Finally, Peppino di Capri an Italian pop music icon, whose career started more than 50 years ago and who has performed numerous times on national television and countless festivals throughout Europe, wowed the entire audience with his performance.

College credit opportunities available at National Test Center

In mid-October of this year, the first National Test Center at a Navy site in the Mediterranean opened in Naples, Italy.

The University of Maryland University College manages the center which offers a variety of tests. 34 CLEP and/or 34 DSST tests online with a final score report at the end of the testing session; Excelsior College Tests online with an instant score report at the end of the multiple-choice tests; and Pearson-Vue certification tests online including the GMAT, CISCO certification tests and COMP-TIA tests are all offered at the center.

Many Sailors and civilians take Excelsior College tests to earn upper-level college credit. Civilians must register for the test at the Excelsior College Web site. The Navy College Office (NCO) can review the registration process with candidates.

Italian News Briefs

Smoking while driving could become illegal

A proposed ban on smoking while driving will be discussed by the Italian parliament before Christmas. The ban, proposed by the Northern League party Senator Piergiorgio Stiffoni, was welcomed by citizens and consumer watchdog agency Codacons, by 'Basta un attimo' (It only takes a moment) road safety group and by the Italian Automobile Club.

Fifteen percent of accidents are caused by drivers taking their eyes off the wheel to light a cigarette. There are about 600 road accidents every day in Italy and 90 percent are caused by drivers' negligence. According to the new measure, drivers caught smoking would be fined €250 and have five points docked from their licenses.

Fruit, vegetables will replace junk food in schools

Education Minister Mariastella Gelmini announced that fresh fruit and vegetables will replace snacks in school vending machines. The new machines will be stocked with the help of national farmers union Coldiretti which could also help boost Italian agriculture and the new generations of consumers looking for healthy local products. The Minister also announced to introduce mandatory physical education lessons in Italian primary schools to avoid child obesity which has become a problem in Italy.

Police officer wrecks donated Lamborghini

One of two Lamborghini cars, donated to Italian police to be used for chasing down speeding motorists and to deliver needed transplant organs, crashed into a line of parked cars last Sunday night, near Cremona. According to police,

the crash was caused by a slow-moving driver who pulled out from a service station without looking and cut off the way of the Lamborghini's driver who swerved into the parked cars. The driver and the passenger were not seriously injured. The two police officers in the car were returning from a convention addressed to students on road safety. In addition to the two Lamborghini cars donated by the manufacturer to the police, the company also donated a defibrillator and a fridge for transporting organs.

Millions in mafia owned property seized

Last week, police seized many mansions and sport cars owned by a local Casalesi clan. The operation seized about 39 apartments, 43 paid parking garages, luxury car dealerships and more than two million Euros in cash. Among the seizures, there was a luxurious villa with swimming pool and 4,000 square meters of park space. According to the police, many of the properties were purchased by clan representatives at court auctions at prices well below market value. The day before the seizure, police also seized €50 million in assets from a Casalesi ally.

Kitten proves to have several lives

A four-month-old kitten named Chicco was rescued Monday by Naples firemen in Pomigliano d'Arco near Naples. The kitten has been rescued several times. He was trapped inside a garbage dumpster and rescued by an Italian woman and her dog. Later, Chicco fell off the scaffolding outside the woman's apartment and broke his paw. On Saturday, he fell into a narrow dry well 15 meters deep. After three attempts by firemen, Chicco was rescued and uninjured to the astonishment of firemen and observers of the rescue.

EURAFSWA Region committed to fight against H1N1

Hospitals and clinics located throughout the Europe, Africa, Southwest Asia (EURAFSWA) Region continue to execute a strategy of information awareness and vaccination of personnel to combat what has become a worldwide fight against the H1N1 flu.

"The vaccination program is going very well," said Cmdr. Timothy Halenkamp, director, public health services at Naval Hospital Naples, Italy. "To date, we have vaccinated more than 80 percent of the active duty personnel in the area."

Currently, all active duty personnel and high-risk Department of Defense (DoD) beneficiaries are eligible to receive the H1N1 vaccine. High-risk beneficiaries include personnel deploying or stationed aboard a ship, health care workers, pregnant family members, people with blood and cardiovascular disorders, as well as many other factors.

Other beneficiaries, including children, are starting to get the vaccination based upon the availability of the vaccine at each installation.

Although not all beneficiaries are required to get the vaccine, Halenkamp says everyone should consider receiving the H1N1 vaccine.

"Military members are required to receive the vaccination unless they have a documented medical or religious contraindication," Halenkamp said. "For everyone else, the vaccine is not mandatory, but it is highly encouraged since this is the number one way to protect ourselves and others against this pandemic flu."

Halenkamp said that the H1N1 vaccine is produced using the same methods as the seasonal flu vaccine, which has proven to be extremely safe and effective. The H1N1 vaccine contains no live virus, so there is no risk of contracting the flu from the immunization itself.

