## Terns return to roost on base roofs

Be prepared for the annual visit of the endangered and protected terns that make their seasonal home on Naval Air Station Key West's flat, gravel roofs.

The least tern and Roseate tern migrate through Florida in the spring and are predominately seen on Truman and Sigsbee Park annexes as well as Boca Chica Field, said Carrie Backlund, NAS Key West natural resources manager.

"Both birds are protected by the state of Florida and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act," said Backlund. "The Roseate tern is also federally listed as threatened.

"This protection means it is unlawful to kill, attempt to kill, take, possess, transport, molest, or harass these birds or their nests or eggs," she said. "Violations of these laws can include thousands of dollars in penalties and jail time."

The birds start nesting in April and are here through August.

"At NAS Key West they nest on flat, gravel roofs and gravel, rocky un-vegetated open areas on the airfield," Backlund said. "Some of the buildings they have historically nested on are; Truman Annex, buildings 289 and 290 and the Housing Office

## DOD issues salute to military children

The Defense Department believes military children serve their country alongside their parents, officials said Tuesday at the kickoff of the Month of the Military Child.

When military children serve, they do so by making sacrifices when parents are deployed, through frequent moves, starting new schools and making new friends on a continuing basis, said Barbara Thompson, DOD's director of the office of family policy/children and youth.

"We feel it's important for the nation to know that military children also serve their country," Thompson said.

It was in 1986 that then-Defense Secretary Casper Weinberger designated April as the Month of the Military Child in recognition of the sacrifices children make as their parents serve in the military. Since then, military installations, organizations and communities have created special events to pay tribute to the youngest military heroes.

At Naval Air Station Key West, Morale, Welfare and Recreations hosts the 25th Annual Youth Fest from 2 - 5 p.m., April 12

at Sigsbee Park. On April 14, MWR has planned a Child and Youth Programs Play Day. The CYP will host family dinners on Saturdays during April.

Thompson emphasized that April also is Child Abuse Prevention Month and said awareness in this arena is important to DOD.

"Child Abuse Prevention Month is particularly important because it's a social responsibility for all of us to make sure children are safe and their well-being is protected," she said. "Everybody has a responsibility."

## Educators learn how to 'SPARC' military students

Children of military parents face many challenges which include separation from family members, assimilating into new school environments and having to deal with many life events related to the absence of their military parent.

Statistics indicate that there are more than 1.5 million military children that will change schools six - nine times during their school-age years, four times more often than an average child in the U.S.

Insight and ideas on how to support those military students were the focus of a special workshop Monday involving educators from Sigsbee Charter School and Naval Air Station Key West professionals who support the military child.

The training, "Helping Military Children Discover Their SPARC: Strength, Potential, Aspiration, Resourcefulness, Confidence," was provided by the Military Child Education Coalition. MCEC is a nonprofit organization that addresses the educational needs of children in military families. The organization,

which provides training via a Navy contract, was originally formed by a group of military mothers concerned with the welfare of the military child.

The one-day course provided the latest research and analysis on the concept of thriving and the impact of mindset on the ability, resilience and stamina of children and youth when life events create challenges, said NAS Key West School Liaison Officer Yoli Eldred, who requested the training.

The course was limited to only 50 participants, said Eldred. Because Sigsbee Charter School has a high percentage of military students, that staff was invited to participate. Others invited to attend included Child and Youth Program employees and Military Family Life Counselors assigned to CYP, Sigsbee Charter, Key West High and Horace O'Bryant schools.

"It is extremely crucial to provide educators and professional personnel the opportunity to explore the latest trends and developmental research to empower them with knowledge and the tools necessary to best serve the needs of the military child," Eldred said.

Giving parents the tools to make them strong supporters of their children and to keep them safe from predators and from violence within the family is crucial, she added.

“Parenting is tough, regardless of the situation and the

age of the child. They each bring their nuances to the table, whether it’s children at 2 who say ‘no,’ or a teenager who’s sometimes a little defiant,” she said.

DOD offers parenting skill resources, Thompson noted, such as the newly launched Parenting Course.

The course, she explained, examines parenting from the

context of the military lifestyle, which revolves around deployments and parental separations from their children at different stages of their development.

“Sometimes things really push our buttons,” she added. “So we need to have the tools, to know how to cope with those kinds of stressors and how we react to them.”

# Bystander intervention one key to preventing sexual assault

The Department of Defense is launching an all-out effort to get its people to engage in active bystander intervention to prevent sexual assault.

Active bystanders take the initiative to help someone who may be targeted for a sexual assault by a predator.

Active bystanders also take the initiative to help friends who aren't thinking clearly from becoming perpetrators of crime.

Intervention doesn't mean

that you only step in to stop a crime in progress; rather, these steps are "early intervention" - before the crime begins.

