Subj: HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT

1. Purpose. To implement a comprehensive hazardous and state regulated waste management program at Naval Air Station Corpus Christi (NASCC). The program is described in enclosure (1), assigns responsibility, and provides instruction for appropriate regulated waste handling operations, management, oily waste/waste oil management, and pollution prevention initiatives to ensure conformance with federal, state, and Navy regulations in accordance with references (a) through (c).

2. Cancellation. NASCORPCINST 5090.3A. This instruction has been completely revised and should be read in its entirety.

3. Applicability. This instruction applies to all station departments, tenant activities and contractor operations on board NASCC and all NASCC controlled outlying properties.

4 Action.

a. Commanding Officers, Officers-in Charge, department heads, and contractors who generate hazardous or state regulated waste shall ensure management of program in accordance with enclosure (1) and ref (a) through (c).

b. Environmental Management System (EMS) Core Team (CT) shall:

(1) Identify all work centers on board NASCC that generates federal and state regulated waste.

(2) Meet with the EMS Working Group (WG) composed of representatives from contractors, tenants and each work center that generates waste.

(3) Provide technical guidance for hazardous and regulated waste management.

(4) Prepare and submit reports related to the waste program required by higher authority and regulatory agencies, and maintain records of waste management operations required by enclosure (1) and references (a) through (c).

(5) Initiate and coordinate efforts to minimize generation of hazardous and state regulated waste.

(6) Maintain proper documentation for inspection, storage, transportation, disposal of hazardous and state-regulated waste.

(7) Coordinate with Defense Logistics Agency Disposition Services (DRMO-DS) for disposal of waste.

c. Waste generator responsibilities:

(1) Daily overall waste management and operations in accordance with this instruction and all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations.

(2) Serve as member of the EMS WG for waste related issues.

(3) Operate, inspect and maintain waste storage facilities, accumulation points, satellites and material storage facilities.

(4) Submit required documentation and coordinate characterization, manifesting, and disposal of waste with NAVFAC SE Public Works Environmental personnel.

(5) Establish and maintain safety, training and medical surveillance programs for appropriate personnel; ensure all individuals handling hazardous waste in their respective work centers are properly trained in accordance with enclosure (1) and references (a) through (c).

d. Fire Department shall provide support to program in accordance with enclosure (1) and ref (a) through (c).

e. Environmental Management System Core Team (CT) and WG. The CT and WG shall meet at least monthly to discuss environmental issues including hazardous material/waste management, waste minimization, and

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spill response. The CT and WG will review the Hazardous Waste Management Plan to ensure it is current and make changes or modifications as required.



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
