- Achieving pollution prevention. Pollution will be prevented or reduced at the source whenever feasible. Recycling is mandatory for all NBSD activities and all personnel are directed to participate in the NBSD recycling program. - Providing exceptional environmental program support and compliance oversight to both ashore and afloat commands.
- Conservation of energy and water resources. Adherence to the NBSD energy and water management programs will ensure preservation of resources over the entire base.
- Minimizing environmental liabilities through continual review of existing operations and processes looking for opportunities to use new technologies that are environmentally friendly.
- Increasing awareness and knowledge through an effective environmental training program that is available to both civilian and military personnel assigned both ashore and afloat.
- Continual improvement in how NBSD processes affect the environment. Identifying and reviewing environmental impacts for significance and setting objectives and targets for the reduction and eventual elimination of the environmental impacts.
- Complying with all relevant environmental laws, Executive Orders, regulations, and Department of Defense and Department of Navy policies pertaining to NBSD's environmental aspects.
- Ensuring this policy is communicated to all military and civilian personnel and contractors to encourage their continual awareness and support of NBSD environmental programs. What is an EMS?

An Environmental Management System (EMS) is a structured approach designed to proactively manage all activities that have potential for environmental impacts. The key to EMS is **continuous improvement**.

NBSD's EMS will follow ISO 14001 requirements to institute a "plan, do, check, act" philosophy into a self-correcting management system.

PLAN

- Identify environmental aspects.
- Establish goals.

DO

- Define, document, and communicate EMS roles and responsibilities.
- Ensure objectives and targets are addressed and supported.

CHECK

- Monitor and measure EMS performance, allowing corrective action and supported.

ACT

- Review the EMS, ensuring its continued suitability, adequacy, effectiveness, and appropriate operation.

Benefits of an EMS:

- Prioritized, consistent, reliable environmental performance
- Reduced risk
- Improved compliance posture
- Improved work environment
- Enhanced relations with community, regulators, and stakeholders
- Standardized operating procedures
- Decreased negative effects of personnel turnover
- Corrective / Preventative action process in place for environmental deficiencies
- Fewer Notices of Violation



What is your Role?

All personnel working for or on behalf of NBSD have roles and responsibilities regarding NBSD's EMS. Following are some examples:

- Know NBSD's environmental **policy**.
- Know and comply with the environmental **procedures** that apply to your job.
- Understand how your job could **impact** the environment (i.e. potential spills, emission of air pollutants, material and energy use).
- Be aware of your installation's significant environmental **aspects**.
- Incorporate concepts of **conservation** and pollution prevention in your day-to-day activities.
- Know what to do in the event of a spill or environmental **emergency**:
 - Contain** the spill if safe to do so
 - Notify** your supervisor
 - If it is an immediate threat to health, safety, or the environment, call **911**

- Do you buy "green" office supplies?
- Do you print double-sided copies?
- Do you conserve energy and water?
- Do you comply with all environmental laws applicable to your job?
