Assessment of turbines ongoing at Navy sites

Naval Station Newport (NAVSTA) began an Environmental Assessment (EA) last January for the development of wind energy facilities onboard the installation. At the community open house held Jan. 27, NAVSTA estimated a completion date of August 2011 for the EA by the publication of a notice summarizing the results.

NAVSTA is still collecting data to complete the EA and expects to have all necessary studies completed by the February/March 2012 timeframe.

The need to complete various consultations with local, state and other agencies is requiring more time than originally expected. The EA is evaluating 12 sites for potential use in the erection of wind turbines that would generate 9 megawatts of electricity – the base load electric consumption at NAVSTA.

The individual studies that support the EA include the evaluation of Bird and Bat Biological surveys, an assessment and comments on the possible effects to the viewshed from historic sites, Avian Radar Surveys, a noise and shadow flicker study, an assessment on the effects to marine mammals, and an archeological survey on each of the sites to ensure our native American heritage is not disturbed.

The NAVSTA Public Affairs Office will announce when the EA is complete and will make the results available on a publicly accessible website. Anyone with questions may call 841-3538.

NBNE was recognized for its Personal Excellence Partnership Flagship educational outreach program with Northeast area schools to educate students in instrumental and chorale music, and provide professional assistance to school music educators while representing the Navy as a valuable educational resource.

The goal of the Navy's Personal Excellence Partnership Flagship community relations (COMREL) program is to develop youth from preschool to high school to their fullest potential in the areas of education, healthy lifestyles, and civic responsibility. Navy personnel (including military, civilians and family members) volunteer time toward tutoring and mentoring youth in subjects such as reading, writing, mathematics, science, health, and personal safety.

SWOS was recognized for its Health, Safety, and Fitness Flagship COMREL program that supported Special Olympics Rhode Island in its year round special Olympian athletic programs that include the sailing regatta, bowling, and the winter and summer games programs.

The goal of the Navy's Health, Safety, and Fitness Flagship COMREL program is to promote, teach, and encourage healthy and active lifestyles through initiatives including athletic and recreational events.

Medical Home uses teamwork

Patients and beneficiaries have probably noticed a few changes in the Family Medicine area of Naval Health Clinic New England.

Staff members have moved to new office and clinic spaces for the implementation of Medical Home and the formation of Medical Home teams. Patients will be assigned to a Primary Care Manager (PCM) and a team of nurses, corpsmen and support staff for all health care

needs.

At NHCNE there will be two Medical Home teams: the Blue and the Gold. Also joining the services of the teams will be clinical support staff from Behavioral Health and Wellness Health educators, a pharmacist and case manager to answer questions and provide timely counseling and support. These additional and personalized services will build a stronger relationship between patients and their Medical Home team.

USAJOBS redesigned

From Department of the Navy Office of Civilian Human Resources

WASHINGTON (NNS) — The USAJOBS system was shut down Oct. 7-12 to undergo a major upgrade designed to improve the applicant's experience when seeking federal job opportunities.

During the system down time, the Office of Personnel Management transferred nearly five billion rows of data from the current system. Included in the data transfer were 16.6 million job seeker accounts, 19.8 million resumes and 8.4 million supporting application documents.

Jean Mercer, director of Human Resources Systems and Business Transformation for the Department of the Navy (DON), said that job vacancies were not being posted during this time to allow for the necessary maintenance to USAJOBS system.

However, this did not impact those positions that have already closed or interrupt the hiring processes that have begun, said Mercer.

"We understand that the upgraded USAJOBS system will streamline account management and improve search capabilities for our job applicants."

USAJOBS is the one-stop source for posting and receiving applications for all DON job announce-

Breast cancer awareness emphasized

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. According to the American Cancer Society (ACS), close to 200,000 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed among women in the United States this year, making breast cancer the second leading cause of cancer death among women, after lung cancer.

Breast cancer is a malignant tumor that grows in one or both of the breasts and usually develops in the ducts or lobules, also known as the milk-producing areas of the breast.

Although African-American women have a slightly lower incidence of breast cancer after age 40 than Caucasian women, they have a slightly higher incidence rate of breast cancer before age 40. Breast cancer is much less common in males; by comparison, the disease is about 100 times more common among women.

Early detection is a key element in successfully finding and curing breast cancer before it can become a metastatic cancer (spreading to other parts of the body). The ACS recommends that women at age 40 begin yearly mammogram screening if they are at average risk of breast cancer. Where there is family history of breast cancer, starting

the mammogram process may occur earlier.

Dr. Angela Feyerabend, a radiologist for 20 years, and Elizabeth Amiot, a radiology technologist, have worked together at NHCNE for the last eight years. They have perfected the teamwork involved in the X-ray process and the reading of mammograms.

Their teamwork is the major reason 75 percent of NHCNE's mammograms are ready in less than two hours, and most while the patient is present. This prevents the unnecessary anxiety that comes with waiting to hear if a mammogram is normal or not,

NFAAS verification essential

Per NAVADMIN 275/11 all Navy personnel have been requested to verify/update their address and contact information in NFAAS (Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System) by Oct. 30. It is mandatory for military personnel to update their information and highly encouraged for civilians to participate.

NFAAS is a crucial tool for personnel accountability in the event of an emergency/disaster. The link to

To successfully enroll or verify, there are a couple of tasks you should perform on the "My Info" tab of each person's "Full Profile." Each of these steps should be performed on the "Contact Information" section AND the "Family Member Info" section.

Review address and contact (email/phone) information (on the "Contact Information" Section and the "Family Member Infor-

mation" Section)

1. If everything is correct click the "Verify Info as Current" button. (Should be done for each family member, too).

2. If the information is incorrect please click the "Edit" button and correct the information and save it. (If family member data is the same, make sure to click the checkboxes for all that the information applies to). Unfortunately, address information can ONLY be verified and/or

updated when logging in with a Common Access Card (CAC) or user name and password.

If "Personal Information" was used to log in, only their contact information will be updated and it WON'T verify (track) that their address information is correct.

Please log in with one of the other methods and follow the steps above to ensure your changes/verification is tracked.





and it gets patients that need follow-on testing scheduled without delay.

"Having the right technology is important; having experienced, talented staff professionals is also essential. But the real key to providing superior diagnostic imaging services is having that synergy between the right technology and right skilled professionals that manifests itself through amazing teamwork and excellent customer service," said Mark Schellenberg, NHCNE radiology program adviser.

The NHCNE Radiology Department does approximately 1,200 mammograms a year. The national average of detecting cancer from the mammogram is 2 to 10 cancers per 1,000 mammograms. Newport averages 4 to 5 cancers per 1,000, due in part to a younger and healthier population served.

Schellenberg greatly admires the efforts of Amiot and Feyerabend, and he is confident that there is a long line of NHCNE patients that would back him up on this.

In fact, he wishes every woman he knows was eligible to have her mammograms performed and read at NHCNE.


