

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH NOTICE

Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard and Intermediate Maintenance Facility (PHNSY & IMF) is an industrial activity engaged in the overhaul and repair of U.S. Naval ships. As such, based on your job assignment and in accordance with Occupational Safety and Health and Radiation Health program requirements, you may be required to participate in an ongoing medical surveillance program. These work assignments may include, but are not limited to, occupational exposure to: fumes, dust, noise, heat, chemicals, and ionizing radiation. In order to ensure a healthy workforce, PHNSY & IMF maintains and enforces personnel protection programs consistent with applicable regulatory policies. These programs may include engineering controls, training, work procedures, use of personnel protective equipment, and medical surveillance. The medical surveillance program involves periodic medical evaluations, which consists of various laboratory and/or clinical tests and may involve a physical examination by the Shipyard Clinic provider.

The Naval Medical Clinic Shipyard is the medical authority for PHNSY & IMF. Successful completion of all aspects of the medical examination is considered a condition of your employment, commensurate with assigned duties. However, you have the option to have certain aspects of the physical examination be completed by your private medical doctor. To prevent any delays in medical qualification, it is recommended that these examinations be completed prior to your appointment at the Shipyard Clinic. Further, examinations performed by your PMD, such as rectal or breast examination, must be current and no later than twelve months of the date of your scheduled occupational medical examination. You may submit these results to the Clinic medical provider for consideration as part of the physical.
