – and wherever needed.

"The Navy and Marine Corps team truly is a global force for good," Garcia said.

Native son honored during memorial ceremony Oct. 12

A ceremony honoring the memory of Kingsville native MS3 Ronchester Santiago was held on the Oct. 12, at Santa Gertrudis Memorial Cemetery where he is buried. Santiago was one of 17 Sailors killed when USS Cole (DDG 67) was attacked by suicide bombers while it harbored and refueled in the Yemen port of Aden Oct. 12, 2000.

Capt. Mark McLaughlin, commanding officer of NAS Kingsville, spoke about the ship, USS Cole, the Sailor, Ronchester Santiago, and the memorial in Virginia. And, told those assembled that the air station's new \$2 million fitness center – MS3 Ronchester Santiago Fitness Complex -- was dedicated in his honor this past June.

The memorial in Virginia is a 10-foot-tall monolith encircled by 17 granite slabs overlooking the bay, where ships leaving and returning from sea pass by. The names of those who died are inscribed on two brass plaques and a third one reads, "In lasting tribute to their honor, courage and commitment."

McLaughlin said the 22-year old Santiago was two months away from returning to Kingsville when he died. He was on the mess decks doing his job when the attack occurred.

The ceremony was sponsored by the Kingsville VFW Post 2375, which included a wreath-laying and a rifle volley and taps at the conclusion of the ceremony.

VT-21's helm changes as Beck assumes command

Cmdr. Brian Beck relieved Cmdr. Quino Alonzo of the helm of Training Squadron 21 (VT-21) during a change of command ceremony on Oct. 5.

"You and Joy have always taken care of family, shipmates and the community around you," said Capt. Joe Evans, commander of Training Air Wing TWO, to Alonzo and his wife. "You've always been there leading the charge in community involvement, gone to bat for all your people, and let your people grow into their jobs."

"As you look back, you'll see you did those things that count the most," Evans added.

As he departed, Alonzo told those assembled in the NAS Kingsville Captain's Club, "All my successes as your commanding officer have been because of your successes."

Alonzo is heading to Virginia where he will serve as operations officer aboard USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71).

Beck said that when Alonzo took command of VT-21 15 months ago, the squadron was undermanned, instructor pilots were undertrained, and inefficiencies lead to a student backlog.

"Now we're fully manned with a well trained instructor pilot cadre and continue to work hard training with a high level of success," Beck said. "I hope to continue to empower our instructors to 'make' the best aviators in the world."

Beck said that he remembers standing in that Captain's Club 14 years ago as a VT-21 student, getting his wings and acknowledged that a lot of people had helped him along the way. "I wouldn't be here either without the

help of a lot of leaders, peers, and family; especially my wife Rona with her grace, strength, and compassion."

This year's Navy Ball theme focused on history – from the proud 237 years of Navy and Marine Corps service on land, sea and in the air – to NAS Kingsville's 70-year anniversary of its commissioning back on July 4, 1942.

Master of ceremonies AC1(AW) Patrick Harrison read a brief history of the air station to kick off the ceremony Saturday, from the first steps taken by local civic leaders to bring the Navy here – to the mission of the base that is the same today as it was 70 years ago.

"The mission of NAS Kingsville is the same today as it has been for the past 70 years," Harrison said, "to provide reliable and sustainable shore infrastructure and services in support of training student Naval aviators and Training Air Wing TWO, and to enable and support the fleet, fighter and family."

The ceremony included the NAS Kingsville color guard, with AC3 Lattie Honeycutt, ET2 Jessica Korenek, AC3 Thomas Debenedittis and ACAN Meghan Thrasher performing, while Korenek read the Missing Sailor tribute and Debenedittis rang the ship's bell. The ceremonial cake-cutting included the oldest Sailor in attendance, 86-year old retired Lt. Cmdr. Babe Crouch, and youngest Sailor in attendance, 19-year old AC3 John Albanese. Crouch served at NAS Kingsville from 1942-1943.

The event was coordinated by the NAS Kingsville Navy Ball Committee, comprised of departmental and command representatives of all commands and activities aboard the air station, and chaired by ETC(SW) Eric Smith.



Midshipmen air power behind Reynolds sinks Central Michigan

Freshman quarterback Keenan Reynolds stepped in for injured starter Trey Miller on Saturday, Oct. 12, and added a new aerial threat to the Navy's triple-option offense. The result was a convincing performance for the young freshman as he became the first quarterback since Chris McCoy in 1997 to throw three touchdown passes in a game. Behind Reynolds, the Midshipmen claimed a 31-13 victory.

Reynolds (6-11, 139 yards) also contributed 59 yards on the ground to a combined team effort of 258 yards rushing.

Navy (3-3) held a 17-10 lead at the half and added 14 points in the third quarter. The difference in the game turned out to be converting on third and fourth downs

as Navy converted 7 of 16 opportunities on third down, while Central Michigan was only 2-for-10. The Midshipmen also converted 5-of-5 fourth down attempts, while CMU went 0-for-1.

Time of possession also favored Navy with the Middies controlling the clock for just over 35 minutes compared to 24 minutes for CMU.

Coming off a big, overtime win over Air Force Oct. 5, Navy evened its season record heading into a game this week with the University of Indiana (2-4). The Hoosiers nearly upset Ohio State this past weekend, losing 52-49.

The road ahead for Navy includes traveling to East Carolina on Oct. 27, hosting

Florida Atlantic on Nov. 3, visiting Troy, Ala., on Nov. 10, and hosting Texas State Nov. 17. Navy will conclude its regular season against Army in Philadelphia on Dec. 8, with the Commander-In-Chief's trophy on the line.