To stay a step ahead of the H1N1 virus, Navy Medicine tracks the number of influenza-like illnesses at each hospital and clinic in the region in order to detect outbreaks of illness very early on and intervene appropriately, said Capt. Mark Malakooti, preventive medicine officer at Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Europe/Africa – U.S. Sixth Fleet Fleet Surgeon's office.

"The United States CDC [Center for Disease Control and Prevention], months ago, stopped tracking and reporting cases of H1N1 because testing had become impractical," said Malakooti. "In addition, they recommended that only patients with serious illness and those admitted to hospitals be tested for H1N1 if it was suspected."

Navy Medicine continues to follow these recommendations this flu season according to Malakooti.

Together with the vaccine efforts, medical professionals in the region are also helping disseminate information about the flu using flyers and radio and television commercials. The Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) Web site,

located at <http://www.cnic.navy.mil>, also provides valuable information about H1N1 flu, how it spreads, who is at the greatest risk, and how to prevent contracting the virus.

According to the CNIC Web site, personnel can do a number of things to minimize the impact of H1N1, including maintaining a healthy lifestyle, eating well, exercising, and getting at least eight hours of sleep. Other prevention methods include frequently washing hands with soap and water, limiting unnecessary exposure to people with coughs or fevers, and utilizing medical facemasks in high-risk environments.

- ALL individuals four-nine years old (new addition)

"We are used to operating from ships, not in the field, so this will provide a scenario the staff is not normally accustomed to. This site has been chosen to provide the staff realistic challenges for various scenarios."

The designated site for this training will be the Old Mill Inn, as well as on the locally homeported C6F flagship USS Mount Whitney (LCC/JCC 20).

The staff of NAVEUR-NAVAF/C6F routinely conducts training exercises at various levels throughout the year.

Ukrainian ship completes deployment with Operation Active Endeavour

The corvette URS Ternopil returned Nov. 26 to national operational control after having completed a deployment to the Mediterranean during which the ship was assigned to Operation Active Endeavour (OAE), the NATO maritime contribution to the fight against terrorism.

It was the third time URS Ternopil – and the fifth for a Ukrainian ship – joined OAE since a memorandum of understanding defined, in March 2007, the modalities for contribution by Ukrainian Navy assets to the NATO operation.

During its latest deployment within OAE, which started Oct. 21, 2009, URS Ternopil participated also in a 'surge' operation together with eight NATO naval units and several aircraft. During OAE surge activities, military assets are concentrated into specific areas of the Mediterranean to conduct a larger scale sweep to establish presence and monitor maritime activity.

This deployment has confirmed the progressively increasing level of interoperability achieved by Ukrainian Navy units and their capability to effectively contribute to countering the common threat of maritime terrorism.

The mission assigned to OAE is to conduct maritime operations to demonstrate NATO's resolve to help deter, defend, disrupt and protect against terrorism. More than 100,000 merchant vessels have been contacted in more than eight years, and a total of 161 have been inspected at sea.

OAE's achievements through targeted maritime operations constitute a significant deterrent to terrorist activity in the Mediterranean Sea. The Operation has also been an important catalyst for cooperation with non-NATO countries and has provided NATO and participating nations better awareness of maritime traffic and opportunities to develop tactics and procedures employed in other operational activities, including anti-piracy.


Naples Public Health Evaluation

NSA Naples energy conservation

How do CFLs result in less mercury in the environment compared to traditional light bulbs?

Electricity use is the main source of mercury emissions in the U.S. CFLs use less electricity than incandescent lights, meaning the use of CFLs reduces the amount of mercury put into the environment. As shown in the table below, a 13-watt, 8,000-rated-hour-life CFL (60-watt equivalent – a common light bulb type) will save 376 kwh over its lifetime, thus avoiding 4.5 mg of mercury. If the bulb goes to a landfill, overall emissions savings would drop a little, to 4.0 mg. EPA recommends that CFLs are recycled where possible, to maximize mercury savings.

Handling 'Old Man' winter

Never underestimate winter's blast. They call winter an "old man" but he's far from frail. In fact, he's apt to strike a deadly blow when least expected.

Over exposure to cold and dampness can cause body temperature to lower. This condition is called hypothermia. Symptoms are shivering and experiencing chills, or not being able to think or speak clearly.

Frostbite, which is when body tissue freezes, can also occur in winter. Frostbite happens most frequently to a person's extremities like their feet and toes, fingers, face and nose. Symptoms include numbness and a white and waxy appearance to skin.

How to avoid hypothermia or frostbite:

- Select proper clothing for cold, wet and windy conditions. Dress in layers so clothing can be added or removed as the temperature changes. Carry extra gloves and socks in case the others get wet.
- Rest frequently in a warm, dry place. Fatigue contributes to cold injuries. Perform work during the warmest part of the day.
- Carry survival gear in vehicles to stay warm in case of a breakdown or crash.
- Avoid exhaustion or fatigue because energy is needed to keep warm.
- Never work alone. Always have a buddy nearby.
- Fight off the cold by eating high energy food and drinking warm liquids frequently. Avoid drinks containing caffeine or alcohol because they cause dehydration. Drink warm, sweet beverages.

