base, we have many on-base activities taking place throughout the summer.

Today at 1 p.m. is a lecture at the Naval War College commemorating what many call the turning point of the War in the Pacific 70 years ago – the Battle of Mid-

way. This lecture is open to anyone with base access, and I encourage all of you to attend. Our naval history is something of which we should be proud, and we will spend a lot of time over the next two years remembering as the Navy celebrates the War of 1812.

On Monday morning, June 4, if the weather cooperates, we will gather on Dewey Field, Coasters' Harbor Island, at 7:45 a.m. to conduct colors together and lay a wreath to commemorate the Battle of Midway. Again, anyone with routine access to the base is

invited.

May and now June are months filled with graduation ceremonies and again, NAVSTA is no exception. Earlier in May we celebrated the accomplishments of 223 Naval Academy Prep School midshipmen candidates as they finished up their year of intensive academic, military, and physical studies in preparation for attending the United States Naval Academy later this summer. On June 15, the base will be a hive of activity as over 500 members of the Navy, Marine Corps, Army and Air Force, as well as international

officers and federal government employees, accept their diplomas from the Naval War College under a tent on Dewey Field. These two graduations are by far the largest graduation ceremonies we hold annually, but we should all take great pride in the accomplishments of the thousands of other students who successfully complete their training at other commands and schools including the Naval Justice School, Surface Warfare Officers School, Officer Training Command, Marine

MSRON 8 returns from deployment

Maritime Expeditionary Security Squadron 8 (MSRON Eight) at Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport welcomed home 276 mission personnel from its six-month deployment to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and 35 from deployment to Kuwait/Bahrain yesterday at 4 a.m. at Kay Hall.

Lt. Cmdr. Brent J. Embry, Executive Officer, said the men and women arrived about 2:30 a.m. on Thursday at T.F. Green Airport in Warwick, loaded with their gear on buses and headed to Newport. Close to 300 family members and loved ones met the seven buses when they arrived at 4:45 a.m.

Capt. Keith Bruce, Commanding Officer, MSRON Eight; and Capt. Robert Perry, Deputy Commodore, Maritime Expeditionary Security Group Two, gave brief remarks so the Sailors could reunite with their families as soon as possible.

MSRON 8 deployed overseas last Nov. 1 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

The squadron assumed the duties and responsibilities as Commander, Task Group (CTG) 56.7 in the UAE with two subordinate task units located at the ports of Jebel Ali and Fujairah.

During this period, MSRON 8 successfully conducted landward and seaward security missions for 229 port visits of Navy, Army, Coast Guard, Maritime Sealift Command (MSC) and coalition naval vessels.

In addition to protecting U.S. and coalition assets:

— MSRON 8 medical personnel initiated a medical fleet support program to the benefit of Navy combatants and U.S. naval service auxiliaries.

— MSRON 8 planned and executed Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection and Distinguished Visitor protective services in support of Commander, Carrier Strike Group Three's hosting of the Dubai Air Show multinational reception.

Supply School graduates 46 'ready for sea'

Forty-six students from the Navy Supply Corps School, Second Battalion, Bravo Company; and 76th Company Navy Reserves, graduated May 25 and were certified "ready for sea."

Thirty students will be serving in active duty billets while 16 will be serving in Navy Reserve billets across the country.

The Basic Qualification course is an in-depth study of the Supply System encompassing the following major areas of an afloat supply department: supply management; food service; retail operations; disbursing management; and personnel administration.

The Basic Qualification Course-Naval Reserve

(BQC-NR) is a comprehensive course of instruction which provides Reserve Direct Commissioning Program (DCP) officers and Supply Corps Limited Duty and Chief Warrant Officers with the fundamental, technical and managerial knowledge necessary to function effectively as Supply Corps officers within the Naval Reserve.

The students with the highest grade point average and leadership skills were recognized during an "Honors Breakfast" at the school's quarterdeck prior to the graduation.

Ensign Ricardo Elizalde was recognized as Second Battalion's honor graduate for his overall grade point average. He was awarded the Defense Finance and Accounting Service Excellence Award, Navy Food Excellence Award, and the Navy Exchange Service Command Excel-

TRAFFIC ADVISORY for Defense Highway

As an update to a previous notification, work on Defense Highway began May 24 and will continue through October.

Some of the improvements alongside the roadway will result in temporary full road closures and partial road closures (one lane at a time) such as the one that occurred last weekend.

The road will be completely closed (both lanes) from June 11 to July 7 for rail replacement work.

In order to minimize traffic impacts, during the first week June 11 to 15, the road will be closed on the southbound side of Gate 32, but leaving the gate

operational to northbound traffic on Burma Road.

Starting Saturday, June 16, the Naval Undersea Warfare Center Division, Newport Gate 32 will be closed for approximately three weeks.

The gate will be opened and the road will be passable upon the construction completion after July 7.

Final pavement and pavement markings will be completed later in the project and therefore single lane closures similar to the one on Memorial Day weekend will continue throughout the summer until the work is complete in early October.

the rescue of 92 civilian mariners from an anchored merchant vessel that was damaged by an explosion and ensuing fire. The MSRON 8 Sailors' efforts aided local rescuers to ensure there was no loss of life during a potentially catastrophic maritime disaster.

