COMFLEACT YOKOSUKA INSTRUCTION 1710.67B

Subj: BASE FISHING REGULATIONS

Ref: (a) COMNAVFORJAPANINST 2410.2G

1. Purpose: To update and promulgate fishing regulations for Fleet Activities (FLEACT), Yokosuka. This is a complete revision and should be read in its entirety.

2. Cancellation: COMFLEACTINST 1710.67A.

3. Designated Fishing Areas Aboard FLEACT, Yokosuka

a. Fishing, clam digging, and bait hunting is only permitted:

(1) Along the shoreline from the Mikasa Park Gate (next to U.S. Naval Hospital (NAVHOSP), Yokosuka) to and along side Briggs Bay.

(2) Off the small finger pier located near the marina.

b. Clam digging and bait hunting is permitted along the base shorelines to and along side Briggs Bay during daylight hours. Personnel shall not enter the water during adverse weather, when small craft warnings are issued, after dark, or over waist deep when conducting these activities.

4. Authorized Hours: Fishing is allowed 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

5. Sanitation and Health

a. Fish shall not be gutted or otherwise cleaned while fishing in public or common areas.

b. Trash, debris, unused bait, etc. shall not be thrown or otherwise deposited into the ocean and shall be removed by the person fishing when he/she leaves.

6. Age Restriction: An adult must accompany children under 13 years of age and remain with them at all times when they are fishing.

7. General Safety Precautions: The following safety precautions are recommended:

a. Protect your eyes with sun glasses or safety glasses while fishing. Be sure the lenses in the glasses are not glass, as flying sinkers may cause the lenses to break.

b. Wear a hat with a brim to prevent fishhooks in the face and scalp.

c. Wear a personal flotation device when fishing along the shoreline not protected by a fence.

d. Always know what is behind you when casting.

e. Do not allow people to stand or sit behind you, as you may hook them or hit them with a sinker.

f. Do not try to pull a fishhook out by yourself if it is deeply imbedded or is hooked in a vital organ (such as an eye). Go to NAVHOSP, Yokosuka emergency room for treatment. Do not cut the hook off before seeking medical treatment.

8. Action: All commands will ensure the requirements of this instruction are properly disseminated to their personnel. FLEACT, Yokosuka's Security Department will enforce the requirements of this instruction during the course of their normal patrol duties and report violations to the respective command for appropriate action.
