## NCTAMS PAC Sailors *'clean up'*

In the early morning hours of July 21, Sailors from Naval Computer and Telecommunications Area Master Station, Pacific (NCTAMS PAC) gathered in front of the main gate to "adopt" their stretch of Whitmore Avenue, which spans more than two miles.

The volunteers received instructions from the command master chief, CMDCM (SW/AW) Michael Dollen. "Safety is our main concern so be safe out there," the master chief instructed as he inspected everyone to make sure they had reflective vests/belts.

The 32 volunteers were divided into three groups, working toward each other and finally meeting near the Whitmore Community Center located approximately a mile from the front gate.

"I'm glad I volunteered for this. Not only am I doing my part for the good of the community, it is also so much fun," said Information Systems Technician 1st Class (SW) Allison Dehner as she showed off a shoe she picked up from the side of the road. Many of the volunteers were first timers, but promised to return if given another opportunity. Information Systems Technician Seaman Christina Crawford joined the Navy about a year ago

and enjoyed being out of her workplace and giving to the community. "I really like it because I am able to mingle with other Sailors and at the same time take care of the community and the command," said Crawford.

Store Keeper 1st Class Christina Breeden, who has been coordinating the Adopt-a-Highway project for the past month, was also out helping and made sure safety aspects were taken into consideration.

"NCTAMS PAC has been involved in Adopt-a-Highway for several years now and it's always great to see the volunteer effort," said Breeden.

"There is a definite sense of satisfaction volunteering for something like this because it keeps Hawai'i beautiful," said Yeoman 2nd Class (SW) Randy Agustin. "I grew up here and Hawai'i is my ohana; I like to take care of it."

As the day neared the end, Utilitiesman 1st Class (SCW) Shane Ouimette, self-help leading petty officer, reported that the total trash collected overfilled a NCTAMSPAC stake truck.

The list of trash collected included three engine blocks, a pig carcass, five tires, two broken windshields, 10 inches of guard rail, seven feet of chicken wire, a car clutch assembly, 250 pounds of paper trash, one refrigerator, one table, a radiator, a chair and 50 feet of corrugated roofing. Whitmore Village Community was very grateful as well.

Many of the residents honked their horn and gave the "shaka" sign of appreciation as they passed by.

Sailors stationed at Naval Station Pearl Harbor are volunteering their time and muscle to help refurbish a greenhouse project at Radford High School.

The volunteers are cleaning the interior and exterior of the existing greenhouse at Radford High School as well as making plans to build a new greenhouse in the future.

"Naval Station Pearl Harbor has a close relationship with Radford High School in conjunction with the Joint Venture Education Forum," said Culinary Specialist Chief (SW/AW) Adeline Lopes, assigned to Naval Station Pearl Harbor. "It is important that we keep close relationships with schools. It shows the teachers and the students that see us out here volunteering that we care."

It is hoped that the newly refurbished greenhouse project will add a hands on learning process in the science department.

"This is going to be a great learning tool for our students," said James Sunday, vice principal of ninth and 10th grades at Radford High School. "We expect this greenhouse to be used by our science classes quite often and with the great weather, there probably isn't a better place than Hawai'i. We always appreciate our military volunteers. We feel we are a part of our military community and we appreciate all that they have done for us."

Radford High School was established in 1957 graduated its first class in June 1960. It was named after Adm. Arthur W. Radford, former

chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, who was stationed in Hawai'i while serving in the U.S. Navy. It is one of six high schools in the Central Oahu District. The majority of students are federally connect-

- My keel was laid by President Harry S. Truman at the Electric Boat Shipyard in Groton, Conn. on June 14, 1952.
- I was the first commissioned nuclear-powered ship in the United States Navy and the world's first nuclear-powered submarine.
- My first commanding officer was Cmdr. Eugene P. Wilkinson.
- On July 23, 1958, I departed Pearl Harbor, Hawai'i under top secret orders to conduct "Operation Sunshine," the first crossing of the north pole by a ship.
- I was decommissioned on March 3, 1980 after a career spanning 25 years and almost half a million miles steamed.
