SECNAV stresses maritime accord by allied nations

Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus addressed the world's maritime leaders at the 20th International Seapower Symposium (ISS) at the Naval War College on Oct. 20.

The secretary stressed the importance of maritime cooperation and global presence as nations work to manage a plethora of shared challenges, such as combating piracy, regional security, ensuring the free flow of commerce, peacekeeping and providing humanitarian assistance.

Additionally, he said, these issues must be met during an era of fiscal limitations.


"One of the challenges to every one of our countries has been economic, fiscal," Mabus said. "My

government, virtually all governments, is wrestling with matching resources with requirements.

"But despite those challenges one thing should be very clear: the United States Navy is and will continue to be a global presence, wherever and whenever we are called upon," Mabus said.

Mabus noted that since the first ISS more than 40 years ago, the world has become increasingly inter-connected. And despite amazing advances in technology, he said, more than 90 percent of trade goes by sea, and 95 percent of telecommunications resources remain under the oceans.

To ensure common approaches to shared issues, the world's navies continue to work and train together in a variety

of global military exercises, Mabus said.

"These ongoing exercises around the world serve to strengthen our common partnerships," he said, adding that nations need to seek new ways to work together.

"Energy and security are increasingly affecting how the world looks at its relationships," he said, stressing that finding

alternative fuel resources is one key way that nations can continue to collaborate.

In working together, the world's navies share a common seagoing heritage that should serve to continue to build upon maritime cooperation and collective global presence.

CNO says effort by partnerships cut piracy 70%

Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Jonathan W. Greenert welcomed the world's maritime leaders to the 20th International Seapower Symposium (ISS) which was held last week at the Naval War College.

Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus addressed the delegates Oct. 20.

In his remarks, Greenert stressed that success in addressing common maritime issues — such as piracy, terrorism, curtailing the trafficking of weapons of mass destruction, and enforcing fisheries boundaries — will come only with maritime cooperation.

"These are enduring issues," Greenert said. "The success [of these operations] is going to be, and has to be, collective."

Noting that piracy in the Gulf of Aden has decreased by 70 percent since 2009, Greenert said nations must continue to enhance partnerships through naval

exercises and symposia such as the ISS. "These exercises and partnership are really a testament to progress," he said.

By learning, training, and working together, nations will increase maritime domain awareness, which will lead to increased trust among leaders. And that, he said, will allow nations to more speedily work to contain conflicts before they escalate.

"If we trust each other, things will move fast. We'll have that speed that's necessary to be able to react," said Greenert, noting that much of the cooperative focus should be on future leaders of the world's navies.

"They'll be where we are today. The friendships they develop today will endure for many years."

In taped remarks to the ISS, Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta noted that the symposium is the largest gathering of naval leaders in history.

Challenges in education for military child detailed

WARWICK – The R. I. National Guard, in conjunction with Gov. Lincoln D. Chafee, Sen. Sheldon Whitehouse, D-R.I., and R.I. Department of Education Commissioner Deborah Gist, hosted the Military Child Education Coalition last Tuesday which provided important research and experience-based training to state educators.

The presentation, entitled, "Living In The New Normal: Helping Children Thrive Through Good & Challenging Times" was held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, and was attended by 40 educators from throughout the state.

The Military Child Education Coalition is a worldwide non-profit organization dedicated to assisting military families and their children with issues related to mobility, separation, transition, trauma and post-deployment reintegration.

Among the speakers was Capt. Joe Voboril, Commanding Officer, Naval Station Newport.

"It's encouraging to see the governor, Sen. Whitehouse and Commis-

sioner Gist come out in support of our military children," he said. "This practicum will give schools the tools they need to help our kids with the stress of the frequent transitions and separations they face."

Rhode Island school systems serve nearly 6,000 school-age military dependents. The majority of their parents belong to the Rhode Island National Guard, which, with more than 3,200 members having accomplished 5,400 individual deployments since 9/11, has the second highest per-capita deployment rate of the country's 54 states and territories.

Included in the total are approximately 1,700 children of active duty service-members assigned to one of the 50 tenant commands or schools on board Naval Station Newport. Additionally, there are a smaller number of Coast Guard dependents stationed around the state as well as reserve units from the Army, Navy, and Marine Corps.







Practicum training focused on giving educators the awareness, knowledge, skills and resources to provide informed and effective sensitivity and support to Rhode Island's joint service military children, while working to develop state-wide and local networks of support incorporating school, community, and military programs and resources.

"Reality, as we have come to know it in the military today, is a challenging and stressful world of multiple deployments" noted Major Gen. Kevin R. McBride, state adjutant general and commanding general of RING. "These deployments not only challenge our Soldiers and Airmen, but most notably, our families. We will adopt any and all initiatives which focus on mak-

ing these separations less stressful for our families, and especially for our military children who are deserving of our best efforts," said McBride.

"Our service members and their families make tremendous sacrifices to defend our nation, and it can be particularly difficult for children to cope with repeated deployments and the absence of a parent," said Sen. "There's a common bond that exists between Sailors," he said. "Because, in many ways, we are one culture. We share a tradition two millennia in the making."

More than 110 nations, with many of the senior-most officers from their navy or coast guard, attended the biennial event. With 75 heads of navy and 22 heads of coast guard, its marked as the largest meeting of naval leaders in the conference's history.

The theme of this year's symposium was "Security and Prosperity Through Maritime Partnerships." As part of the event, three panel discussions focused on how maritime security prevents disruptions that adversely impact national, regional, and global prosperity: "Global Perspective: Challenges to Maritime Security," "Beyond MDA

(maritime domain awareness): Building Responsive Partnerships," and "Maritime Security: Evolving Demands, Adaptive Partnerships."

Many of the delegates toured the Navy's littoral combat ship, USS Independence (LCS 2), which was visiting Naval Station Newport in conjunction with ISS.

"That kind of ship is a major part of the future of our Navy and of all navies," Mabus said, pointing out that the Independence is fast, agile, operates with a smaller crew and can perform operations in both shallow and deep waters.

First held in 1969, ISS has become the largest gathering of maritime leaders in history. ISS provides a forum for the world's maritime leaders to discuss common maritime challenges.

NUWC to build periscope tower and sensor labs

NUWC Newport Public Affairs

MIDDLETOWN — The Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) Division Newport will conduct a groundbreaking ceremony for a new \$20.7 million Electromagnetic Sensor Facility on Monday at noon in the former Fleet Parking Lot across from Naval Station Newport's Gate 17.

R.I. Gov. Lincoln D. Chafee, Sen. Jack Reed, D-R.I., Sen. Sheldon Whitehouse, D-R.I., and U.S. Rep. David Cicilline, D-R.I., are expected to attend.

When completed, the 54,000 square foot facility will include six laboratories and a five-story periscope tower designed to repair and certify

periscopes, submarine communications systems, electronic warfare equipment, and imaging/optical systems. The new building will provide space for both personnel and equipment for prototyping, acquisition and production support, as well as in-service engineering and test functions.

The building will replace the current facility on Naval Station Newport's Pier 2, which is scheduled for removal. When completed, the building will be NUWC Newport's first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified building designed to achieve LEED-New Construction Gold Certification.


