NASPNCLA INSTRUCTION 5090.10A

Subj: ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (EMS)

Ref: (a) OPNAVINST 5090.1C  
(b) EXECUTIVE ORDER (EO) 13423  
(c) EXECUTIVE ORDER (EO) 13514

1. Purpose. To sustain the Naval Air Station Pensacola Complex's EMS program by providing the framework for continual improvement of its environmental performance while sustaining its mission readiness.

2. Cancellation. NASPCLAINST 5090.10

3. Background. References (a), (b), and (c) set goals, establish policy, and outline procedures and responsibilities for the EMS, to include assessment and oversight of environmental quality at Navy Shore installations. An EMS integrates environmental considerations into day-to-day activities across all levels and functions of the Navy Enterprise. It is a formal management framework that provides a systematic way to review and improve operations, create awareness, and improve environmental performance. A robust EMS is essential to sustaining compliance, reducing pollution, and minimizing risk to mission.

4. Scope. The EMS is essential to document firm policies and procedures, which implement, review, and audit the command's management of the Environmental Protection Program based upon Department of Defense and Department of the Navy guidance. The purpose of the program is to aim for full environmental compliance, establish and communicate the command's environmental policy, assign specific development responsibilities, identify environmental aspects and impacts, determine environmental objectives, and set targets to be met in advancing the command's environmental stewardship.

5. Action. Naval Air Station Pensacola Department Heads and tenant commanders/officers-in-charge shall comply with the policies and procedures established by references (a), (b), and (c). Further actions include:

b. This instruction also establishes the Cross Functional Team (CFT). The CFT will help the installation Commanding Officer and Executive Officer in directing the implementation and use of the EMS. The CFT will consist of the Port Operations Officer; Air Operations Officer; Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) Director; Supply Officer; Public Works Officer; and other personnel at the discretion of the Commanding Officer. The responsibilities of the CFT are as follows:

- (1) Execute the decisions and intentions of the Commanding Officer.
- (2) Evaluate the EMS and initiate improvements.
- (3) Promote the EMS throughout the command while disseminating specific information in regard to the installation environmental policy.
- (4) Work to minimize the environmental impacts from the installation activities and mission.
- (5) Ensure appropriate mechanisms are in place to adequately monitor and measure the EMS and all environmental programs.
- (6) Monitor nonconformance, noncompliance and corrective and preventative actions.
- (7) Seek higher assistance when issues can not be resolved internally through the CFT.
