## Pass & ID Rollout Phase II

The recertification of identification badges, DoD decal (DoD Decal, installation tab and month/year expiration) for the front windshield of personal occupancy vehicles (POV) is about to enter its second phase.

The second phase of the Pass & ID rollout will begin on Monday 24 January 2011 with the saturated enforcement of parking garages and lots.

The blue circular parking sticker assigns each registrant to either a surface lot, parking garage or a reserved space in a parking lot or garage.

Security will visit each parking area and will issue warnings for vehicles with improper DoD decals or parking stickers. In addition, security will ensure that vehicles are parked in the appropriate location.

The schedule for this phase will include warnings being issued from Monday 24 January 2011 through Thursday 27 January 2011. Monetary fines will be enforced starting Friday 28 January.

If you have not recertified and received a new parking sticker, and you drive to NSA Bethesda, now is the time to visit the Pass & ID office in Building 2 to ensure compliance.

You will need to bring your driver's license, government ID, vehicle registration, proof of insurance and DoD decal number if you already have one affixed to your vehicle.

Listed below is a description of all of the available parking stickers and where they permit staff to park.

## Register For Up to Four Free Rides Home Per Year. . .

### Guaranteed Ride Home

Do you need a Guaranteed Ride Home for life emergencies that always seem to pop up when you least expect them to?

Do you sometimes have days when you have to work unscheduled overtime?

Commuter Connections runs a program that offers up to four FREE rides home per year for anyone who works in the National Capital Region. Eligible participants must commute up to two times per week by carpool, vanpool, bike, walk or mass transit. Participants can live in Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and portions of Pennsylvania.

The program is designed to act as a lifeline to set the mind of commuters who use mass transit or

carpools at ease, knowing there is a way to get home. The program is available weekdays from 0600-2200.

Once you have come to this webpage you will create a Commuter Connections account in which you will enter your contact information, work schedule and your supervisor's contact information.

After you are enrolled you will receive a registration card in the mail with the phone number to call in case of an emergency and your participant ID number.

### Pool Rewards

Has the cost of gasoline caused you to consider starting a carpool? Are you aware of any potential coworkers who live close to you that you could form a carpool group with?

Commuter Connections has restarted their Pool Reward Program to encourage the formation of new carpool groups. If eligible you can earn \$2 per day for each day you carpool to work over a 90 day period. The maximum incentive for this program is \$130.

To be eligible for the program you must not have used alternative forms of transportation for more than three days per week in the 30 days before applying for the program.
