Navy prepares for hurricanes with exercise

On Monday, U.S. Fleet Forces Command and Commander, Navy Installations Command began the two-week hurricane preparedness exercise HURREX/Citadel Gale 14.

The purpose of the annual exercise, which ends May 15, is to prepare the Navy to respond to weather threats in U.S. coastal regions, and to maintain the ability to deploy forces even under the most adverse weather conditions.

HURREX/CG-14 involves two simulated storm systems developing and intensifying to hurricane strength, threatening the Caribbean Islands, East Coast and Gulf Coast regions.

All Navy commands with personnel in these regions are participating by reviewing and exercising heavy weather instructions and procedures.

Although participating, training at NAS Key West is unaffected by the exercise. For more information, call the public affairs office, (305) 293-2425.

May 9

1926 - Lt. Cmdr. Richard Byrd reports reaching the North Pole in a heavier-than-air-flight aircraft.

May 10

1862 - The Norfolk Navy Yard is burned before being evacuated by Confederate.

May 11

1898 - During the Spanish-American War, Marines and Sailors cut the trans-oceanic cable near Cienfuegos, Cuba, isolating Cuba from Spain.

May 12

1975 - SS Mayaguez, a tanker ship, is seized by Khmer Rouge, the Communist party of Kampuchea.

May 13

1964 - The first all nuclear-powered task group, USS Enterprise (CVAN 65), USS Long Beach (CGN 9) and USS Bainbridge (DLGN 25), is organized and deploys to the Sixth Fleet.

May 14

1836 - Congress authorizes the U.S. Exploring Expedition to conduct an exploration of the Pacific Ocean and South Seas.

May 15

1969 - The pre-commissioned submarine USS Guitarro (SSN 665) accidentally sinks while moored at U.S. Mare Island Naval Shipyard, Calif.

Good grief

Grief is not a very popular word used in conversations. Many times we may not really understand we are grieving because we limit grief to one or two emotions we should feel.

However, the reality is we have all gone through grief at some point in our lives. Dictionary.com defines grief as a keen mental suffering or distress over affliction or loss; sharp sorrow; painful regret.

Have you had anything like an affliction or loss happen to you in your life? It comes in all forms: death, divorce, loss of a pet, miscarriage, financial loss or loss of a dream. The list can go on.

I know I have gone through different afflictions and losses in my life. And they all caused grief. Some caused a short-term grief and others caused a longer period of grieving. No matter what, grief was there.

It is a natural response we have. Though it is an emotional reaction to a negative event, grief itself is neither good nor bad. We have that ability to do make it that way. The way we make it bad is if we ignore it because it will always be there. Grief becomes good when we allow ourselves to go through it. It brings healing to our souls.

So what does grief actually look like?

Elisabeth Kübler-Ross did a study on grief and came up

with five stages: Denial, anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance. It is important to note that these stages are not linear, meaning your grief may not follow this order. You might go back and forth in the stage or not experience one of the stages. However, it is important to understand the process of grief so we don't fear it.

Denial is the initial defensive reaction we have when the loss occurs. It helps buffer the shock. Anger is another reaction we have during this process. We become angry at a person for what is happening. We may even become angry at God. It is the idea that more should have been done.

If you are at the receiving end of this anger, try not to take it personally. The person is coping with this pain.

Bargaining is also common. It is usually with God. If God can restore it, we will be a better person. Or maybe you witnessed in a friend's break with a significant other. They try to find how they can still make it work.

Depression here is not clinical depression. We are talking about sadness and regret. You may even worry about what happens next. This stage prepares us for the final stage,

which is acceptance.

Acceptance does not mean happiness. It does not mean the pain will go away. We will still have this pain when birthdays and holidays come around, but we have an understanding of our new reality. We are at peace with what has happened.

How long does grief last? Some say two years; others say one year. The reality is, when it is done.

However, the more we allow ourselves to grieve, the better it gets. Psalm 30:5 tells us, "Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning." There is a promise that through the dark times of grief there is light of joy waiting on the other side. Basically, we do not have to grieve our whole lives.

When we are grieving, we should use our supports: family, friends, faith, support groups, counselors and chaplains. Also make sure to take care of yourself with rest, physical activity and eating well. If you feel as though the grieving is getting too long or too intense, seek a counselor or a chaplain immediately. You are not alone in this journey.

USAJOBS best source for federal jobs

Searching for a new job can be stressful for anybody, but those on the hunt for a federal government position often have a number of questions unique to their own experience and many of those questions are related to the application process through USAJOBS.

USAJOBS is a free, web-

based job board enabling federal job seekers access to thousands of job opportunities with hundreds of federal agencies and organizations. Before 2012, federal government job listings were spread out across a number of individual agencies.

