# Navy Band Northeast entertains at Fleet Week NYC

Navy Band Northeast (NBNE) performed during the 2011 Fleet Week New York celebration, May 25 to 31, entertaining a nationwide television audience on two networks, plus

tourists and city residents who heard them play in Times Square.

The Northeast Navy Showband and the band's popular rock group, Rhode Island Sound, both entertained uptown.

NBNE's Ceremonial Band performed May 25 at the west side pier during sever-

al network news broadcasts covering the Parade of Ships; for a television segment during NBC's *Today Show* on May 29 at Rockefeller Center; and for the Fox Network's *Fox and Friends* broadcast on May 30.

The band performed concerts in all five of the

New York City boroughs: Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, The Bronx and Staten Island. NYC is one of the largest cities in the world with an estimated population of 8.3 million.

Components of NBNE that performed during Fleet Week included the Pops Ensemble, the North-

east Navy Showband, Rhode Island Sound, the Top Brass quintet, the woodwind quintet, the Flute and Piano Duo, vocal and guitar duo, and the ceremonial/marching band.

The band performed a wide range of music from patriotic and contemporary, to big band swing,

country and the latest top-40 hits.

"This is one of the highlights of the year for us," said Senior Chief Musician Gregory Dudzienski, band assistant director.

The Ceremonial Band marched in the annual

## 69 years ago, Japanese handed defeat at Midway

WASHINGTON – On June 4, 1942, six months after the attack on Pearl Harbor, Japan attempted to invade Hawaii with an attack on Midway Atoll. Midway would give Japan access to Hawaii, home of the U.S. Pacific Fleet and a possible outpost to watch any future threat by the U.S.

Japan's plan was to lure U.S. carriers south of Midway while a Japanese carrier force surprised them from the north. Japanese intelligence led them to believe only two carriers would be near Midway at that time: the USS *Hornet* and USS *Enterprise*.

U.S. intelligence had broken the Japanese naval code enabling them to determine exactly when the attack

would take place and predict the location.

Rear Adm Raymond Spruance commanded Task Force 16, formed around USS *Hornet* and USS *Enterprise*. USS *Yorktown*, damaged in an earlier battle, was rushed through yard repairs. Rear Adm. Frank Jack Fletcher commanded Task Force 17 formed around *Yorktown*.

The three-day battle began with U.S. Army bombers and U.S. Marine Corps torpedo planes and dive bombers leaving Midway to attack the approaching enemy. U.S. carriers and aircraft sunk four of Japan's carriers, a heavy cruiser and three destroyers. They also shot down almost 300 air-

## Captain, Blue Crew visit from USS Rhode Island

PORTSMOUTH — The commanding officer and four members of the Blue Crew of the strategic missile submarine USS Rhode Island (SSBN-740) arrived in Rhode Island on Wednesday for a namesake state visit.

The Blue Crew is under the command of Cmdr. Douglas Adams, who accompanied the enlisted members.

The submarine is based in Kings Bay, Ga., but was built by General Dynamics-Electric Boat in Groton, Conn., where she was christened July 17, 1993. The boat was commissioned July 9, 1994, at the former Naval Education and Training Center, Newport.

Adams and the crewmen spoke at the Portsmouth Middle School on Thursday. The fifth-graders of Mrs. Cindy Jilling's classes, as well as some other fifth grade classes, have written letters to both the Blue and the Gold Crews over the past eight years.

Adams and the crewmen spoke about the operation of the submarine, as well as their various jobs and responsibilities on board,

and then answered questions.

For the first time Adams and crew also visited the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Center's Lighthouse After School Academy on Thursday.

The academy teaches second through sixth grade pupils.

Previously, Portsmouth cub scout packs and Boy Scout troops have also communicated with the submarine crew members, as well as adults and children of The First Presbyterian Church in Newport.

In the past the crews have also received letters from

students at the Cranston Calvert School in Newport as well as from the students in the Smithfield and North Smithfield elementary and middle Schools.

The Friends of the USS Rhode Island will sponsor a dinner for the captain and crew tonight at the Officers' Club in Newport. The crew will receive a proclamation from Newport Mayor Stephen Waluk declaring Friday, June 3, 2011, as USS Rhode Island Day.

# Paralympics to return in July

For the third consecutive summer, Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport will host the U.S. Olympic Committee (USOC) Paralympic Military Sports Camp at various venues around the complex from July 15 to 19.

The USOC Paralympic Military Program provides post-rehabilitation support

and mentoring to American servicemen and women who've sustained physical injuries such as traumatic brain injury, spinal cord injury, amputation, visual impairment/blindness and stroke. Veterans are introduced to adaptive sport techniques and opportunities through clinics and camps and are also connected with ongoing Paralympic sports programs in

their hometowns.

Participants will have the opportunity to try a variety of sports, such as archery, swimming, volleyball, strength and conditioning, table tennis, shooting, sailing, and track and field with other paralympic athletes. They will be assisted by professional and volunteer coaches.

With the exception of sailing, all of the events will take place onboard NAVSTA

Newport at venues including Nimitz Field, Prichard Field, Kay Hall, Gym 109, the McCool Track and the Lt. Michael Murphy Combat Training Pool.

As in years past, many volunteers will be needed to assist throughout the camp. Groups will be organized to help meet and greet the participants as





Arthur J. Peckham Sr., 89, was probably the oldest veteran to participate in Memorial Day ceremonies sponsored by Conover-Leary VFW Post 4487 of Middletown outside Town Hall last Monday morning.

The United States lost the USS Yorktown, USS Hammann and 145 aircraft before the battle was over. Thanks to America's Signals Intelligence, aircraft carrier tactics along with the determination and courage of pilots and crews, the United States handed Japan a defeat.

The victory at the Battle of Midway was the turning point of the war in the Pacific and emphasized the power of sea-born aircraft. The Battle of Midway set the stage for the carrier-based Navy of today.

# Blue Angels commander relieved

From Commander, Naval Air Forces Public Affairs

PENSACOLA (NNS) — The commanding officer of the Naval Flight Demonstration Squadron was relieved of command by chief of naval air training May 27.

Cmdr. Dave Koss requested that Rear Adm. Bill Sizemore relieve him of his command following a lower-than-normal maneuver during the team's last performance at the Lynchburg Regional Air Show May 22.

"With deep personal regret I shared with my command today that I will be voluntarily leaving the greatest flight demonstration team," said Koss. "I performed a maneuver that had an unacceptably low minimum altitude.

Koss will be replaced by the previous Blue Angels' commanding officer, Capt. Greg McWherter, for the duration of the season.

This move requires the cancellation of the Blue Angels' scheduled performances at the Rockford Airfest this weekend, and the Evansville Freedom Festival Air Show June 11-12.

The Blue Angels will remain in Pensacola for additional training and air show demonstration practice. Any potential changes to the team's future schedule will be announced at a later date.

They are scheduled for the R.I. Air National Guard Show at Quonset on June 25-26.
