CFC luncheon cites record contributions

Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport and its tenant commands were among other federal agencies in Rhode Island (RI) and southeastern Massachusetts (SEMA) recognized for their outstanding performance during the 2010 RI/SEMA Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) at an awards luncheon, March 23, at the Officers' Club.

Pledges and contributions from NAVSTA and its tenant commands totaled \$499,951. This sum repre-

sents almost 43 percent of the total dollars raised in Rhode Island and Southeastern Massachusetts, and more than 53 percent of the total dollars raised in Rhode Island.

Overall, the 2010 RI/SEMA CFC pledges and contributions totaled \$1.16 million, an extraordinary accomplishment, and a more than 3.5 percent increase in giving above the 2009 campaign, officials said.

"This is the fourth year that we have raised at least one million dollars," said Vincent Marzullo, chair-

man, Local Federal Coordinating Committee. The 2007 RI/SEMA CFC raised over one million dollars; 2008, \$1.1 million; and 2009, \$1.127 million.

Data from the 2010 Campaign, provided by Elizabeth Comeau, director, 2010 RI/SEMA CFC, showed a donor participation rate of 28.3 percent. A total of 5,168 contributors out of a total of 18,258 federal civilian, military, and postal employees raised \$1,166,330. The average donation was \$225.

Author says China learning lessons from U.S. seapower

Bernard "Bud" Cole has written a second edition to his well-received book, *The Great Wall at Sea: China's Navy in the Twenty-First Century*. In a most informative session, he presented his research to a standing room only crowd at the

Naval War College Museum's Eight Bells Lecture held on March 28.

Well-grounded in the issues associated with the People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN), Cole set the stage by listing the national security goals for China and then discussed the concerns PLAN has over the issues of Taiwan, the South China Sea, and the

Sea Lanes of Communication (SLOCs).

Taiwan is only 81 nautical miles from China at its closest point of approach. It lies within what is considered the "first island chain" for China. Yet, more significantly, China considers most of the South

China Sea to be within its territory, he said. This extends well beyond Taiwan and encompasses the major sea lanes that go from the Strait of Malacca to Southeast Asia and beyond.

Cole said that China has

Rear Adm. Wisecup, family unveil official NWC portrait

Tradition continues to be an integral aspect of the change of command process at the Naval War College. Rear Adm. James P. 'Phil' Wisecup, the 52nd president of the Naval War College, was joined by family and friends at an informal gathering to unveil his por-

trait on March 29.

Professor John Hattendorf, chairman of the Maritime History Department and director for the Naval War College Museum, opened the ceremony by explaining the tradition of the portrait and how the NWC president was only one of four positions in the Navy to be honored with such distinction.

In order to grasp a sense of the details involved in creating a portrait, the artist, Gerald York, spoke on his desire to "capture the essence of the subject in a timeless presence." This encouraged him to use the portrait of Commodore Stephen B. Luce, the founder of the Naval War College, as inspi-

SWOS graduates 15 officers from CIC watch course

Fifteen naval officers from Colombia, Peru, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Tunisia, Trinidad-Tobago and Uruguay were graduated from the three-week Combat Information Center Watch Officer (CICWO) Course at International Surface Warfare Officers School (ISWOS) on April 1.

The ISWOS program is designed to foster international cooperation and prepare officers to serve at sea through professional education and knowledge sharing. ISWOS mission falls in line with the Chief of Naval Operations guidance (2011) of establishing international relationships to increase security and achieve common interests in the maritime domain.

During their three week stay at SWOS, students are immersed in the school's mission of preparing officers to serve at sea.

The CICWO course emphasizes multi-threat warfare, Combat Information Center equipment, special maneuvering, and navigation. Upon completion of this rigorous course, students are prepared to plan, coordinate, and manage the supervision of all Combat Information Center operations and training during routine peacetime steaming.

Additionally, students use state-of-the-art conning officer virtual environment and full mission bridge simulators to gain

greater understanding of ship handling.

Students share facilities and instructors with American students and, like their American counterparts, use the same state-of-the-art classrooms and high-tech virtual reality trainers. Technology is used to broaden their surface warfare knowledge, and ranges from basic seamanship to complex maritime operations.

Social and cultural events are included in the curriculum. Each student had a SWOS staff sponsor assigned, introducing them to American culture and fostering personal relationships. During their free time, sponsors hosted students in their homes, took them to movies, and experienced American culture in the local area in a more informal setting.

