**FRAGORD 003 TO APPENDIX 4 (ROM PROCEDURES) TO ANNEX C  
(OPERATIONS) TO USFJ FORCE HEALTH PROTECTION ORDER 21-002**

1. All DoD uniformed personnel, members of the civilian component, and SOFA-status dependents arriving in Japan from another country shall travel directly to their residence and depending on their vaccination status will follow the prescribed ROM procedures below. All individuals shall utilize only their assigned/home installation, with the exception of personnel on an intermediate stop while awaiting onward movement to their home installation or duty assignment. All ROM procedures will be a 14 day window following arrival and ending on the 14th day at the same hour as arrival. This includes both official and non-official travel. If arriving by USN vessel, the 14 days will be calculated from the date last in another country and there were no COVID-19 cases diagnosed among the crew. Travel within Japan does not incur a ROM by virtue of this order.

a. No Change

b. ROM Procedures.

(1) **CHANGE** Vaccinated. All DoD uniformed personnel, members of the civilian component, and individuals with SOFA-status arriving in Japan from another country that are fully-vaccinated (14 days after a 2 dose series or single dose vaccine), **to include individuals on Temporary Duty**, shall travel directly to their domicile and will, at a minimum, **be restricted to a U.S. installation(s) for 14 days. On or after day 8, vaccinated individuals** will be required to take a viral test (defined as antigen or PCR; the type to be selected by the installation PHEO). **After day 14, individuals that have a negative viral test may have the restriction to their installation removed.** The following procedures apply:

(a) **CHANGE** Vaccination status will be reviewed by a unit travel coordinator who has been designated in writing to perform this function or competent medical authority. All travelers will carry a physical or electronic copy of their completed vaccination card or other medical record of vaccine administration for verification on arrival. Commands who appropriately verify vaccination status may

choose to allow their personnel to conduct the **vaccinated ROM period** prescribed above.

(b) **CHANGE** The individual must remain asymptomatic for the duration of the **vaccinated ROM period of 14 days**. If symptoms occur, the individual will coordinate with the base PHEO or competent medical authority and follow COVID-19 procedures for isolation/quarantine.

(c) **CHANGE** The **14-day vaccinated ROM period** starts from the day following arrival and ends on the 14th day at the same hour as arrival.

**(d) DELETED**

(e) **CHANGE** On or after day **8** of the **vaccinated ROM period**, all individuals will be required to take a SARS-CoV 2 PCR or Antigen test and be in receipt of a negative test result to complete the **14-day vaccinated ROM period**. If the test is positive, the individual will conduct isolation/quarantine procedures.

(f) **CHANGE** Individuals, whose domicile is off-installation **or located at an U.S installation other than their assigned location**, may conduct travel **non-stop** between their domicile and place of work on **a U.S. installation** via POV/GOV **for** the full 14 days after arrival in country. **Off-installation the** use of mass transit, cycling, or walking is not authorized.

(g) **CHANGE** **During the 14-day vaccinated ROM period**, individuals may have access to all on-installation facilities. Vaccinated dependents will also have full access to the installation **during the 14-day vaccinated ROM period**.

a. To further mitigate the risk of importing new COVID-19 cases into Japan due to international travel:

(1) All SOFA personnel arriving to Japan via MILAIR or commercial travel will undergo viral testing (defined as antigen or PCR), the type to be selected by the installation PHEO, prior to exiting ROM. An individual may not exit ROM status unless the following procedures are met:

(a) **CHANGE Fully**-vaccinated individual(s) who have completed the **14 day vaccinated ROM period**, and the viral test (administered on or after day **8**) is negative, will be able to **transition out of restriction to a U.S. installation**. If the test is positive, they will transition to isolation status.

(2) **CHANGE** If arriving at commercial entry points and tests are provided at Japanese quarantine stations (at port/airports), **day 8 exit ROM testing will be still be required for vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals**.

**FRAGORD 003 TO APPENDIX 7 (EXCEPTION TO POLICIES TO ROM) TO ANNEX C (OPERATIONS) TO USFJ FORCE HEALTH PROTECTION ORDER 21-002**

1. **CHANGE** COMUSFJ delegates the authority to grant any ETP to ROM for travel ending in the Japan AOR which originates in the U.S. or any location outside Japan to the Deputy Commander, USFJ; USFJ Service component commanders; and may be further delegated in writing to USFJ Service component, Deputy Commander at the FOGO level. ETPs will be limited to those required for operational impacts and humanitarian reasons, and not for morale or quality of life purposes. ETPs shall include only the minimum number of personnel necessary to complete the required task(s). All ROM ETP personnel must remain on a U.S. installation for the entire 14 day ROM period and limit contact with the base population; authorized travel will be granted to and from lodging and the worksite only. **Deviations from any prescribed ROM procedures within FHP 21-002 will follow the below procedures.**

(b) **CHANGE** If an individual is arriving from a High Risk Location, the requirement will be to have incremental viral testing (the type to be decided by installation PHEO) upon entry into Japan, **a midpoint test at day 4, and an exit test no earlier than day 8 after arrival.**

(OPERATIONS) TO USFJ FORCE HEALTH PROTECTION ORDER 21-002**

**NOTE:** This Appendix supplements **FHP Guidance Supplement 20, Department of Defense Guidance for Personnel Traveling during the Coronavirus Disease 2019 Pandemic, April 12, 2021** and is more restrictive than the supplement.

Upon arrival at destination location, the ROM period will be restarted (**deleted**) for unvaccinated individuals. **Vaccinated individuals will complete the remainder of the vaccinated ROM period for a total of 14 days on a U.S. installation.**
