




① Burnable Waste

Pick-Up Station


Un-Recyclable—go to incinerator or dumpsite:
 Incinerate or dump: because they are unable to separate into recyclable items any more.

Pick-Up Station


Recyclable:

Waste Pick-Up Station


Recyclable—some are recyclable:

Waste Pick-Up Station


Recyclable: Cans: reprocess into new cans and other metal products.
 Bottles: reprocess into new bottles, roadbeds and other products.

Recyclable:
 Reprocess into new PET plastic bottles, synthetic fiber for garments, and other products.

Recyclable
Paper: reprocess into paper products

Place “non-burnable waste” and “PET plastic bottles” separately at the Waste Pick-Up Station.			



⑥ Papers & Clothes (Check your area's pick-up station and collection day.)

Some areas have Community-Driven Paper & Clothes Recycle System—neighbor associations and children's associations collect recyclable papers and clothes by themselves. The city collects papers and clothes for areas with no community based recycle system.


Refer to the following map for your pick-up station and collection day.

The city collects recyclable papers and clothes.

● Collection Day: Thursday

Put the waste out to the pick-up station by 8:30 am.

● Pick-Up Site: Non-burnable & Recyclable Waste Station

⑦ Bulky Waste

Call the Environmental Clean Center 046-871-7870 for collecting bulky waste.

Bulky Waste: ●Waste more than 30cm in length. Liquid is not acceptable.

(Regardless of size, do not discard “Non-burnable Waste ---ex. umbrellas, frying pans, and fluorescent bulbs” at the “Bulky Waste” collection.)

●No matter how small they are, waste listed below are Bulky Waste.

① Call the Environment Clean Center: 046-871-7870. 8:30am to 5:00pm. Monday to Friday.

●Give the officer the size, quantity, and the place where you will put the waste out.

●Get the pick-up date, and how much Bulky Waste Collection Sticker you need to buy.

② Buy SHOSHI or the Bulky Waste Collection Sticker.

●The Bulky Waste Collection Stickers or SHOSHI, are available at the designated stores and convenience stores in Zushi. You can find the ZUSHI-SHI SHOSHI HANNBAISHO sign on the storefront.

③ Put the bulky waste out in the vicinity of your house—the spot you told to the Clean Center officer

●Write your name clearly on the SHOSHI or the Bulky Waste Collection Sticker with pen. Fix tight on the front side of the waste.

List of Bulky Waste Collection Fee

The Following Items Are Not Acceptable:

Consult with the Environmental Clean Center, retailers or contractors when discarding the following items. Ask housing contractor to take care of construction waste and debris.

How to Dispose of

Air Conditioner, CRT-TV, Refrigerator, Freezer and Laundry Machine

Follow the Home Appliances Recycling Law when recycling air conditioner, CRT-TV, refrigerator, freezer and laundry machine: these items are reused after taking appropriate process.

●**Retailer:** When replacing to a new one, ask the retailer to handle the old one.

●**Retailer:** When discarding unused appliances, ask the retailer you bought from to handle them.

Fees for recycling, pick-up and transportation varies by the manufactures and retailers.

●**Manufactures' Recycle Center:** You can also take the used appliances directly to manufactures' recycle center. Buy the Home Appliances Recycle Coupon at post office and take the used appliances directly to the manufacture's recycle center.

●**The Environment Clean Center:** Make inquiries to the Environment Clean Center when you have problem contacting the retailer of your used appliances

--- ex. the retailer locates too far because you moved, the retailer closed down, or other reasons.

How To Dispose of PC

Make inquiries to the PCs manufacture, importer, seller or the Personal Computer 3R Promotion Center (03-5282-7685, <http://www.pc3r.jp>) when disposing of used PCs.

【Item】

The body, monitors (CDR and LC), laptop PCs, and accessories (ex. keyboard, mouse, wire and other regular accessories)

【Recycler】

(1) PC Manufactures: Call the PC manufacture

【Recycling Fee】

- PCs produced after October 2003: Free
- PCs produced before October 2003: ¥3,000~7,000 per unit

(2) 3R Promotion Center: Call the 3R Promotion Center 03-5282-7685 when; the PC is self-produced; or the PC manufacture, importer or seller does not exist anymore due to close down or other reasons.

【Recycling Fee】

¥4,000~9,000 per unit

【Drop Off & Pick Up】

Take your PC directly to the post office, or ask for YU-PACK (pick-up service provided by post offices).

The Environment Clean Center accepts drop-off with charge.

●Monday through Friday, 8:45~11:45 & 13:00~16:00

(Cans & Bottles: Tuesday through Friday)

●Charge: ¥6 per 1 kilogram

●Note • Separate the waste properly.

• Write your name, address, telephone number, and where the waste came from on a paper (no fixed form, any paper is OK).

■How to Dispose of Industrial Waste---wood chips, scrap papers, waste textile from construction sites:

Up to 1 ton of industrial wastes are acceptable. Make reservation 3 days prior to the drop-off.

●Fee: ¥17 per 1 kilogram
