

Devil Docs defend Captain's Cup

The Naval Station Newport Commanding Officer's Captain's Cup will remain at the Naval Health Clinic New England, Newport, for another year.

The defending champions, the Devil Docs, beat out three other teams in the annual Captain's Challenge Cup. The Surface Warfare Officers School Command, took second place; the 443rd Civil Affairs Battalion, U.S. Army Reserves, third; and the Naval Justice School, fourth, in competition held on Nimitz Field and the McCool Track.

Events consisted of a tug-of-war; 6-on-6 football; a 6-by-200 relay race; and field challenges.

This was the third year of competition. Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Newport Public Works, won in 2009, with NHCNE winning in 2010 and this year.

Lt. Aaron Borgmeyer, Department Head of Healthcare Business Operations at NHCNE, said, "It was great to see the other commands take advantage of this unique opportunity that Naval Station Newport provided us for esprit de corps. All the teams performed well and should be commended for their efforts."

Capt. Joseph Voboril, Commanding Officer, NAVSTA, presented the cup to the victorious "Docs" at the end of the competition. The Captain's Cup competition is meant as a friendly challenge to get representatives from various commands throughout the installation together to have some fun.

Capt. Neil Parrott, Commanding Officer of the Surface Warfare Officers School Command, stopped by the field to cheer on his team.

"As good sports we were cheering on the first place winners, who clearly earned the cup for the second year in a row," he said.

Relative to his command's second place finish (and to loosely quote Arnold Schwatzenegger) Capt. Parrott said (or perhaps threatened), "We'll be back!"

As winners, NHCNE will organize the event next year. They are threatening to prepare a permanent case for this trophy, so commands: start training!

Not all ID cards carry same weight

There are many great benefits to working and having access to Naval Station Newport, but sometimes there is a bit of confusion as to who is entitled to use which facilities once through the main gate.

The Naval Station is open to all individuals in receipt of officially issued Department of Defense Identification Cards. Having entry, however, does NOT entitle an individual to use all facilities.

Following is a listing of the types of ID cards issued and what they entitle the individual to use:

Active Duty Common Access Card (CAC) – issued to active duty members and reserve (drilling). This card grants access privileges to Naval Health Clinic New England (NHCNE); Commissary; Navy Exchange (NEX) and ALL MWR facilities. These personnel are also entitled to use the Ney Hall Galley (only active duty military and DoD Civilians on-orders are entitled to eat at the Galley)

DD Form 2 ACT (Green Card) – issued to inactive ready reserves. Grants access to the Commissary;

NEX and ALL MWR facilities.

DD Form 1173-1 (Red Card) – issued to reserve dependents. Grants access to the Commissary; NEX and ALL MWR facilities.

DD Form 1173 (Tan Card) – issued to active duty and active duty reserve dependents. It grants access to NHCNE; Commissary; NEX and ALL MWR facilities.

DD Form 2RET (Blue/Tan) – issued to all retired military members. Grants access to NHCNE; Commissary, NEX and ALL MWR facilities.

DoD Civilian Employee ID Card – issued to Department of Defense Civilian Employees. Grants access to ALL MWR facilities. DoD civilians are NOT entitled to use the Commissary, NEX or Ney Hall Galley (unless on official orders to the base).

DoD Contractor ID Card – similar in appearance to the DoD civilian ID card but with a green stripe, is issued to contractors. Contractors are entitled to use all Category B and C facilities.

Special Olympians sail for the gold at NAVSTA

Beautiful and typically unpredictable Newport weather was the setting for the 16th annual Special Olympics Rhode Island (SORI) Sailing Regatta last weekend north of the Pell Bridge in Narragansett Bay.

The regatta was hosted by the Surface Warfare Officers School Command at Naval Station Newport, and drew 23 teams from four states. They mustered at the NAVSTA Marina to sail the Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department's Rhodes 19 fleet in 14 highly competitive races.

The Rhode Island Salty Dawgs capped off their season by winning four gold, four silver and two bronze medals.

Unified teams, consisting of two Special Olympians and two skilled sailing partners, from Rhode Island, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Virginia (with the help of one Maryland athlete) sailed in three levels of competition depending upon the athletes' abilities.

The opening ceremonies were emceed by Chief Engineman (SW) Aaron Gordon, SWOSCOLCOM, the military volunteer coordinator and 2011 SORI Volunteer of

the year. The program began with the Parade of Athletes led by the SWOSCOLCOM honor guard and Navy Band Northeast's ceremonial band.

The Special Olympics torch was lit by Rhode Island Salty Dawgs' Maryellen Powers, Vijay Rao and Ben Lang with the help of medical volunteer Greg Jones.

The Special Olympics Oath, "Let me win, but if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt," was led by R.I. athlete Henry Moretti.

Capt. Neil Parrott, Commanding Officer, SWOSCOLCOM and Skipper of Salty Dawgs Team No. 5, welcomed the teams with his rousing opening address. Regatta honorary chairperson Casey Kirwin declared the games open and the racing got underway.

Winds were typical for southern New England, with light winds on Saturday

and blustery winds on Sunday that swung around from the northeast.

Races were held in three heats both days and went off without a hitch. Sunday's races were especially exhilarating with teams harnessing the strong winds and racing for the gold. Races were coordinated by the Race Committee led by Coasters' Harbor Navy Yacht Club mem-

Hydrant flushing scheduled



Air Force marks 64th anniversary

Students, faculty and guests of the U.S. Naval War College (NWC) marked the U.S. Air Force's 64th birthday with a ceremony on the college's Colbert Plaza, on Sept. 16.

Air Force Maj. Gen. Jay Lindell, director of the Air Force's Global Power Programs, delivered a keynote speech highlighting the achievements of the Air Force in its six-decade history.

"It was a simple stroke of a pen on the National Security Act," Lindell said. "It not only created the separate Air Force but laid the foundation for the modern Air Force, the most powerful in the world."

The Air Force was a branch of the Army known as the Army Air Corps. But President Harry Truman changed that forever when he signed the National Security Act of 1947 on Sept. 16.

Combat missions make only a fraction of its current abilities. Since the founding of the service, Airmen have engaged in warfare, humanitarian missions,

and military supply chain management. Furthermore, the Air Force serves as a critical component in combat zone medical evacuations, saving countless lives of American service members and its allies and friends.

"Although a lot has changed since 1947, one thing has not," Lindell said. "Airmen are the heart of our Air Force. The swiftest planes, the most powerful satellites are nothing without the people who drive them."

Lindell commented that the Air Force has about 30,000 airmen deployed around the globe and delivers more than half a million gallons of fuel every day to sustain military operations.

In an informal gathering after the ceremony in which attendees enjoyed a birthday cake and surrounded themselves in USAF memorabilia, several students shared memories of their careers.

NWC is host to about 70 active duty Air Force officer students and faculty as well as veterans.


