Teen Camp lasts for four weeks from **July 14-August 13** and is open **Tuesday-Thursday** from **7:30 am-4:30 pm**.  
 Open registration will be held at the Youth Center starting **March 30** until weeks are filled.  
 Each week costs **\$88**, not including the cost of field trips.
