

DoD, Navy target sexual assaults

WASHINGTON (NNS) — The Navy announced Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) and issued guidance to focus efforts on awareness and prevention of sexual violence through the use of special events and command-level education in NAVADMIN 106/12, released March 28.

The Department of Defense's SAAM theme this year is, "Hurts One, Affects All. Prevention of Sexual Assault is Everyone's Duty."

In addition to this overarching theme, the Navy will highlight complementary weekly themes throughout the month. "Sexual assault prevention is one key aspect of the Navy's 21st Century Sailor and Marine initiative to increase the personal readiness of each and every Sailor within our Navy," said Vice Adm. Scott R. Van Buskirk, chief of naval personnel and director of the Navy's SAAM 2012 initiative.

"The weekly themes will underscore varying aspects

of sexual assault and the Navy's efforts to raise awareness in order to eliminate this crime."

The four weekly themes are: "Hurts One," "Affects All," "Prevention is Everyone's Duty," and "We Will Not Tolerate Sexual Assault."

Commands will host mandatory education sessions to raise sexual assault awareness among Sailors. Commanding officers can either hold a single two-hour stand down or break the discussions into four 30-minute weekly sessions, according to the NAVADMIN.

Scripts and videos for each week's theme will be provided to commanding officers to help facilitate discussion throughout their commands. These engagement products, in addition to talking points, posters and other tools, will be posted to the Navy Personnel Command's Sexual Assault and

Prevention website, <http://www.sapr.navy.mil>, according to the NAVADMIN.

NAVSTA hosts 22 students on military career day trip

Twenty-two area high school students visited Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport on March 28 for a career orientation that included a tour of the Naval War College (NWC), a windshield tour of Officer Training Command Newport and Naval Academy Prep

School facilities, and the Surface Warfare Officers School.

The field trip was provided for students attending Middletown, Portsmouth and Tiverton High Schools, and the Paul W. Crowley East Bay Met School in Newport. The students were participants in the Newport County Mentor/Co-Op Program that

provides after-school learning opportunities to explore various careers in business, manufacturing, and the military.

"This was real cool," said Ian Locker, a ninth grade student at the Met School.

Eyewitness to 'Kristallnacht' Navy speaker for Holocaust

Ruth Oppenheim, an eyewitness to the night in Germany in which thousands of Jews were subjected to terror and violence by the Nazis during the "Night of Broken Glass" in 1938, will be the guest speaker at Naval Station Newport's observance of Holocaust: Days of Remembrance.

The program will be held April 19 at 10:30 a.m. in the Naval Justice School auditorium.

In 1938, Oppenheim was 11 years old living with her parents, brother and sister in Werne, Germany, when Jewish property, including more than 1,000 Jewish synagogues, and over 7,000 Jewish businesses were destroyed in a single night. Approximately 100 Jews were killed, but 30,000 Jewish men were arrested and taken to concentration camps at Buchenwald, Dachau and Sachsenhausen.

The name, "Night of Broken Glass," or Kristallnacht, refers to all of the shattered

glass windowpanes that littered the streets of Germany after the destruction Nov. 9, 1938.

Oppenheim watched as her father was dragged from their home by Nazi soldiers. He was returned bloody and carrying the Torah from their synagogue. Her father was hos-

pitalized and then jailed.

She will also share her recollections about how the lifestyle of Jews in Germany changed after the passage of the Nuremberg Laws in 1935, the anti-Jewish legislation that regulated Jewish life and persecuted the Jews in Germany, stripping them of their fundamental rights and citizenship.

The visitors toured advanced training simulators used by U.S. Navy and international students at all levels of instruction. They were shown the Conning Officer Virtual Environment (COVE) which provides realistic ship handling training on several ship platforms.

The Japanese officers were specifically intrigued that U.S. naval aviators receive the same shiphandling training as surface warfare officers when en route to command deep draft ships (such as aircraft

carriers and large-deck amphibious ships).

Additionally, they toured the Full Mission Bridge, and the DDG-51 Engineering Trainers which allow officers to develop problem solving skills necessary to successfully manage a multifaceted propulsion and power generation plant afloat.

In the Fire Arms Training Simulator (FATS) the Japanese delegation viewed U.S. Navy Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection target recognition and marksmanship proficiency training.

Impressment led to War of 1812

In 1776, the U.S. founding fathers wrote and signed the Declaration of Independence, declaring that the U.S. was no longer a territory of Great Britain, which launched the two nations into the American Revolutionary War.

The colonists prevailed. However, the British continued to cruise off the Eastern Coast of the United States.

Thirty years after the U.S. declared independence and 200 years ago this year, the Royal Navy was the most powerful in the world. It split its 1,000-ship Navy between the Atlantic and fighting the Napoleonic Wars in France.

With this power, they had blockaded Europe and the American East Coast in the early 1810s. The Royal Navy seized American merchant vessels departing the Chesapeake Bay and forced their crews into Royal Navy

service, called impressment.

Impressment was appalling to Americans and spurred a nationwide feeling of resentment toward the British.

In June 1807, a British frigate HMS Leopard attacked the American 36-gun frigate USS Chesapeake, demanding to search for British deserters. When Chesapeake refused to allow British Sailors to board, the Leopard fired on Chesapeake, wounding or killing many of its crew members. Chesapeake surrendered and the Royal Navy forced Chesapeake Sailors into servitude.

The news rippled through the U.S., sparking anger, however, President Thomas Jefferson decided against declaring war on Britain.

But Jefferson left the presidency and James Madison was elected in 1808. Madison asked Congress to declare war on the British on June 1, 1812.


