## **GALLEY PROCEDURES FOR SCOUTS :**

Meals are available at Galley 1080, Corry Station. Corry Station is located 2.4 miles from NASP main gate. Reservations are required at least three weeks in advance of your arrival. Please contact the NASP Community Relations Director at (850) 452-3100, ext. 1539 or [comreldir@navy.mil](mailto:comreldir@navy.mil). Payment for meal(s) may be made with cash or money orders made out to the U. S. Treasurer at each meal. Scouts and leaders must be in uniform.

**DIRECTIONS TO CORRY STATION:**

Exit Naval Air Station Pensacola through the main gate. You are now on Navy Boulevard. Continue on Navy Boulevard approximately 2.4 miles. You will go through six stoplights.

At the seventh stoplight turn left onto Chiefs Way. Once you go through the gate at Corry, approximately 2/10 of a mile on your right will be Galley 1080, General Mess. Please remember- galley meals are a privilege. Your cooperation is appreciated.

**GENERAL MESS RULES:**

- (1) Shower shoes are not permitted. Socks must be worn with all types of footwear.
- (2) Pants and shirts will not have holes, frays, or tears. No mesh style, tank tops, or half shirts allowed. Shirts with shirrtails must be tucked in. No plain white t-shirts or t-shirts with printed profanity or racial remarks.
- (3) Shorts will not have holed, frays, or tears.
- (4) Head bands, scarves and ball caps may not be worn inside the general mess.
- (5) Head phones for walkmans must be removed before entering the general mess.
- (6) Dresses/blouses must have sleeves; strapless dresses or spaghetti style straps are not permitted.

The National Museum of Naval Aviation is the only museum in the world devoted exclusively to Naval Aviation. The second largest air and space museum in the world, it is regarded as one the outstanding man-made attractions in the area between New Orleans and Disney World. The museum is open to the general public and is located on Radford Boulevard, building 3465. Open 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily except Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years Day. Admission is free.

Fort Barrancas is part of the Pensacola Forts area of Gulf Islands National Seashore. It is open to the general public. Information, exhibits, and a bookstore are available at the Fort Barrancas Visitor contact station. Hours are Monday through Sunday 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Fort Barrancas is a self-guided tour and a Park Ranger is on the premises to answer questions. Admission is free.

**ADVANCED REDOUBT (850) 455-5167 PLEASE CALL FOR TOUR TIMES:**

Advanced Redoubt is part of the Pensacola Forts area of Gulf Islands National Seashore and is located approximately one-half mile north of Fort Barrancas. Open to the general public, viewers may walk around the exterior of the fort on Saturdays and Sundays from 10:00 a.m. until noon.

**LIGHTHOUSE-(850) 432-6569 :**

The Lighthouse was built in 1858 and lighted January 1, 1859 it was a replacement for the first lighthouse built on

the Florida Gulf Coast, which was located about one half mile east of this site. A first Fresnel lens was cut and polished by Henri LePaute, from Paris, France was installed. On May 1861, the Fresnel lens was dismantled and sent to Montgomery, AL for safe keeping until after the Civil War.

The lens was returned in 1869 and the brick duplex Keeper's Quarters was built. The Lighthouse was electrified in October 1939 and automated in 1965. Visitors must climb 177 steps to reach the tower. The Lighthouse is on the National Register of Historical Places and is maintained by the United States Coast Guard.

The Command Display Center is open for public tours Sunday afternoons from 1300-1600 Memorial Day through October. Due to safety concerns public tours of the tower have been discontinued. Please call to arrange tours for groups at other times.

**BARRANCAS NATIONAL CEMETERY (850) 453-4072**

Barrancas National Cemetery encompasses over 100 acres of serenely landscaped grounds where lie the men and women who served with dedication and courage in our country's battles. Visitors are welcome seven days a week during the hours posted on the cemetery's front gate.

**FORT SAN CARLOS DE AUSTRIA AND THE PRESIDIO SANTA MARIA DE GALVE**

The fort and presidio erected by the Spanish in 1698, were the beginning of both the military occupation and the permanent settlement on the site of what is now NAS Pensacola. The fort protected the fortified settlement against attack from French, British, and Native American Indians.

Between 1995-1998, archaeologist from the University of West Florida rediscovered it and found that much of the settlement still survives below the ground.