There are three components to active bystander intervention. They are referred to as the ABCs:

**Assess for safety.** Ensure that all parties are safe and assess whether the situation requires calling authorities. When deciding to intervene, your personal safety should be the number-one priority. When in doubt, call for help.

**Be with others.** If safe to intervene, you're likely to have a greater influence on the par-

ties involved when you work together with someone or several people. Your safety is increased when you stay with a group of friends who you know well.

**Care for the victim.** Ask if the victim of the unwanted sexual advance, attention, or behavior is okay. Does he or she need medical care? Does he or she want to talk to the Sexual Assault Response Coordinator to see about reporting the matter? Ask if someone he or she trusts can help.

Active bystander intervention takes a number of forms:

- Talking to a friend to ensure

he or she is doing okay.

- Making up an excuse to help the friend get away from someone.
- Calling the police.
- Recommending to a bartender or party host that someone has had too much to drink.
- Pointing out someone's disrespectful behavior in a safe and respectful manner that tends to de-escalate the situation.
- Removing a friend from a risky situation quickly.
- Despite the fact that most of you wear a uniform, no one is asking you to play the part

of the police. Your personal safety is key. Before you act, you should think about the following:

- How can you keep yourself safe in this situation?
- What are all the options available to you?
- Who else might be able to assist you in this situation?
- What are the pros and cons of acting?
- Decide how to help.
- Approach everyone as a friend.
- Be firm.
- Avoid violence.

## Ask the Doc

**Question:** What should I do if I have a bad reaction to my medication?

**Answer:** Sometimes medications can cause unintended reactions from minor to life-threatening in nature. Minor reactions should be reported to your provider or pharmacist for advice - pharmacy phone numbers are usually located on the prescription bottle. For serious or life threatening reactions - such as difficulty breathing, tightness in your chest, swelling, itching or convulsions - call 911 or go to the nearest emergency room.

**Question:** Is it important how I store my medications?

**Answer:** Each medication has unique storage requirements. Because the effectiveness of your medication may be altered by temperature light or humidity, many medications should be stored in a cool, dry, place away from moisture, heat and sunlight. Always read medication labels for storage recommendations. If in doubt, ask your pharmacist if special storage procedures are needed.

**Question:** Why do some medications warn me of sunburn?

**Answer:** Some medications such as sulfa

antibiotics, like sepra or Bactrim, can cause photosensitivity - causing sensitivity to sun rays or likely sun burning. Even short exposure to sun rays or tanning booths can cause skin rash, itching, redness or even severe sunburn. If your prescription label cautions against sun exposure, try avoiding the highest burn index of the day, usually between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. If you must be out, wear protective clothing and accessories. In addition, apply sunscreen (SPF 30 or higher), use SPF lip balm and wear sunglasses to protect your eyes.

Fifty-eight men and women wear the Navy police badge on their uniform and assume 13-hour watches before the sun even comes up at NAS Key West.

"We are more law enforcement dominant and integrated with civilian police officers rather than being solely antiterrorism like my prior duty stations," said Hutchinson.

"I've always wanted to do law enforcement," said MASN Evan Tollefson, a patrolman serving his first duty tour at NAS Key West.

Tollefson, along with all MAs, is trained to use mechanical advantage control holds, experience first-hand the effects of oleoresin capsicum (commonly known as pepper spray) and is tasked to uphold good order and discipline on the four NAS Key West annexes.

"Being the Security department LPO has been a rewarding experience, by guiding and leading new MAs," said Hutchinson. "I have been able

at Sigsbee Park, V-4059, but they can nest on any suitable flat roof and may nest on roofs other than those identified above.”

The adult birds are extremely sensitive to prolonged or frequent disturbance. The eggs and chicks require parental protection from daytime heat because they are highly susceptible to heat stress, Backlund said. If disturbed, the

young chicks may fall off the roofs or suffer heat exposure.

To protect the species, the following policies are in effect:

Routine work on rooftops should be scheduled outside of nesting season.

Do not access any flat roof - or very shallow pitched roofs - between April and August for any reason without first contacting the base Natural Resources Manager at (305) 797-9576. The manager will determine if terns are nesting on your roof. If the

NRM is not available, please contact the Environmental Director at (305) 293-2911.

If you see these birds on or around your roof, please call the NRM. If terns are found to be nesting on the roof, any access to the roof during nesting season must be coordinated with the NRM.

Anyone who finds a tern chick that has fallen off a roof should immediately contact the NRM. If the NRM is not available, please contact Wildlife Rescue of the Florida Keys at (305) 292-1008.

Avoid aggressive driving. Speeding and rapid acceleration and braking can lower your gas mileage by as much as 33 percent at highway speeds and 5 percent around town.

Car pooling and sharing travel makes a difference. Reducing the number of vehicles on the road decreases congestion and reduces CO2 emissions.
