



How to Report Suspicion of Child Abuse and Neglect

Below is a list of the type of questions you should be prepared to answer when reporting suspicion of child abuse and neglect. If you do not answers to each of the questions, **MAKE THE CALL ANYWAY** and provide as much information that you can. A child's life could be depending on you. When reporting your suspicion you have the right to remain anonymous unless you are a mandated reporter. Mandated reporters are professionals who have frequent contact with children.

- ❖ Child's name, age, and address
- ❖ Last date and location you saw the child
- ❖ Parent or Caretaker name and address
- ❖ Name and location child's school or child care center
- ❖ Family members contact numbers
- ❖ What type of abuse is suspected (this is when you would explain your concerns)
- ❖ How was the information brought to your attention