How to walk safely on snow or ice:

Even walking in the winter can be a challenge. Slips and falls on snow and ice are a common occurrence. Follow these simple tips when walking in the winter:

- Wear insulated boots with good rubber treads.
- Take short steps and walk more slowly to be able to react quickly in case of a slip or fall.
- Keep both hands free for balance, rather than in pockets.
- If walking on the street, walk against the traffic and as close to the curb as possible.
- Wear bright clothing or reflective gear at night.

Hazards associated with working in winter environments:

Hypothermia, frostbite, and slips and falls on snow and ice are only a few of the hazards of winter. There are many more...

- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Being struck by falling objects (icicles)
- Electrocutation because of downed power lines
- Falls from heights (shoveling snow off roofs)
- Roof collapse under heavy snow
- Dehydration
- Back injuries or heart attack while shoveling snow

Take these precautions to have a safer winter.



December events bring holiday cheer to Naples

As the song goes, "it's beginning to look a lot like Christmas everywhere you go" these days. Christmas trees, flowers, foods, holiday accessories and gifts have already flooded local shopping centers and boutiques marking the holiday season in Italy has begun. Religious festivities officially begin Dec. 8 with the commemoration of the Virgin Mary's Immaculate Conception and culminate Jan. 6 with the celebration of the Epiphany and "La Befana," the Italian folklore witch is reminiscent of St. Nicholas and Santa Claus.

Central to Christmas in Italy is the "presepio" or manger scene that becomes the major focal in homes, churches, squares and malls. Besides the festive art exhibits, Yuletide-themed ballets and concerts plus Christmas fairs jumpstart the year's merriest though most hectic season. Below is a sleigh-full of holiday programs in Naples and its environs.

Art exhibits

Caserta's "Royal Palace and Queens" exhibition showcases court pageantry

Designed to promote the Versailles-inspired and Baroque style palace and its treasures, "La Reggia e Le Regine" displays authentic royal gowns as well as film and opera costumes from the Tirelli Couture Collection. The portrait of Ferdinand IV's queen, Maria Carolina, whose regal apparel the Tirelli couturiers replicated for the occasion, sets the exhibit theme. Among the original gowns include those worn by Carolina Bonaparte, Queen Elena Savoia and a princess in Rome. The royal robes of the king and his mother in "Ludwig," Queen Elizabeth's attire in Verdi's "Don Carlos" and Princess Lamballe's flowing dress in "Marie Antoinette" are among the film and opera costumes featured. The exhibit runs until Dec. 31.

Bourbon Charles III commissioned Luigi Vanvitelli to design and build Caserta's Royal Palace in 1752 to move the Bourbon seat and protect the royal family from attacks originating from the sea. Charles' son Ferdinand IV and his mentor oversaw the project when his father left to become the king of Spain seven years later. In 1773 Charles Vanvitelli took over the project when his father passed away. Completed in 1780, the building has 1,200 rooms, 24 state apartments and a royal theater. In 1945, this is where the Germans signed the unconditional terms surrendering their troops in Italy. Moreover, the palace has been used for well-known movies: "Star Wars" I & II, "Mission Impossible III" plus "Angels and Demons."

Neapolitan Baroque art extravaganza for the holidays and beyond

On Dec. 12, Nicola Spinosa, Neapolitan Museums superintendent, will proudly present "Return to Baroque" an extensive four-month exhibition on the art form that will manifest works by Caravaggio, Francesco Solimena and the later Neapolitan Baroque period artists. Paintings, drawings, sculptures, furniture, jewelry, textiles, pottery and porcelain from public and private collections will be featured.

All Campanian Baroque art repositories can be visited following 51 suggested itineraries. Six itineraries will lead visitors to

major Neapolitan exhibits (some with long titles shortened in this article) at the following venues: Capodimonte Museum: "From Caravaggio to Francesco Solimena paintings (1606-1747)..."; St. Elmo Castle: "Restoration of 1600-1750 paintings and objects from Neapolitan churches and museum..."; San Martino Museum: "Baroque in the Certosa..."; Ceramica Duca di Martina Museum: "Neapolitan Decorative arts"; Pignatelli Museum: "Still Life: Luca Forte and Jacopo Nani and the Royal Palace: "Architecture ... from D. Fontana to F. Sanfelice."

Furthermore, the event will document the 30-year (1979 to 2009) advances in knowledge on the chronological stages of Neapolitan Baroque: Caravaggio's arrival in Naples in 1606, the presence of Luigi Vanvitelli and Ferdinando Fuga presence in Naples in 1750 and Bourbon King Charles III's departure for Spain in 1759.

Event patrons include the Italian Republic president, the prime minister, the Ministry of Heritage and Culture and the president of the Campania Region Board. Among the sponsors are the Ministry for Arts and Cultural Affairs, the Campania Region Tourism Department and the Department of Cultural Heritage, the Friends of Capodimonte and the City of Naples' Department of Tourism and Major Events, among others. Exhibit ends April 11, 2010.