Students also participate in field service programs designed to promote understanding of American society, its institutions, ideals and the overarching commitment to basic principles of human rights.

Trips included lectures at Salve Regina University, socials with the U.S. Naval War College International students, and Newport history and mansions tour.

The mission of ISWOS is simple – it creates the foundation for building trust through knowledge sharing for the purposes of international partnership and global security.



War College changes helm

Rear Adm. John N. Christenson relieved Rear Adm. James P. 'Phil' Wisecup as president of the U.S. Naval War College (NWC) during a change of command ceremony at Naval Station Newport on March 30.

Guest speaker, Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. Gary Roughead, praised Wisecup's accomplishments during his tenure and welcomed Christenson as the 53rd NWC president.

"(Rear Adm. Wisecup) has brought to the Naval War College the valuable perspective of an operator who understands the world of policy, and he inherently understands how these initiatives further the development of our nation's leaders, not just our Navy's," said Roughead. "We will need critical thinkers for the tests we face, and (Wisecup) has set about building them here in Newport with unmatched ingenuity and drive."

Wisecup assumed command of NWC on Nov. 6, 2008, and led the college through a period of program expansion and increased international engagement. Roughead described the growth in quality and range of opera-

tional courses that filled a critical professional need for the Navy. Wisecup's leadership reinvigorated the Navy's Global Title X War Game series and in 2009 executed the most successful International Seapower Symposium, where 100 nations and 92 chiefs of service gathered in Newport to cultivate global maritime partnerships.

Wisecup will report to his next assignment as the Navy's Inspector General, and he has been confirmed for appointment to the rank of vice admiral.

During his career, Wisecup also served as commander, Carrier Strike Group Seven (Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group); commander, U.S. Naval Forces Korea; and as director of the White House Situation Room. He is a 1998 graduate of NWC's resident academic program.

Wisecup read his orders and ordered his flag hauled down before relinquishing command to Christenson, who recently left his position as president of the Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV)

"You were assigned there to make a difference," Roughead said as he thanked Christenson for the change he drove at INSURV to re-institute the engineering approach to

the Fleet's condition. "There is no one better suited to take up this awesome responsibility here in Newport and move forward from where (Rear Adm. Wisecup) has left off."

During Christenson's 30-year career, he has served as commander of Carrier Strike Group 12 (Enterprise Carrier Strike Group), and he has deployed eight times on seven different ships.

Ashore, his more recent assignments include commanding officer of the Surface Warfare Officers School. He is a 1993 NWC graduate.



A goal of \$450,000 was set for NAVSTA and its tenant commands for the Newport 2010 CFC drive.

Thirteen Navy commands and two Coast Guard commands at NAVSTA were recognized in five award categories. The CFC awards program recognizes level of participation, and level of continued participation.

Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) received a Platinum Award for an increase in total dollars raised and for exceeding the average donation by 50 percent. NUWC employees raised \$265,469, a 2.28 percent increase above their

2009 Campaign total. The average donation was \$495 per donor.

Naval Justice School received a Platinum Award for a 318 percent increase in total dollars raised above their 2009 Campaign total. NJS employees raised \$8,071. The average donation was \$538.

Command Leadership School (CLS) received a Platinum Award for exceeding the average participation rate and for a 1.25 percent increase above their 2009 Campaign total. CLS employees raised \$4,450. The average donation was \$371.

Marine Corps Detach-

ment (MARDET), Newport, received a Platinum Award for a 100 percent participation rate and for a 661 percent increase in pledges above their 2009 campaign total. MARDET Newport personnel raised \$1,993.

learned lessons over the last half-century by watching the United States and how it has executed its foreign policies. In those situations that involved a buildup of forces to enforce those policies, such as the Taiwan Straits Crisis of 1996, China witnessed the value of sea power and airpower as determining factors in resolving disputes or enforcing one's will.

China is not building its navy as a ship-for-ship challenge to the United States, Cole said. The biggest growth it has shown has been with coastal boats (missile) and its submarine force. More importantly to the professional growth of the PLAN, with

the tempo of maritime operations increasing, so has the state of training within the PLAN. China's 21st Century strategy at sea recognizes that it must be able to defend itself economically, in the near seas now and the far seas later, he said.

Rodney Watterson, who wrote *32 in '44*, spoke yesterday in the lecture series.

On April 28, the book, *China, the United States and 21st-Century Sea Power*, will be discussed by the editors, Professors Andrew Erickson, Lyle Goldstein and Nan Li. For more information, contact the Museum at 841-2101.
