MGT 441 Labor Relations (*Prerequisite: MGT 331*) This course is a study of conflict resolution in public and private institutions. **VTT Mon 7:00 – 9:00 pm** (Moss)

CRM 322 Law of Criminal Procedure This course concerns the laws governing procedural due process for criminal defendants. **Mon/Wed 4:00 -6:00 pm** (Collins)

REL 331: Religion and Personal Experience (*Prerequisite: REL 124 or REL 201*) A study of the place of personal experience in the discovery of religious meaning. **Mon/Wed 4:30 – 7:00 pm** (Moreno)

MAT 003 Basic Algebra (*Prerequisites: MAT 002 with a grade of C or higher, or mathematics placement*) This course is designed to help students build a foundation for algebra. **Mon/Wed 5:00 – 7:00 pm** (Bet Shahbaz)

MGT 312 Introduction to Project Management (*Prerequisites: GBA 334, MAT 201, and MGT 301*) This course defines a project and assists project managers in accomplishing goals efficiently and effectively by applying knowledge, skills, tools, and techniques. **VTT Mon/Wed 7:00 – 9:00** Dumville

MKT 301 Principles of Marketing (*Prerequisites: ECO 202, ENG 122, MGT 301*) A basic course in the marketing of goods, services, and ideas including planning, pricing, promotion, and distribution. **VTT Mon/Wed 11:00 am – 12:15 pm** (Lax)

ENG 002: Basic Composition Skills This course is designed to remedy the special problems of students whose English preparation reveals marked deficiencies in written skills. **TBA** (Heydon)

ENG 122 Academic Writing II (*Prerequisite: ENG 121*) A continuation of ENG 121. Expository writing based on analytical study of literary genres and an introduction to the research process. **Tues 4:00 – 8:00 pm** (Heydon)

COM 140 Basic Computer Skills An introduction to computer applications including basic computer concepts and terminology. **Tues 6:00 -10:00 pm** (Lewis)

COM 309 Network Theory and Design (*Prerequisite: COM 203*) An introduction to the theory, design, and application of networks, the course will include the creation or simulation of a computer network. **VTT Tues 7:00 -9:00 pm** (Hijazi)

MAT 141: Finite Mathematics (*Prerequisite: MAT 003 or mathematics placement*) Topics in mathematics that are especially applicable to business such as linear models, linear programming, mathematics of finance, and probability. **Tues/Thurs 5:00 – 7:00 pm** (Bet Shahbaz)

SCI 101 Integrated Physical Science (*Prerequisites: MAT 003 or MAT 131*) This course is designed to provide integrated knowledge and basic understanding of the major concepts, theoretical perspectives, historical trends, and empirical findings of the physical sciences. **Tues/Thurs 5:00 – 7:00 pm** (Swierc)

MGT 430 Business, Government, and Society (*Prerequisite: MGT 301*) This course is a study of interrelationships among business, government, and society. **Tues/Thurs 5:00 – 7:00 pm** (Worley)

MGT 320 Entrepreneurship I (*Prerequisite: MGT 301*) This course introduces the student to the process used in the creation of an effective business plan. The economic, social, and cultural impact of entrepreneurship in the United States will be investigated. **Tues/Thurs 7:00 – 9:00 pm** (Ortega)

REL 123 Foundations of Christian Faith (*Prerequisite: PHI 101*) This course involves an introduction to the field of theology as an academic discipline with a body of writing, methods, and interpretations. **Tues/Thurs 7:00 – 9:30 pm** (Frazier)

ACC 201 Principles of Accounting I An introduction to the preparation and use of accounting information found in financial statements. **VTT Wed/Fri 9:00 am – 11:00 am** (Schuster)

HRA 340 Organizational Training & Development Theory and technology of organizational training and development are studied. **VTT Thurs 4:00 – 6 pm** (Waters)

CRM 426 Theories of Criminal Behavior (*Prerequisite: SOC 121 or PSY 121*) This course is an interdisciplinary examination of the causes of criminal behavior. **Thurs 4:00 -8 pm** (Estrada)

PHI 101 The Quest for Wisdom The course examines human beings as present to themselves, as having a narrative self-understanding and as being on a quest for meaning and orientation in life. **Sat 8:00 am -1:00 pm** (A. Clark)

MGT 325 Finance for Managers (*Prerequisite: ACC 202*) An introduction to the principles of corporate financial management. **ICC Mon 4:15 -6:30 pm** (Smith)

COM 140 Basic Computer Skills An introduction to computer applications including basic computer concepts and terminology. **ICC Mon/Wed 6:00 – 8:00 pm** (McClaren)