"President Obama implemented an initiative for one central location for applicants to go and that's when all agencies went to strictly using USAJOBS to announce

their vacancies," said Aqueilla Grimmage-Smith, supervisor with the Navy Region Southeast Human Resources Department. "The goal is to streamline the job-search process to make it faster and more convenient for people to access government listings."

The first step to access USAJOBS listings is to visit the website at www.usajobs.gov

NAS Key West personnel gathered more than 10,000 toys for more than 4,000 families during the Christmas holiday.

and create a login. Applicants can then create and store up to five resumes per account, browse listings and apply to jobs for which they meet eligibility requirements.

According to Grimmage-

Smith, it is important for applicants to pay close attention to the eligibility requirements for each listing. Certain listings on USAJOBS are restricted to applicants who meet specific requirements, such as wounded warriors, disabled veterans, active-duty spouses and individuals with disabilities. These requirements, or "appoint-

ment authorities," are listed under the "Who may apply" section of the listing.

"Many of the eligibility restrictions are geared toward our veterans as a result of the great sacrifices they have made during their service, but there is even more to it than that," Grimmage-Smith said. "It's about getting the right people into the right positions. Military members are trained and have the specific skillsets we need on many of our military bases. While they have earned their appointment authority through their service, it is also a major advantage to management to be able to hire employees with their experience."

Veteran applicants typically fall under four categories: Provisional Appointment of 30 percent or more Compensable Disabled Veterans; Veterans Recruitment Appointment (VRA); Veterans' Employment Opportunity Authority (VEOA); and the Wounded Warrior Project.

Applicants must provide a letter from the Veterans Administration (VA) or branch of service documenting a compensable service-connected disability of 30 percent or more, SF-15 Application for 10-Point Veterans Preference, and DD

Form 214 Certificate of Release.

Veterans without service-connected disabilities may still meet eligibility requirements for non-competitive VRA positions up to the GS-11 pay grade. Applicants are VRA-eligible if they have earned a campaign badge, are a disabled veteran, have earned an Armed Forces Service Medal for participation in a military operation, or have served at least three years with a separation under honorable conditions. Applicants must provide a VA letter and DD Form 214 to verify eligibility.

Veterans may also qualify for appointment under the VEOA. Eligible applicants must have completed at least three years of active-duty service with a separation under honorable conditions.

While many USAJOBS appointment authorities apply to veterans, other applicants may still meet requirements for non-competitive positions. Spouses of active-duty service members with orders specifying a permanent change of station, spouses of 100-percent disabled service members and spouses of a service member who was killed while performing active duty are also eligible. Eligibility verification requirements can be found under the "Who may

apply" section of the listing.

"Spouses put their careers on hold to support our service members, so this is an avenue for them to seek employment," Grimmage-Smith said. "In a sense, they serve alongside the service member and this gives them a chance to seek employment on base with their spouse, who they are following across the world."

One appointment not entirely restricted to veterans and spouses is Schedule A. This authority allows federal agencies to hire individuals with severe physical, psychiatric or intellectual disabilities. Applicants do not need to have any military or previous federal government experience. Eligibility requirements include medical documentation substantiating the applicant's disability.

"It is important to inform every one of the different types of appointment authorities because we are an equal employment opportunity employer," Grimmage-Smith said. "We don't discriminate based on disabilities and we need applicants to understand that it's not just geared toward veterans and spouses. USAJOBS offers federal government employment opportunities for everyone."



management,” said LSSN Brittney Joseph, assigned to NAS Key West Port Operations Department.

According to Hobbs and Joseph, each day brings on new tasks and requirements instead of a fixed routine, ranging from procuring fuel for aircraft and verifying correct equipment parts to ordering note pads, pens and other office supplies.

“I feel the challenge with being an ‘LS’ is the fact that it is customer service driven,” said Joseph. “You get what you receive, so if someone gives you inadequate information, you have to work harder to try to get that information from them to get that part even though you’re not an engineer. You have to do more research to figure out what is needed, so that is the biggest challenge.”

Without the correct parts or materials, command missions may be postponed or even cancelled. With that in mind, Sailors working in the LS rating must develop problem solving, critical thinking, leadership and organizational skills similar to today’s civilian business world and human resource fields.

“I feel very confident that I will carry on in this legacy of a logistics specialist throughout my Navy career,” stated Joseph about her aspirations of becoming a supply corps officer in the Navy.

“There is never a boring day in the life of an LS,” Hobbs added.

at Coast Guard Sector Key West, Trumbo Point.

The fast response cutter is named after Kathleen Moore, who served as a light keeper of the Black Rock Harbor Light on Fayerweather Island, south of Bridgeport, Connecticut. Moore was credited with saving 21 lives. She began assisting her father as a light keeper at the age of 12 and served the stations for 72 years.

CGC Kathleen Moore is the third of six that are being homeported at Coast Guard Sector Key West. CGC Charles David, Jr. (WPC 1107) and CGC Charles Sexton (WPC 1108) were the first to arrive and are now in service.


