

E-CIGARETTES POLICY

To ensure military member and staff safety by prohibiting any person onboard Naval Air Station Pensacola (NASP) from possessing electronic cigarettes, their components, batteries, and similar "vaping" devices (hereinafter, collectively and individually referred to as "e-cigarettes"), in prohibited areas.

E-cigarettes present a serious risk of personal injury to NASP military members and staff as well as damage to base property, as evidenced by recent e-cigarette battery explosions that resulted in severe burns. Additionally, e-cigarettes caused several disruptive fire alarms onboard NASP.

Effective immediately, no person onboard NASP may possess e-cigarettes in any NASP building, barracks, or in any government vehicle assigned to NASP. Military members and staff may continue to use e-cigarettes at designated smoking areas on base in accordance with NASP instructions.

This instruction applies to any person onboard NASP. Violations of any provision of this instruction subjects military members to disciplinary action and/or administrative separation per reference (a). This is a punitive order; violations may be punishable by non-judicial punishment or trial by court-martial for violation of Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.