Texas A&M Kingsville ends four game losing skid

Texas A&M Kingsville came out on top of a nail-biter at Javelina Stadium Oct. 12, claiming a 20-17 win over a tough Incarnate Word squad that took the fight down to the

final minutes of the game. The Javelinas, who held a 10-3 lead at the half, took a 20-10 lead with just 3:49 left to play. But Incarnate Word came right back, putting together a 6-play, 73-yard scoring drive to close the gap to 20-17 with 1:52 remaining. After that, the Javelinas were able to run out the clock and hold on for the win.

The Javelinas (3-4) will travel to Stephansville, Texas, this week for a clash with Tarleton State, and return to Kingsville the following week for homecoming against Angelo State.

LDO/CWO programs provide commissioning opportunities for enlisted

The Navy is seeking applications from highly qualified Sailors in pay grades E-6 through E-9 for the Fiscal Year 2014 Active Duty Limited Duty Officer (LDO) and Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) programs, officials said Sept. 20.

"LDOs and CWOs bring a variety of technical expertise and a seasoned perspective into the wardroom from their enlisted service," said Lt. Shane Walker, assistant LDO/CWO community manager, Bureau of Naval Personnel and an LDO. "These programs deliver to the officer corps seasoned technical professionals with proven leadership abilities."

LDOs and CWOs are composed of Sailors from the enlisted ranks who serve in 56 different officer technical fields. These programs serve as a path to commissioning for qualified Sailors, but more importantly the LDO and CWO communities support the warfighting capability and readiness of naval forces through leadership, technical proficiency, and experience, according to Walker.

"They are the primary manpower source for technically specific billets not best suited for traditional unrestricted line, restricted line or staff corps career path officers," said Walker, "Using critical enlisted experience, they are committed to the continuous leadership, improvement, training and mentoring of Sailors."

The LDO and CWO communities have designators in the surface, submarine,

aviation, information dominance, expeditionary, and general series as well as staff corps communities and serve in a variety of leadership billets within their technical fields, ranging from division officer to commanding officer ashore.

Eligibility requirements for LDO include US citizenship, serving in pay grade E-7 through E-9 or an E-6 who has passed the exam for E-7 and been determined board eligible. Active-duty applicants for LDO must have at least eight, but not more than 15 years of active-duty service.

Eligibility requirements for CWO include US citizenship, serving in pay grade E-7 through E-9. Active-duty applicants for CWO must have at least 13, but not more than 22 years of active-duty service.

These programs do not require applicants to have a college degree. Applications must be postmarked no later than Nov. 1, 2012. The in-service procurement board is scheduled to convene Jan. 7, 2013. NAVADMINs 285/12 contains additional application criteria and guidance. Nuclear qualified candidates must also refer to NAVADMINs 099/12 and 238/12.

Eligible Sailors should apply for the designator for which they are most qualified, regardless of their current rating. Upon commissioning, Sailors selected for LDO/CWO will attend the four-week Officer Development School in Newport, R.I. (*From Navy Personnel Command Public Affairs*)

ONR-sponsored scientist receives Nobel Prize

A scientist whose work has been funded by the Office of Naval Research (ONR) for more than 30 years received the Nobel Prize in physics Oct. 9 for his investigations into the quantum mechanics of matter and light-research that has resulted in the world's most accurate clock.

A physicist at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) and the University of Colorado-Boulder, Dr. David J. Wineland was hailed for his contributions to the measurement and control of individual quantum systems, or isolating and trapping atoms and photons to scrutinize the relationship between light and matter.

This practice lies at the heart of the quest for precision clocks and the world's most powerful computers.

"Dr. Wineland is the 63rd Nobel laureate that we've sponsored," said Chief of Naval Research Rear Adm. Matthew L. Klunder. "This significant achievement underscores the vision and skill of ONR program officers to identify and invest in the best scientific talent in the U.S. and around the world."

ONR in 1977 provided the first funding outside of NIST for Wineland and fellow researchers when they began exploring the possibilities of laser cooling to manipulate atoms using light.

"This technique has found its way into many aspects of experimental atomic physics, and through our continued funding from ONR has enabled us to now realize the world's most precise clocks," said Wineland, whose research into trapped-ion atomic clocks continues to be supported by ONR.

His recent research helped create a clock that would not stray more than a second from actual time over the course of 30 billion years. Dr. Charles Clark, who oversees ONR's Atomic, Molecular and Quantum Physics Program, said this level of precision opens up a world of possibilities for Sailors and Marines, who rely on atomic clocks stationed on satellites to provide accurate GPS measurements for operations on land, at sea and in the air.

"Greater precision in the measurement of time also leads to greater precision in measurement and control of the frequencies of electromagnetic waves," Clark said. "These have many uses in U.S. Navy applications such as enhanced sensitivity of radar, greater security of communications and improved sensing of changes of Earth's magnetic and gravitational fields, among others."

Wineland's research-along with that of co-recipient Serge Haroche, a professor at the College de France and Ecole Normale Supérieure in Paris-also moves scientists closer to creating quantum computers that one day could solve complex problems at speeds unheard of with today's machines.

Wineland previously received the National Medal of Science from then-President George W. Bush in 2007.

The Nobel Prize is awarded each year to trailblazers in cultural and scientific fields. As Nobel laureates, Wineland and Haroche will receive a medal, a diploma and share a \$1.2 million prize.

ONR provides the science and technology necessary to maintain the Navy and Marine Corps' technological advantage. Through its affiliates, ONR is a leader in science and technology with engagement in 50 states, 30 countries, 1,035 institutions of higher learning and more than 900 industry partners. ONR employs approximately 1,065 people, comprising uniformed, civilian and contract personnel, with additional employees at the Naval Research Lab in Washington, D.C.