— MSRON 8 hospital corpsmen conducted an eight-week course which provided 144 instructional hours in emergency medical training to 35 Emirati emergency services personnel, thus strengthening the relationship with local medical services.

— MSRON 8's Intelligence/N2 Department provided the Air Force's 380th Expeditionary Operations Support Squadron and Joint Security Area with key maritime intelligence, enhancing 15 threat briefs

to the Wing Commander and the Regional Security Staff with an added maritime focus.

— MSRON 8 also planned and executed the first Aircraft Security Team mission ever performed by Navy Reserve personnel, guarding Commander NAVCENT/Fifth Fleet during an inter-theater trip. This mission required intense cross-coordination between three separate task groups within Task Force 56. MSRON 8's team was composed of six qualified personnel from the Maritime Expeditionary Security Forces (MESF) in United Arab Emirates and Kuwait, and worked closely with the MESF detachment in Bahrain to ensure proper mission equipment distribution and to satisfy demanding customs requirements.

— MSRON 8 provided 30 personnel in order to create three embarked security teams that were used to augment CTG 56.11 in support of Operation Vigilant Mariner.

The squadron also demonstrated versatility by conducting theater security cooperation missions. Specifically, MSRON 8 planned and executed a joint Emergency Management Service (EMS) exercise (Iron Sultan 12) at the Ports of Jebel Ali and Fujairah. This exercise brought together Emirati police and fire departments, EMS teams, MSRON 8 Sailors, and Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) field agents, providing an opportunity for both countries to refine standard operating procedures in preparation for real world port emergencies.





Smooth out the summer move

With the busy summer moving season soon arriving, JPPSO-Detachment 2, would like to pass on some key moving tips to the community.

The Defense Personal Property System (DP5) is a new DOD program designed to improve quality of life for our service members, civilian employees and their families through improved household goods moves.

DP5 provides direct and empowered communications between the service member and the Transportation Service Provider (TSP) - DP5 is available 24/7, 365 days a year from any location with internet access.

Don't have Internet access? After you complete your initial move requirements the DP5 Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system will provide you with access to your shipment information as you transition to your new home. You must establish a DP5

account to process/manage your shipment, request delivery, file a claim, and complete your Customer Satisfaction Survey. Go to the <http://www.move.mil> website (DoD Customer tab) to create your account. Not all personal property shipments can be moved in this new system. Please contact your local Transportation office to see if you qualify.

All personnel moving during the summer months should be aware of the high volume of moves during the peak moving months of June, July and August. Plan to be flexible when selecting a pickup date.

Never schedule a pickup on the closing date of the residence, on the last day of residency in an apartment or the day of termination of a lease, or the day a cleaning crew is to start cleaning the residence/quarters. Scheduling the pickup on these days leaves no room to adjust for unforeseen problems. Additionally, it's

a good idea to leave the telephone and other utilities connected until all property has been picked up. Limited capability during peak season means that not everyone can move on the last day of the month. The moving industry has suggested that, when possible, schedule a two-day pickup date which provides some flexibility in the event something goes wrong.

The TSP is required to perform a pre-move survey at least 5 days prior to the requested pickup date. In most cases, the actual pack, pickup, and delivery dates will be negotiated directly between you and TSP during the pre-move survey. You should expect 1 pack day for every 4,000 pounds of estimated weight.

A good move depends largely on how much you get involved and if you are well prepared when the movers arrive. Log onto www.move.mil and read the valuable information

under the "Preparing for Your Move" section.

Upon shipment delivery, you and the TSP will record loss/damage on a "Notification of Loss/Damage AT Delivery" form. Loss/Damage discovered after delivery shall be listed on the "Notification of Loss/Damage AFTER Delivery" form or entered into DPS by you. All loss/damage must be declared and filed within 75 days of delivery. (Hardcopy or in DPS) Neither the TSP nor the Government will pay for items not identified on the loss/damage report within 75 days.

To have your claim paid on the basis of Full Replacement Value (FRV), you MUST file directly with the TSP within 9 months of delivery. You can file a claim by logging into DPS and selecting the "CLAIMS" tab. For FRV, the TSP is:

REQUIRED to replace any item that is lost or destroyed with a new item, or pay the cost of a new item of the same kind and quality, without deducting for depreciation. The TSP is not required to replace items which can be repaired for less than the FRV of the item. Repair will be to the extent necessary to restore the item to its condition when it was received by the TSP. An item is considered destroyed if it cannot be repaired, or if the cost of repair would exceed the cost of a new item.

Claims Critical Timeline

WITHIN 5 DAYS AFTER DELIVERY – The TSP may provide a "Quick Claim" settlement if total claim is less than \$500

WITHIN 75 DAYS AFTER DELIVERY – You must file your Notice of Loss/Damage form or complete the action in DPS. If you opt for filing with the military claims office, you must file within 70 DAYS AFTER DELIVERY

WITHIN 9 MONTHS AFTER DELIVERY – File your claim directly with the TSP for FRV protection

NLT 2 YEARS AFTER DELIVERY (but after 9 months) – File your claim with the TSP or your Military Claims Office for other than a FRV settlement

The 12 question Customer Satisfaction Survey (CSS) is the cornerstone of the Defense Personal Property System. The CSS is a web-based survey that allows you or your spouse to rate the service and performance provided by the TSP. The goal of the survey is to help improve the overall move experience.
